

BOARD MEETING: (MADISON)
February 3, 1990

The Board meeting was convened at 7:15. Present were Art Priesz, Dee Mielke, Leonard Rounds, Dr. Kiehm, Dr. Beecher, Ray Gehrig, Paul Heberling, Louise Riedel, and Rider Representatives Connie Gray, JoAnne Gernant, Roberta Harms, Joe Yogus and Roxanne Swisher.

JoAnne moved, Paul seconded to dispense with reading of the minutes, which had been circulated. Sharon reported that the test and evaluation for the proposed lay judges were nearing completion.

JoAnne moved, Dee seconded to delete the following phrase from the proposed rule III I 2 "both mandatory holds." Motion carried.

Connie proposed to add the following to Rule D8: "The rider is also responsible to check his time card and/or to coordinate his time with ride time." Louise seconded. Motion carried.

Ray moved that on rides out of the traditional AERC Midwest region, the rides would only be required to pay the \$1.00 rider fee on UMECRA riders or a minimum \$10 rider fee. JoAnne seconded. Motion defeated.

Leonard presented a suggestion from a ride manager that we liberalize our respiration parameters. There was no motion.

A suggestion had been received that a middleweight division, following AERC standards be added. Joe Yogus so moved. Dr. Beecher seconded. It was suggested that under this plan a "sliding scale" similar to AERC's whereby points were awarded on a percentage basis for less than a full class should be added. Paul suggested that a committee be formed to propose a plan to be implemented for 1991. It was also pointed out that forms which have already been printed and are ready for distribution to the rides would now be outdated. Vote was favorable for presenting it to the general meeting in this manner.

Dr. Beecher moved, Ray seconded that the following be added to Rule F. "Before any action can be taken by the Board concerning a protest, all concerned parties and all board members must be notified of the protest and given 14 days to submit their opinions. Motion carried.

Dee moved to present the schedule to the general meeting. Leonard seconded. Motion carried.

Motion adjourned.

GENERAL MEETING

The general meeting was convened at 1:00 p.m. Answering to roll call were the following rides: Illinois Early Bird, WMAR, AHDR I, White River Spring, Summer, Labor Day and Fall, KMAHA, Maplewood, Southern, St. Jude, Scrub Oaks, Grand Island, Pillsbury Forest, Glacier Trails, Hayward, Keweenaw, ApDRA, AHAM, SE Minnesota, ARAB Inc, Pere Marquette, Wildcat, MndRA I, Wolverine, Prairie River, Shore to Shore, Charity Cup, Palisades, Yankee Springs, Colorama, SAHARA, Valhalla, Jubilee, Michibay, Ft. Ridgely, MndRA II, Milwaukee River, AHDR II, Point Chaser. Seventy-nine were entitled to vote.

It was moved, seconded, and carried to dispense with the reading of the minutes which had been circulated. Bob Wadzinski, Fred Kuhn moved and seconded to approve the Newsletter financial report as printed in the Convention program. Bob Wadzinski, Norm Cooper moved and seconded to approve the UMECRA financial report as printed in the Convention program. Both motions carried.

Under old business: The president reported on steps taken by the Board that do not require action at this meeting. A suggestion that the size of pens be limited will be included in the Ride Manager's Manual. The Board had also taken action to raise the dues to \$10 individual and \$15 family. Wayne Gastfield was recognized for having donated \$200 to the year-end award fund. This has been used for high-point rider awards. The silent auction for the

benefit of the International Competition fund will be proceeding during the afternoon and evening. Clarification in the wording pertaining to the Window System was reported in the minutes of the December board meeting, and will be in effect.

Chuck Gray moved, Elinore Tonsor seconded to add the provision for the "lay judge concept" as Rule I B 6. (details reported in minutes of December 2 Board meeting). Motion carried.

Baob Wadzinski moved, Chuck Gray seconded that the number of spot checks on competitive rides cannot require a rider to go faster than 7 miles per hour. Motion defeated.

Wendy Thiede moved, Julie Klug seconded to require staggered starts in rides of 15 or more, to be spaced 10 minutes apart. Motion defeated.

Dr. Beecher moved, JoAnne Gernant seconded to add the following to Rule III I 2: "On gate-into-a-hold type endurance rides there shall be one rest period of at least 30 minutes on a 50-mile ride and two such rest periods on a 100-mile ride." Motion carried

Dr. Beecher moved, Leonard Rounds seconded that Rule II B 2 shall be inserted "on competitive rides of more than 30 miles there shall be one hold of at least 40 minutes from the time of arrival." Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Rick Nelson seconded to add rule I G: "Any error or omission in ride results as printed in the Newsletter must be reported within thirty days after the mailing of the Newsletter." Motion defeated.

JoAnne Gernant moved, Dr. Beecher seconded that Rule I A 1 be changed to read "On a ride of 30 miles or less, the horse must be at least 48 months old; on a ride over 30 miles the horse must be at least 60 months." Motion carried.

Rick Nelson moved, Elinore Tonsor seconded to amend the Rookie of the Year award to include top five as described in minutes of December board meeting Motion carried.

Ray Gehrig moved, Dee Mielke seconded to add the following to Rule D 8. The rider is also responsible to check his or her time card and/or coordinate his or her time with ride time. Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Fred Kuhn seconded to add the following to Rule F. "Before any action can be taken by the Board concerning a protest, all concerned parties and all board Members must be notified of the protest and given 14 days to submit their opinions. Motion carried.

A suggestion has been received that UMECRA adopt the three AERC weight divisions in both competitive and endurance. Since the forms have already been printed and distributed to rides at this time, and since there are other numerous considerations, a committee will be formed to study the matter and come up with a proposal for next year's meeting.

Dr. Beecher moved, Bob Wadzinski seconded to delete Rule I c 7 a which reads "Horses shall be certified for completion and placing if they could be safely ridden further, are capable of going on, even if at a reduced speed." and Rule I C 7 e, which reads "Are not lame at the walk." Rule I c 7 a now shall read "Horses shall not be certified for completion and placing if they are Grade III lame or worse." Rule I C 7 b to read "Horses shall be certified for completion and placing if they (1) have vital stable signs....etc. To continue with rest of rule as it stands. Dr. Beecher accepted a friendly amendment to the effect that Endurance and Competitive criteria be separated and listed under their respective divisions, with appropriate renumbering. Motion carried.

Fred Kuhn moved that competitive horses shall not be certified for completion or placing if they are grade 5 lame (per score sheet). Competitive horses shall be certified for completion if they are have stable vital signs, etc. (rest of rules remain same). Motion seconded and carried.

A committee will be formed to consider soundness criteria for competitive horses.

The 1990 rider representatives, Roberta Harms, Joe Yogus, Roxanne Swisher and Leonard Rounds were introduced.

The next item of business was election of officers. Nominated for president was Art Priesz. Nominations were closed and Art was declared elected unanimously. Nominated for vice-president were Dee Mielke and Fred Kuhn. Dee was elected. Nominated for secretary-treasurer was Louise Riedel. Nominations were closed and Louise was declared elected unanimously. Nominated for the positions of Director were Connie Gray, Fred Kuhn, Leonard Rounds, Wayne McVeigh, Wayne Gastfield, Elinore Tonsor and Craig Olson. Elected were Connie Gray, Fred Kuhn, Leonard Rounds and Wayne Mc Veigh.

Dr. Beecher announced that ride insurance will again be available from AHDR. The fee has gone up to \$75 per event/day.

The meeting was adjourned.

SPECIAL MEETING

The KMAHA management had asked that the ride be re-scheduled for October 27, 28, which would fall on the scheduled date of the Point Chaser ride. Letters had been received from both rides and from Elinore Tonsor. Dr. Beecher moved that KMAHA be allowed to re-schedule the ride. Connie Gray seconded. Motion carried.

Plans for the annual meeting were discussed. Dr. Beecher moved, Paul Heberling seconded to hold the meeting in Rochester, Minnesota, on the last weekend in January. Fred Kuhn will be in charge of arrangements. Motion carried.

CONFERENCE CALL, SEPTEMBER 6, 1990

A conference call was convened at 6:00 p.m. Participating were Board members Art Priesz, Dee burns, Louise Riedel, Leonard rounds, Paul Heberling, Wayne McVeigh, Connie gray and Fred Kuhn; and rider Representatives Roberta Harms, Roxanne Swisher and Joe Yogus.

The purpose of the call was to consider Jim Donaghue's request to add 25 and 50-mile competitive rides on Wednesday, October 24 and Thursday, October 25, to the Point Chaser ride. After considerable discussion Fred moved to decline this request. Wayne offered a friendly amendment to the effect that Jim be allowed to have 25 and 50-mile competitive rides on Saturday, October 27 (originally scheduled for endurance only). Fred refused to accept the friendly amendment. Wayne moved to make this a regular amendment. Louise seconded. The amendment was defeated by a vote of 5-2 (Board members) and 2-1 (rider reps). Fred's original motion to decline the request passed by a vote of 6-1 (Board) and 2 to 1 abstention (rider reps.)

Another request had been submitted by Kathy Love on August 26 for a new competitive ride, no date specified. However UMECRA rules require Board of Director approval 90 days prior to the ride date. There being no motion, the request failed.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
December 1, 1990

The Board met in Dubuque, convening at 12:30 p.m. Those present were Art Priesz, Dee Burns, Louise Riedel, Wayne McVeigh, Fred Kuhn, Connie Gray, Paul Heberling, R.A. Beecher, Leonard Rounds and Rider Representatives Roberta Harms, and Roxanne Swisher.

Fred Kuhn moved, Dee Burns seconded to dispense with the reading of the minutes. Motion carried. The treasurer's report showed a balance on hand December 1 of \$4,527.24.

Under old business:

Lay Judges--Leonard reported that Mary Lou had sent tests to four applicants, none of whom responded. It was suggested that a notice be included in the Newsletter that Mary Lou Rounds should be contacted by those interested in becoming lay judges.

Weight Division Committee--Art Priesz appointed the following people to serve: Fred Kuhn, chairman, Gene Dake, Bob Wadzinski, Jim Donaghue, Louise Riedel, Lori Windows, Rick Nelson. A survey of AERC rides in 1990 showed the following breakdown of entries: Lightweight - 36%; Middleweight - 44%; Heavyweight - 19%.

Competitive Completion Committee--The following committee was appointed: Chuck Gray, Chairman, Elinore Tonsor, Dianne Kuhn, Dr. Beecher, Robin Whitney, Leonard Rounds.

Both committees to report at the annual meeting with recommendations.

The ballots for rider representatives had been counted by Chuck Gray, Dianne Kuhn, Audrey Gehrig and Mary Lou Rounds. Their report showed the election of Marsha Achenbach, Carl Harms, Leonard Rounds, and Lori Windows.

Art reported that awards were being ordered.

New Business:

Trails--In response to a report that the Wisconsin DNR has proposed to limit all competitive events in the State Parks, Louise circulated a proposed letter explaining UMECRA's position, to be signed by the Board members, and to be sent to Dave Weizenecker, Superintendent of Parks and Recreation. Dr. Beecher moved to send the letter, to include a similar letter in the Newsletter for our members to sign and send in, and to prepare a petition for circulation at the annual meeting for signature by those in attendance. Connie Gray seconded. A friendly amendment was offered to establish a committee to pursue this matter. Motion carried. The following committee was appointed: Dee Burns, chairman, Wayne McVeigh, Connie Gray, Faye Nelson, Terry Jensen and Roberta Harms.
Suggestions for Rule Changes:

Mark Jensen proposed for Competitive Rides only, that if a rider feels that the pace is too fast and comes in after the maximum allowable time that he would not be considered for placing, but would receive mileage--up to six hours total time for 25 miles and 12 hours for 50 miles. This proposal failed for lack of a motion, citing management problems.

Dianne Kuhn proposed that competitive horses be allowed to wear splint boots. Dr. Beecher moved to reject this proposal. Connie seconded. Motion carried.

Dianne Kuhn proposed that all juniors on competitive rides be required to wear helmets. Fred moved and Wayne seconded that this proposal be presented at the general meeting with the Board's recommendation to approve. Motion carried.

- Dianne Kuhn proposed that all juniors (not to be 13 as of December 1) be required to be accompanied by a sponsor in the same manner as endurance juniors. Wayne moved and Dr. Beecher seconded to present this proposal to the general meeting with the Board's recommendation to approve. Motion carried.

Letters from Dianne Kuhn, Joe Yogus, Ray Gehrig, and Valerie Harris concerning Rule III 4.a. c, "Sound at a trot" were read. Most remarks concerned lack of consistency in judging. Fred moved and Connie seconded to go back to "lame at a walk" for endurance. Motion defeated 6-2.
Dr. Beecher moved that the following be presented to the general meeting with the Board's recommendation to approve: Rule III 4 a. c shall be retained as

presently written with the addition: "The horse shall be trotted out and back in a straight line on as level ground as possible." Dee seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

- Dee moved, Leonard seconded to present the following addition to Rule III 4 a. with the recommendation to approve: "Horses may be presented for a trot-out any time within the hour; however ride management and/or the ride veterinarian may prescribe a specific time period (not more than one hour after crossing the finish line.) Motion carried.

* Louise moved, Leonard seconded to present the following to the general meeting with no recommendation either to approve or disapprove: "Respiration as a criteria for advancement in endurance riding shall be eliminated." (Rule II C 2) Motion carried 5-3.

- With regard to multiple day competitive rides, Leonard moved to present the following to the general meeting: Rule II E 1 shall be changed to read: "Horses shall all be kept at the camp site or on the marked trail....", this to replace the phrase that says "Horses shall all be kept under uniform conditions." Connie seconded. Motion carried.

- Leonard presented a motion to change rule I B 5a through 5c (concerning the Lay Judge program) to read "a ride that has two veterinarians may use a lay person approved by the veterinarian to check pulse, respiration, dehydration, CRT, mucus membranes, temperature, and lesions." Wayne seconded. Leonard and Wayne accepted a friendly amendment to delete the Lay Judge rule. The amendment rule passed. Dr. Beecher suggested that the word "lesions" be deleted. Leonard moved, Wayne seconded that a statement be added to the Guidelines to read "a ride that has two veterinarians may use a lay person approved by the veterinarian to check pulse, respiration, dehydration, CRT, mucus membranes, and temperature." Motion carried.

In a letter from Valerie Harris she pointed out that the veterinary judging guidelines stated that the horse's legs were to be examined before the horse is trotted out. (p.17). This is contrary to the statement on p. 14. Wayne moved, Louise seconded to correct this inaccuracy. Motion carried.

Jim Donaghue proposed that the schedule as presented at the annual meeting be frozen for the balance of that season, with no rescheduling for any reason. Fred moved that this be submitted to the general meeting, Paul seconded.

Fred proposed a friendly amendment to read "no ride may be rescheduled for any reason on the same date as another ride without the approval of the originally scheduled ride/rides." To be added to Rule IB under Sanctioning Requirements. Motion carried.

Dee moved, Wayne seconded to limit the UMECRA ride season to a period from April 1 to November 30. Motion defeated.

- A letter from Jeanne Smith requested a rule be made regarding rider abuse of ride personnel. After lengthy discussion Leonard moved, Wayne seconded to present the following to the general meeting with a recommendation to approve: If ride management feels that any personnel have been abused or harassed by a rider they (management) would have the right to notify the board, who would respond in the following order: The board upon review would ask for comment from the alleged offending rider and other people who might have witnessed the event; then if deemed warranted, would privately warn that rider; as part of the warning that if the offense continues, would publicly warn the rider; if the conduct continues the board can take whatever further action it deems appropriate, including prohibiting the rider from entering the offended ride or any other UMECRA event in the future. Motion carried.

A letter from Julie Klug requested that on the competitive score sheet only notations should be made concerning the horse's pre-ride fatigue (no minus points). There being no motion, the proposal will not be presented.

* Andrea Vargo, Katrina Lunden, Dianne Johnson submitted a proposal that for competitive rides the Limited Distance awards should go to horse and rider teams who attend rides of only 30 miles or less, with unlimited mileage. Paul moved, Dee seconded to present this proposal to the general meeting. It was pointed out that limited distance was designed to recognize those people who can only attend a limited number of rides. Paul and Dee withdrew the motion. Paul moved that limited distance would only include 30-mile or less rides, but retain the mileage limit of 195 miles. Dee seconded. Motion carried.

✓ Dianne Kuhn proposed assessing an additional \$.50 per rider fee to be used to award the year-end high-point riders a saddle. It was the consensus that giving an award of this magnitude to only two riders was not appropriate, but that the extra assessment could be used to upgrade awards for ALL winners. Connie moved, Dee seconded to present this proposal to the general meeting; in an effort to improve year-end awards we increase the rider fee by \$.50 per rider. Motion carried.

Louise proposed replacing the present score sheet for endurance with the AERC cards carried by the riders. The present score sheets are used only for check-in and do not lend themselves to use during the ride. It was the consensus that the cards be used and that UMECRA furnish them.

Louise moved that the following be presented to the annual meeting: The gate-into-a-hold type check shall be mandatory at all vet checks. Connie seconded. This in line with AERC's recommendation. Motion carried.

The proposed 1991 schedule was presented. Fred moved, Dee seconded to approve the schedule with the addition of the original Maplewood ride on June 22, 23 (this will necessitate a name change for the Maplewood ride on May 4) and the deletion of the SE Minnesota ride, where a conflict exists with the 4th of July. An attempt will be made to find another date for this ride.

The meeting adjourned at 5:30.

BOARD MEETING
January 26, 1991

The Board of Directors met at 7:30 a.m. at the Radisson Hotel, Rochester, Minnesota. Present were Art Priesz, Paul Heberling, Wayne McVeigh, Dr. Beecher, Connie Gray, Fred Kuhn, Leonard Rounds, Louise Riedel, and rider representatives Roxanne Swisher, and Roberta Harms.

Dr. Beecher moved, Fred seconded to dispense with the reading of the minutes. Motion carried. The financial report and a proposed budget were circulated. There was discussion of the possibility of sending the Newsletter 3rd class.

Under old business Dr. Beecher reported for the Competitive Rules Committee that a meeting had been held Friday evening. The committee, concerned that lame horses were placing in competitive rides, recommends that on the score sheet Grade 4 lameness should state "obviously lame, marked nodding", and that Rule F be changed to read that at Grade 4 the horse be awarded a completion only, but not allowed to place. Grade 5 horse would be disqualified as in the past. The point schedule should be changed to read "Grade 1 (1-20 points deducted); Grade 2 (21-40 points deducted); Grade 3 (41-65 points deducted). Dr. Beecher moved, Leonard seconded to accept this recommendation. Louise moved, Fred seconded to amend the motion to read that a Grade 4 horse be awarded mileage only (no completion). The amendment carried. The original motion as amended carried and will be presented to the general meeting with the suggestion to approve. Dr. Beecher will discuss the proper use of the score sheet at the general meeting.

Fred reported that the Weight Division committee had met and does not recommend any change in the present system.

Louise reviewed the present status of the AERC \$10 surcharge for non-member riders. There is presently a motion to be voted on by mail to rescind this charge.

The Early Bird and SAHARA rides have indicated that they will put on limited distance rides. Fred moved, Dr. Beecher seconded that letters be written to these rides reminding them to put in their flyer that the event is not UMECRA sanctioned and that riders should be alerted to the fact that they will not receive mileage or UMECRA points. Motion carried.

Wayne moved, Dr. Beecher moved to approve the proposed 1991 schedule, as amended. Motion carried.

Roxanne inquired as to Coggins tests being required. The consensus seemed to be that mandatory Coggins tests would not be practical. No action was taken.

The meeting was adjourned.

GENERAL MEETING

(Motions resulting in changes for 1991 are boldfaced and starred)

**** Dr. Beecher moved, Fred Kuhn seconded to approve an increase to \$1.50 in the per-rider fee. Motion carried.**

Lindsay moved, Elinore seconded to accept the Newsletter financial report. Motion carried. Elinore asked for volunteers to solicit advertising for the Newsletter. She received a round of applause for all her work as editor.

Committee reports were the next item of business.

**** Dr. Beecher moved, Fred seconded to accept the recommendation of the Competitive Rules Committee as follows: The score sheet be changed to redefine Grade 4 lameness as "obviously lame, marked nodding" (deleting "hitchy or short stride"), The score sheet would also be changed to make grade 1 lameness 1-10 points off; grade 2 lameness 21-40 points off; and grade 3 lameness 41-65 points off. Rule F to be changed to read that at grade 4 there will be no placing or completion points but mileage will be given, and at grade 5, complete disqualification.**

Dr. Beecher urged ride managers to confer with their veterinarians prior to the ride to review the score sheet especially as pertaining to these changes.

The Weight Division committee recommends that there be no change in the present system.

Louise reported for AERC concerning the \$10 surcharge for non-AERC member-entrants. (Refer to Board meeting). Lindsay moved to send a resolution objecting to this surcharge to all AERC Directors. Ann Ness seconded. Motion carried. Lindsay reviewed the status of international riding.

Art reviewed action taken by the Board at the December meeting which requires no action here (formation of a trails committee, and a correction in the Veterinary manual)

****The present score sheets will now be used only for competitive rides, and will be replaced by the rider card for endurance. These will also be furnished in the ride supplies.**

**Fred moved, Elinore seconded to require junior competitive riders to wear helmets. Motion carried.

** Dr. Beecher moved, Leonard seconded that all juniors not to be 13 as of December 1 be required to be accompanied by a sponsor in the same manner as endurance juniors. Beecher offered a friendly amendment to set the age as not to be 13 as of the beginning of the UMECRA ride season. Motion carried.

**Dr. Beecher moved, Fred seconded that Rule III J 1 (concerning completion criteria relative to lameness) shall be retained as presently written with the addition that a horse shall be trotted out in a straight line on as level ground as possible." Motion carried.

**Ann moved, Chuck Gray seconded that the following addition be made to Rule III J 1 "horses may be presented for a trot-out any time within the hour; however ride management and/or the ride veterinarian may prescribe a specific time period, not more than one hour after crossing the finish line." Motion carried.

Christine Taliaferro moved, Leonard seconded that respiration be eliminated as a criteria for advancement in endurance riding. Leonard moved to amend to establish a criteria range of 60 to 80 with the veterinarian having the authority to set the number depending on weather. Motion defeated.

**Monna Radtke moved, Elinore seconded to change Rule II E 1 to read that horses on multi-day rides shall all be kept at the campsite or on the marked trail. A friendly amendment was offered to change "campsite" to "campground". Monna refused the amendment. Dr. Beecher seconded the friendly amendment. Connie Gray proposed a friendly amendment to read "horses shall all be stabled at the campsite." Motion carried.

**Dr. Beecher moved, Lindsay seconded to replace rule I B 5a through 5c (concerning the Lay Judge program) with the following: A ride that has two veterinarians may use a lay person approved by the veterinarian to check pulse, respiration, dehydration, mucus membrane, and temperature. Motion carried.

**Dr. Beecher moved, Fred seconded that no ride may be rescheduled for any reason on the same date as another ride without the approval of the originally scheduled ride/rides. (To be added to Rule IB under sanctioning requirements in the Ride Manager's Manual) Motion carried.

**Christine moved, Leonard seconded to add the following: If ride management feels that any personnel have been abused or harassed by a rider they (management) would have the right to notify the board, who would respond in the following order: The board upon review would ask for comment from the alleged offending rider and other people who might have witnessed the event; than if deemed warranted, would privately warn that rider; as part of the warning that if the offense continues, would publicly warn the rider; if the conduct continues the board can take whatever further action it deems appropriate, including prohibiting the rider from entering the offended ride or any other UMECRA event in the future. (To be added as Rule I B 6.) *Motion carried.*

Chuck moved, Christine seconded that limited distance include only 30-mile or less rides, and that the mileage limit of 195 miles be retained. Motion defeated.

The next item of business was elections.

Art Priesz was nominated for president. There being no other nominations he was elected by unanimous consent.

Dr. Beecher was nominated for vice-president. There being no other nominations he was elected by unanimous consent.

Louise Riedel was elected by acclamation for secretary-treasurer.

Dr. Robin Whitney, Dr. Dean Peterson, and Dr. Rae Birr were nominated for veterinarian representative. Dr. Whitney was elected.

The following were nominated for the Board of Directors: Gene Dake, Roxanne Swisher, Terry Jensen, Jim Donaghue, Wayne Gastfield, Wayne McVeigh, Connie Gray and Elinore Tonsor. Gene Dake, Terry Jensen, Wayne Gastfield and Wayne McVeigh were elected.

* BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
December 7, 1991

The meeting was convened in Dubuque, Iowa, at 1:00 pm. Present were Directors Art Priesz, Dr. Beecher, Louise Riedel, Paul Heberling, and Terry Jensen; Vet representative, Dr. Robin Whitney; and rider Representatives Marsha Achenbach, Lori Windows, Leonard Rounds, and Carl Harms. (Directors Wayne Gastfield and Gene Dake were enroute by air but were unable to land at the Dubuque airport because of fog.)

Paul Heberling moved and Dr. Beecher seconded to dispense with reading of the minutes, which had been circulated. Motion carried. The treasurer's report showed a balance of \$4,011.00 with all current bills paid. Louise announced that it was necessary to replenish the supply of mileage chevrons at a cost of \$1550, an increase of approximately 100% over the last order.

A tentative schedule for 1992 was presented. Dr. Beecher moved and Paul Heberling seconded to approve it. It will be presented at the general meeting.

All awards have been ordered.

New Business:

A letter had been received from Dianne Kuhn requesting that competitive horses be allowed to wear interference boots. Dr. Beecher moved and Paul Heberling seconded to present this proposal to the general meeting. Motion defeated.

The following matters were referred to rider representative Leonard Rounds.

1. A rider asks for a recheck and was refused a recheck on the pulse because she didn't ask as soon it was taken but waited until both pulse and respiration were taken.
2. At a check horses were moved forward up to 150 feet and had p/r's taken immediately, and then the riders were told to move forward, mount up and ride off as other riders were having p/r's taken.
3. On an endurance the rider was separated from the horse and the horses came into the vet check alone, with the rider walking in separately. What is the completion status in such an instance?
4. Some members have been concerned about the timeliness of the Newsletter during the ride season.

In the first matter Dr. Beecher moved, Paul seconded to add the following to Rule I C 4. "P/r's shall be taken as a unit and a recheck shall be requested immediately after BOTH have been announced." Motion carried.

In the second matter Dr. Beecher moved and Terry Jensen seconded to present the following to the general meeting with recommendation to approve. "At all competitive p/r checks a horse must be allowed at least two minutes of 'still time' before having a p/r taken." (Add rule II D 1 b 3 with remaining rules being renumbered.) Motion carried.

In the third matter Dr. Beecher moved, Dr. Whitney seconded to add the following to Rule I D 2 "and must travel the entire trail together." (The entire rule to read: "The same unit (horse, rider and equipment weight) must be maintained throughout the ride and must travel the entire trail together.") Motion carried.

In the fourth matter it was suggested that a simple printout of ride results and standings be sent out by the secretary at least once a month during the ride season under our third-class permit, all other news to be printed in the Newsletter. Terry moved that someone be

appointed to speak to Elinore about continuing to do the Newsletter. Robin seconded. Motion carried. Dr. Beecher volunteered to contact Elinore.

✓ Lori Windows reported that she had been contacted by a ride manager inquiring whether he had the right to refuse to allow pens to be used at his ride due to limited camping space. Managers may opt not to allow pens but this must be announced on the ride flyer. This will be incorporated into the General Suggestion section in the Ride Manager's Manual.

Lori had received a question as to clarification when trot outs and the final pulse following endurance rides should be done. AERC rules state that the final check can be done any time WITHIN the hour. UMECRA rules state that the trot out may be done any time within the hour; however ride management or the ride veterinarian may prescribe a specific time period, not more than one hour. AND must have...a pulse of 72 or less ONE HOUR from the time of crossing the finishing line. The UMECRA rule is more strict than the AERC rule and shall supercede the AERC rule.

Lori had received a suggestion that our present entry blank/release should contain a phrase stating that the rider is responsible for damage done by his horse. Art and Dr. Beecher will rework the entry blank.

Lori also suggested that a specific age be set at which an individual can sponsor a junior. Terry moved and Dr. Beecher seconded that the following be presented to the general meeting: Add to Rule III B "...must be accompanied by an adult sponsor (age 18 or over)" Motion carried.

A ride manager has made a complaint concerning conduct of a rider under Rule I B 6. Art will contact this rider for comment.

Dr. Beecher moved, Dr. Whitney seconded that the rider or horse owner be responsible for expenses incurred for veterinary, farrier or for any other services provided at a ride. This shall be settled before the person responsible leaves the grounds. Motion carried. Add as Rule I D 1 and re-number subsequent rules. This will also be added to the entry blank/release.

Louise relayed suggestions received by phone from the Chicago airport from Wayne Gastfield and Gene Duke as follows:

1. That the rider fee be reduced from \$1.50 to \$1.00. Proposal failed due to lack of a motion.
2. That the speed on competitive rides be raised to 8 mph. Proposal failed due to lack of a motion.
3. That completion criteria for lameness for competitive rides be changed to be the same as for endurance rides, with grade 3 being disqualification and the 65 point deduction being allocated between grades 1 and 2. Louise moved, Dr. Beecher seconded to present this to the general meeting without recommendation. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on the proliferation of the number of days and number of miles on some rides. One suggestion was that since 50-mile competitive rides on Sunday were usually poorly attended and were inconvenient for management, riders, and veterinarians, we should possibly limit the number of competitive miles on Sundays to 35 miles. The 25 or 30-mile competitive rides on Saturday afternoon have proved successful and have somewhat substituted for the longer rides on Sunday. No action was taken.

Paul moved to present the following the general meeting: Limited distance shall be eliminated and the top ten year end awards be expanded to 15. Terry seconded. Motion defeated.

Dr. Beecher moved that the following be presented to the general meeting with the recommendation to approve. A rider be limited to one award in the limited distance program in each division (endurance and competitive). Paul seconded. Motion carried.

The next item of business were protests.

A protest had been filed concerning a sponsor on the Prairie River Ride transferring his sponsorship of two juniors to a 16-year old. The rules state that a sponsor "must be a competent adult." (Eighteen is the accepted age of adulthood). Dr Beecher moved that since the rule is ambiguous and the decision at the ride was made in good faith, and since we have addressed the problem by inserting the age of 18 into the rule, that we not change the ride results but that we return the protest fee to the protestor. Terry seconded. Motion carried.

Dr. Whitney moved and Terry seconded to disallow a protest concerning riders stopping within the two-mile marker on the Grand Island ride. It was felt that the riders made an honest mistake since the 2-mile marker wasn't in the usual format. Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Paul seconded to adjourn. Motion carried.

BOARD MEETING
January 25, 1992

The board convened at 7:00 AM with Art Priesz presiding. Also present were Dr. R.A. Beecher, Louise Riedel, Gene Dake, Wayne Gastfield, Wayne McVeigh, Terry Jensen, Paul Heberling, Dr. Robin Whitney and rider representatives Lori Windows, and Carl Harms.

Dr. Beecher moved, Wayne Gastfield seconded to waive reading of the minutes of the previous meeting. Motion carried.

Elinore Tonsor presented a statement and proposal concerning the Newsletter. Gene moved, Wayne seconded that six to seven Newsletters be published per year, with interspersed, intermittent mailings of ride results and standings to be sent to the entire membership. (Timing of these mailings to be determined between the Newsletter Editor and UMECRA secretary.) Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved that ride results must be postmarked within fourteen days of the ride, with a penalty of \$50 for non-compliance, and denial of re-sanctioning the following year if the penalty is not paid. Paul seconded. Motion carried.

Wayne moved, Gene seconded to accept the financial report.

Dr Beecher moved, Wayne Gastfield seconded to amend Rule I F (Protests) to read "...The protest will be sent to the UMECRA president and will be adjudicated at the next board meeting. The president will notify all concerned parties and the Board members within fourteen days of receiving the protest. Concerned parties will be given fourteen days to submit their opinions...."

Wayne Gastfield suggested that two directors be elected each year for two year terms. Gene moved to present to the General Meeting an amendment of Article III, Section A of the By-laws to elect two directors each year for two year periods. For this year the two directors with the highest number of votes would be seated for two years, with the remaining two being seated for one year. Motion seconded and carried.

Two rides were proposed as additions to the 1992 ride schedule: Heart of Gold in North Dakota and Animal Rescue in Minnesota. The Twelve Oaks ride has been cancelled. The proposed schedule contained the incorrect date for the North Branch ride (May 23) whereas it was actually scheduled for May 16. Dr. Beecher moved, Gene seconded to accept the schedule with these changes, subject to action taken on the next motion. Motion carried.

AERC has notified the Midwest Region that it will host the final ride in the championship series on October 17. Paul moved that the MnDRA II ride's date of October 3 be changed to October 17 since they are interested in hosting this ride. Dr. Beecher seconded. Representatives from the MnDRA II ride and the AHDR A II ride (which is presently scheduled for that date) each presented reasons why their ride should host the AERC championship ride. The vote resulted in a tie of 4 - 4. Art cast the deciding vote in opposition to the motion. Motion defeated.

Louise moved, Wayne seconded to change the date of the MnDRA II ride to October 10. Motion carried.

Dr. Whitney moved to change Rule III J 2 a to read "Have stable vital signs and are showing a pulse of 68 or less, to be taken one hour from the time of crossing the finish line." Wayne seconded. Motion carried.

The meeting adjourned.

Ridgely, Milwaukee River, AHDR A II, Point Chaser, Whetstone. Eighty-eight were eligible to vote.

Moved, seconded and carried to dispense with reading of the minutes and to approve the financial report.

Wayne Gastfield announced the results of voting for rider representatives: Marsha Achenbach, Carl Harms, Lori Windows and JoAnne Gernant.

Moved, seconded and carried to approve the 1992 schedule as presented.

Dr. Beecher moved, Elinore Tonsor seconded to add Rule II D ^ab 3, with remaining rules being re-numbered: At all competitive p/r checks a horse must be allowed at least two minutes of "still time" before having a p/r taken. Motion carried.

Elinore Tonsor moved, Ruth Stewart seconded to add to Rule III B "...must be accompanied by a competent adult sponsor (age 18 or over) Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Rae Birr seconded that completion criteria for lameness for competitive rides be changed to be the same as for endurance rides, with grade 3 being disqualification and the 65-point deduction being allocated between grades 1 and 2. Amendment offered to give mileage but not completion for grade 3. Motion as amended defeated.

Dr. Beecher moved, Bob Wadzinski seconded that a rider be limited to one award in the limited distance program in each division (endurance and competitive) Motion defeated.

Anne Ness moved, Suzette Riches seconded to add the following to Rule I F (Protests) The president will notify all concerned parties and the Board members within fourteen days of receiving the protest. Motion carried.

Rick moved, Fred seconded to change Rule III J 2 a to read "Have stable vital signs and are showing a pulse of 68 or less, to be taken one hour from the time of crossing the finish line." Motion carried.

Mike Thomas moved, Bob Wadzinski seconded to change Article III, Section A of the By-laws to elect two directors each year two-year periods. For this year the two directors with the highest number of votes would be seated for two years with the remaining two being seated for one year. Motion carried by 2/3 majority.

Fred moved, Elinore seconded to add the following to Rule I D 2 and must travel the entire trail together. (The entire rule to read "The same unit (horse, rider and equipment weight must be maintained throughout the ride and must travel the entire trail together)". Motion carried.

Rider representatives Marsha Achenbach, JoAnne Gernant, Carl Harms and Lori Windows were installed.

The next order of business was election of officers.

Nominated for president was Art Priesz. There being no further nominations, a unanimous ballot was cast.

Nominated for vice-president was Dr. Beecher. There being no further nominations, a unanimous ballot was cast.

Nominated for secretary-treasurer was Louise Riedel. There being no further nominations, a unanimous ballot was cast.

Nominated for directors were Sue Lunderby, Dianne Kuhn, Wayne Gastfield, Wayne McVeigh, Gene Dake, Rick Nelson, JoAnne Gernant, and Connie Gray. Elected for a two year-term were Dianne Kuhn and Gene Dake. Elected for a one-year term were Wayne Gastfield and Sue Lunderby.

Nominated for Veterinary Representative were Robin Whitney, Rae Birr, Sharon Kiehm, and Wes Elford. Elected was Robin Whitney.

Dr. Elford asked that suggestions for next year's presentation be given to him.

Louise asked that ride managers be sure that ALL endurance entries declare their weight under the AERC divisions (as well as UMECRA divisions) whether they are AERC members or not.

A show of hands was favorable to having the meeting at this facility next year.

A show of hands was given in appreciation of the work done by Elinore Tonsor in publishing the Newsletter.

BOARD MEETING
DECEMBER 5, 1992

The Board of Directors and Rider Representatives met at the home of Fred and Dianne Kuhn, Rochester MN. Present were Art Priesz, Dr. Beecher, Dianne Kuhn, Louise Riedel, Sue Lunderby, Gene Dake, Wayne Gastfield, and Dr. Whitney. Rider Representatives present were JoAnne Gernant, Carl Harms and Lori Windows.

Dr. Beecher moved, Wayne Gastfield seconded to dispense with the reading of the minutes. Motion carried. Louise reported a balance on hand of \$6,466.99, with proposed expenditures of about \$3000 for awards and \$1000 for 1000-mile horse awards. Dr. Beecher moved, Wayne seconded to approve the treasurer's report.

Louise reported on the AERC board meeting held on November 14. The AERC convention will be held in Atlanta March 13, 14. This being the first convention held outside of Nevada, we should encourage attendance from our area. Issues discussed included insurance covering officers and directors, and liability policies for rides; drug testing and the cost of implementing such a program; higher rider fees for non-members. No action was taken on the above issues. The national championship series were discussed. A motion carried to the effect that in 1993 the first two rides of the series, which are held in each region, can be held on flexible dates, rather than AERC specified dates. Mileage for qualification for 1993 will be extended to the period from December 1, 1991 to the time of entering the first ride. In 1994 AERC will put on a high profile, championship level ride, qualification to be 1000 career miles for the horse with 400 of those miles to be the horse-rider team. The Board adopted "Guidelines to Promote Safety of Horses at AERC Sanctioned Endurance Rides." These will be printed in the AERC Endurance News. A new rider card will be designed to be used at all rides. The definition of a "veterinary control point" was expanded to ensure that a veterinarian will be present wherever horses are stopped for a check.

A protest had been filed by Sue Lunderby concerning harrassment at the MnDRA II ride which she managed. Since the principal person concerned in the protest has not as yet been contacted, this matter will be decided at the board meeting in January. The first half-hour of this meeting will be closed. The waiver form appearing on our Entry Agreement was discussed. Since AERC is in the process of producing a waiver which will be required of AERC rides and will be based on the AHSA form, this matter was tabled.

The expenses involved in our convention, especially regarding speakers, were discussed. It was the consensus that we should consider a convention registration fee to help cover the costs of the speaker, the dance, etc. (This year the cost of the dance is included in the price of the meal.)

Discussion followed concerning awards. Letters listing the choice of awards (to be a painting, a jacket, and a third item to be decided) will be sent to top-ten winners.

A letter had been received recommending the purchase of a new computer. Dr. Beecher moved that we purchase a new computer, not to exceed a cost of \$7,000. There being no second, he withdrew this motion. Gene Dake was appointed to head a committee to investigate purchasing a new computer next year. Lori Windows and Louise will serve on this committee.

Several letters had been received concerning endurance completion criteria. Dr. Whitney moved that for completion a horse must be metabolically sound with a pulse of 72 at one hour and be sound at the walk at one hour. Dr. Beecher seconded. It was pointed out that this would be incompatible with AERC rules, which basically state "Fit to continue." Lengthy discussion followed. Robin moved to amend her motion to be consistent with AERC rules, which will result in deleting our rules III J 1 a through J 2 a, and to replace this with the current AERC rule which reads as follows: (a parenthetical statement will be appended explaining the above, to be presented at convention)

1. All horses must stand a mandatory post ride evaluation within one hour of finishing. Riders may present their horses for the final examination at a time of their choosing during the one hour period. A horse that does not meet the established criteria within one hour of crossing the finish line shall be disqualified.

2. The horse must reach a reasonable pulse recovery based on ambient conditions. The maximum pulse criteria is 68 beats per minute; however, the ride veterinarian(s) may allow a higher pulse criteria in documented extreme weather

conditions. Respiration should be evaluated on its own merit. Ambient temperature and humidity effects need to be recognized and their effects on respiration rate considered.

3. The horse must be metabolically stable sufficient to demonstrate fitness to continue.

4. There will be no gait aberration that is consistently observable under all circumstances that results in pain or threatens immediate athletic performance. This examination should be conducted at a trot, straight out and back, without prior flexion or palpation. It must be recognized that we are dealing with a risk sport with its inherent wear and tear. Veterinarians must also be flexible enough to evaluate the horse injured after completing the course, etc. This is posed as a very minimal criterion not designed to disqualify legitimate stiffness and "leg weariness" but to discourage over-usage between the last veterinary check point and the finish line.

5. Soreness, lacerations, and wounds on the limbs and body--including the mouth--must be noted on the veterinary examination card. Lesions that are aggravated to a degree that affects the horse's ability to continue may be a cause for failure to complete the ride. It must be recognized by veterinarians that lesions caused by tack and interference may be from mild to severe and need to be evaluated on their own merit.

6. Evaluation of other monitoring parameters must indicate the horse is not in need of any medical treatment. It must be borne in mind that pulse, respiration, and soundness are but three of the important parameters considered in the state of condition evaluation. Motion carried, to be presented at the meeting.

There had been a suggestion that UMECRA request AERC to modify their completion rules. There was no motion forthcoming.

Discussion followed regarding awarding mileage for horses pulled at the end of a ride. There was no motion.

In response to a letter, Louise moved that UMECRA award mileage for limited distance endurance rides, (which are not UMECRA sanctioned.) Gene seconded. It was explained that according to AERC Rule 1.4.3. "The AERC records mileage for members, but the mileage remains in the Limited Distance Program and is not transferrable to any other AERC program." It was the consensus that it would not therefore be reasonable for UMECRA to include this mileage in its lifetime mileage programs. Motion defeated.

Wayne moved, Gene seconded to change the competitive ride sheet so that instead of having the pulse and respiration recorded for one minute, they be recorded for 15 seconds (i.e. 9 instead of 36 for pulse). (Our current rule II D B 5 already states "P/R'S shall be taken for 15 seconds and recorded as actual..." Motion carried.

✓ Art moved that in figuring whether or not competitive ride time falls within the 5-1/2 to 7 miles per hour speed, spot check time of 10 minutes per check must be included. Robin seconded. This will be added to Rule II A B 1. Motion carried. To be presented at the general meeting.

Wayne moved, Sue seconded to reinstate the Stress Division in competitive rides. Motion defeated.

✓ Beecher moved, Gene seconded to revise Rule I A 1 to read "on a ride of 30 miles or less, the horse must be at least 48 months old." Motion carried.

Sue moved, Gene seconded to eliminate respiration as a passing criteria. This would involve deleting rule I C 2 and adding (under Competitive Rules) D 1 b 2 "Normal criteria for advancement are a pulse of 68 and respiration of 68. These criteria must be met at all regularly scheduled vet checks within 20 minutes." Also added (under Endurance Rules) Rule J Pulse and Respiration Criteria. "The normal criteria for advancement is a pulse of 68." See AERC rule 2.1.6.1. Subsequent rules to be renumbered. Motion carried. To be presented at general meeting.

✓ Sue moved, Beecher seconded, to change rule I D 10 to read "must be physically present at the start of the ride." Motion carried.

✓ Robin moved, Beecher seconded to change Rule 1 B 6 to read "member" instead of "rider." Motion carried.

Gene moved, Beecher seconded to send a resolution to AERC requesting that

a statement be added to Guideline 2 (which now reads "Adequate veterinary staff should be provided to take care of emergencies as well as to provide appropriate veterinary control to the ride.") The proposed statement would read "this would require two veterinarians, minimum, to be on staff." Motion carried.

Beecher moved, Gene seconded a resolution to AERC to establish a time limit for horses to pass the criteria for advancement. Motion carried. These resolutions will be written and presented to the AERC veterinary committee by Dr. Beecher.

Beecher moved, Robin seconded to approve the proposed tentative 1993 ride schedule, with the possible addition of a ride at Antigo, Wis.

Louise was asked to contact the following rides with reference to the possibility of putting on the Midwest region championship series ride: Grand Island, Wolverine, Hayward and White River.

Discussion followed as to the length of the awards presentation at the banquet, with the possibility of presenting only UMECRA awards. It was the consensus that AHDR and ApDRA awards should also be presented, but that the presentation should start during dinner.

Wayne Gastfield again generously donated \$100 to be applied to purchase of awards.

Robin moved to adjourn. Motion carried.

BOARD MEETING
January 23, 1993

The Board met at the Interlaken Resort, Lake Geneva, Wisconsin at 7:00 am. Present were Gene Dake, Wayne Gastfield, Dianne Kuhn, Robin Whitney, Louise Riedel, Bob Beecher, and Art Priesz, presiding. Rider representatives present were Carl Harms, Lori Windows, JoAnne Gernant and Marsha Achenbach.

The first part of the meeting was in closed session to consider a protest against Shirley and Jim Donaghue filed by Sue Lunderby for harassment at the MnDRA II ride. Diane moved to send a private letter of reprimand, Robin seconded. Motion carried.

The meeting was then opened. Consideration was given to a proposal from Elinore Ionsor to add a by-law covering the International Competitions Fund. Bob moved to accept this principle, with Art to draft a statement prior to the general meeting, to be added to the by-laws as Article VIII, with subsequent articles to be re-numbered. Wayne seconded. Motion carried. To be presented at the general meeting.

A proposal had been received relative to reapportioning the number of directors to reflect the number of rides in the various states. Bob moved to accept this proposal. The motion failed for lack of a second.

Louise moved that a proposal be presented to the General Meeting to change Competitive Rule II B 1 to state that all competitive rides be run under the window system. Wayne Seconded. Motion carried.

Dianne moved that Rule II B 3 be changed to read "Juniors between the ages of 16 to 18 must ride as juniors unless they have declared in writing to the UMECRA Secretary before their first ride that they wish to ride as seniors." Sue seconded. Motion carried. To be presented at the general meeting.

Sue moved that only 100 mile ride per weekend should be scheduled, with the existing 100-miler to receive preference. Robin seconded. Motion carried.

Louise reported on scheduling for the AERC national championship series regional ride. The only suitable date for 1993 is Labor Day weekend. Therefore the White River Labor Day ride will be proposed to the AERC committee for this ride. It was recommended that we apply for the 1994 date at this time and that the name of the ride "drawn from a hat" would be chosen. The Wolverine Ride was drawn, and will be proposed to the AERC committee, with the Hayward ride suggested for 1995, depending on the continued interest of the ride managers.

The treasurers' reports for the general fund, the Newsletter fund, and the ICF funds were approved.

Gene moved, Sue seconded to institute a registration fee for convention to be collected at the site, to help defray costs. Motion carried.

Motion adjourned at 8:30.

The president introduced officers and board members.

COMMITTEE REPORTS: Computer--None; Entry Waiver form--a new form to be prepared by Art and Dr. Beecher; AERC--Jan Worthington reported on AERC activities. An Awards committee will be formed for 1993. Interested persons are urged to volunteer.

Art listed minor rule changes that had been made at the December board meeting which do not require action at this time. (See minutes of December meeting).

Dr. Beecher moved, Sue Lunderby seconded to replace the UMECRA finishing criteria with AERC criteria, as listed in minutes of December Board meeting. Motion carried.

✓ Elinore Tonsor moved, Dr. Beecher seconded to clarify Rule II B 1 as follows:
"...to 7 miles per hour, said average to be computed by subtracting 10 minutes from ride time for each spot check." Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Sue Lunderby moved to eliminate respiration numbers as a criteria for advancement. Motion defeated.

Art announced that the following actions were taken at the Board meeting preceding this meeting:

1. The AERC Region championship ride will be held in conjunction with the White River Labor Day ride September 5.
2. Not more than one 100-mile ride per weekend will be scheduled.
3. Next year a convention registration fee will be collected, intended to cover the speaker, entertainment/dance, and incidentals. Suggested for next year: \$ 5/ adult--kids free.

✓ Dr. Beecher moved, Craig Olson seconded to combine Rules II B 1/1a as follows:
"The ride must use the window system...."

Wayne Gastfield moved, JoAnne Gernant seconded that Rule II B 3 be amended as follows: "There shall also be a junior division, not to be 18 as of December of the new ride year. Juniors generally must ride in the Junior Division (unless they are 16 as of December 1 of the new year and have advised the UMECRA secretary in writing of their intent to ride as seniors for that season and before their first ride of that season)..."

✓ Elinore Tonsor moved, Jim Donaghue seconded to amend the By-laws by a 3/4 majority of the quorum present to re-number Article VIII to Article IX and insert new Article VIII as follows:
"A. A permanent committee is established to fully administer, maintain, guide and keep an International Competition Fund for fund raising to assist in supporting UMECRA members who may be selected to participate in international endurance or competitive ride events sanctioned by the FEI.
B. Committee Members: The committee shall be made up of five persons as follows: a current UMECRA officer and four members at large, to include a chairperson and three others. Preference shall also be given to appointing UMECRA members who are acting as Chief d Equipe for the zone teams, generally the Eastern or Central teams. The Committee will be appointed by the UMECRA President.
C. Committee responsibilities:
1. To prepare guidelines for administration and dispersal of the fund, to be approved by the Board;
2. To prepare plans for fund-raising, to be approved by the Board;
3. To implement Board approved guidelines and plans; and
4. To furnish an annual report to the Board and membership at the general meeting, to include: financial report, fund-raising report, activity/use report."

The ride representatives for 1993 were seated as follows: Lori Windows, Marsha Achenbach, JoAnne Gernant and Terry Jensen.

Wayne Gastfield moved, Fred Kuhn seconded to accept the 1993 proposed schedule with the addition of the Ft. Ridgely ride to be held August 21, 22.

The next item of business was election of officers and Board members.

Art Priesz was nominated for president. There being no further nominations he was elected unanimously.

Dr. Beecher was nominated for vice-president. There being no further nominations he was elected unanimously.

BOARD MEETING

December 4, 1993

DUBOQUE, IA

Art Priesz called the meeting to order at 1:00 p.m. Also present were Board members Dr. R.A. Beecher, Louise Riedel, and Dianne Kuhn. Stranded in transit because of fog were Wayne Gastfield and Gene Dake. Rider Representatives JoAnne Gernant and Lori Windows were present.

Dr. Beecher moved, Rick Nelson seconded to approve the minutes of the last meeting, which had been distributed. Motion carried.

The treasurer reported a balance on hand of \$5777.90. This balance is approximately \$635 less than last year's; however this is reflected by the purchase of the new computer at a cost of about \$1175. Dr. Beecher moved, Rick Nelson seconded to accept the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

Art presented the Awards committee report. There will be a choice of rump rugs, windbreakers or UMECRA jackets to first time top-10 and champion and reserve. Limited distance and rookie awards will be cooler bags to hold a beverage 6-pack. There was a discussion as to whether to continue giving rider mileage patches. The cost for this year will be \$441.21. Dr. Beecher will check on costs for this type of patch. Thanks were extended to Vi and Jerry Bredl for engraving all the plates for the 1000-mile awards. Dr. Beecher moved, Louise seconded to approve the awards committee report.

AERC committee report as follows: The following motions were passed at the midyear meeting. 1). If a non-member joins AERC at a ride, ride management may retain \$5.00 of the membership fee. If a non-member rides and does not join AERC he will be charged \$15, which will be remanded to AERC. (not applicable to limited distance rides) 2). An additional weight division was created for a total of four as follows: Featherweight - 160 and below; Lightweight - 161 to 185. Middleweight - 186 to 210 pounds; Heavyweight - 211 or more. 3). Junior Rule 10 to be clarified to read "...competent adult sponsor 21 years or older. 4). There will be an increase in dues paid after Jan 1 of \$5.00 for both individual and family memberships. 5) there will be an increase in fees for associate veterinarian members from \$15 to \$20. Proposals to be voted on at the AERC convention: 1) Regional top ten awards be eliminated. 2) Drop the 50-mile rides from the national championship series. 3.) Each AERC sanctioned ride to have a minimum of two veterinarians with an exception clause that if rides feel they need a variance, they contact their sanctioning director. Dr. Beecher moved to acknowledge the AERC sponsorship age change. Rick seconded. Motion carried. (Since UMECRA follows AERC endurance rules, this will be reflected in our rules.)

Dr. Beecher reported on proposed action taken by AERC relating to drug testing. The veterinary committee will evaluate any reports resulting from positive drug tests and will report to the protest committee. There will also be a program of national drug testing, with rides to be chosen at random. (At present only rides in California are routine.) This will be acted on at the AERC convention.

There was no old business

NEW BUSINESS

Dianne moved, Sue seconded to to present to the general meeting a proposal to eliminate competitive rule II C 2 (rule prohibiting boots and bandages). Motion carried. Both rider representatives opposed.

Rick moved, Louise seconded to sanction AERC-type limited distance rides with distances to count toward career miles for nominated horses. There would be no weight or age divisions, with top 6 awards at the end of the season. Motion defeated. One rider rep opposed, one abstained.

Dr. Beecher moved, Rick seconded to allow mileage credit for events ridden out of UMECRA, to apply for both rider and nominated horse mileages. The rider to be responsible for notifying the points recorder. Motion defeated. One rider rep opposed, one abstained.

Rick moved, Sue seconded that discrepancies in points and/or mileage must be brought to the attention

of the points recorder **in writing** within 30 days of the postmark of publication. Failure to do so will result in the discrepancies standing. Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Dianne seconded that ties not be allowed in endurance rides, to be in compliance with AERC policy. Motion carried.

There was a motion that riders must ride in their weight divisions, pertaining especially to riders over 180 lbs with tack riding in the lightweight division. Defeated.

Louise moved, Sue seconded that endurance horses disqualified after crossing the finish line still qualify for mileage credit. Motion defeated. One rider rep disapproved, one abstained.

It was the consensus of the board that no attempt should be made to fill the vacancy for the fourth rider representative.

Dr. Beecher moved to amend the by-laws to elect two rider representatives who would have a vote on the board, effective in 1995. This would increase the number of directors at large by two; rider representatives, to be nominated annually by the general membership by the time of the December board meeting, voting to be completed by the annual meeting.

Motion carried. To be presented at the annual meeting--official wording to be finalized.

Wayne Gastfield suggested by phone that the site of the next year's annual meeting be determined and announced at the current meeting. It was also suggested that a centralized location be determined. This will be further discussed at the board meeting Saturday, January 29.

Sue moved, Louise seconded to approve the tentative 1994 schedule as follows: Motion carried.

PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO BY-LAWS OF UMECRA

AMENDMENT A

It is moved to amend Article I, Section 1 of the By-Laws as follows:

The Registered Office of the Corporation shall be c/o Art Priesz, Jr., of The Priesz Law Firm, 700 East Lake Street, in the City of Wayzata, County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota, and the Corporation shall other offices as such places as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine.

(This is a housekeeping change as the original address for Art Priesz, Jr., was with a different law firm at a different location.)

AMENDMENT B

A motion has been made to make several amendments to the By-Laws as follows:

To Article III, Section 1, as follows:

ELECTION OF DIRECTORS. The property and business of this Corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors, which shall be composed of delegates, with the exception of the Board position of veterinarian representative which shall be composed of an endurance or competitive ride veterinarian. The Board shall not be less than three (3) in number and not more than eleven (11). The Board shall consist of a president, vice president, secretary/ treasurer, immediate past president, and two (2) members elected at large, or more as may be determine appropriate by majority vote of the Board, up to a maximum of four (4), together with up to two (2) ride representative Board members at the determination of the Board. There also shall be a Board position of veterinarian representative. Two (2) directors at large will be elected each year for two (2) years or until his/her successor shall have been elected at the annual meeting by majority vote of the attending delegates of the Corporation. Similarly, one (1) ride representative will be elected each year for two (2) years or until his/her successor shall have been elected by the membership of the organization, such election to be held and managed by the Board of Directors by U. S. mail.

Defeated

To Article VII, Section 3, as follows:

RIDER REPRESENTATIVES. Individual members and individuals within family memberships of the Corporation shall be entitled to vote for two (2) rider representative Board members who shall serve as delegates to the annual or specials meetings of the Corporation and as voting members of the Board of Directors. Ride managers are not eligible to be elected as rider representatives. Family memberships shall be entitled to as many votes, up to a maximum of two (2) per family membership as there are adults within the family unit. Further, the election of the ride representative Board members shall be conducted by U.S. mail and managed by the Board of Directors.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

January 29, 1994

The Board met at the Apache Motel, Rochester, Minnesota at 7:00 a.m. Present were Art Priesz, Dr. Beecher, Louise Riedel, Dianne Kuhn, Wayne Gastfield, Sue Lunderby, Rick Nelson, Dr. Whitney, and rider representatives JoAnne Gernant and Lori Windows.

Dr. Beecher moved, Rick Nelson seconded to dispense with reading the minutes of the past meeting, which were published. Motion carried. Louise presented the financial report (copy attached), which showed a balance of \$3,239.85. Rick moved, Dr. Beecher seconded to approve the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Art announced that the speaker had not arrived due to a cancelled flight. Dr. Beecher and Dr Elford will present the morning's program.

Copies of the present by-laws and the proposed changes were distributed. Change B addressed the addition of two rider representatives to the Board as voting members. Dr. Beecher moved, Rick Nelson moved to present the proposal as presented to the general meeting.

Rick moved, Wayne seconded to approved the following changes to the tentative schedule: Animal Rescue moved to May 28, 29; SAHARA moved to August 6, 7; Chimney Butte Distance Ride in North Dakota added on August 13, 14; Southern II--October 30 added.

AERC has acted to require two veterinarians at each ride, with a clause that the regional sanctioning director may make an exception under certain conditions. The UMECRA rules nowhere make this requirement. Art pointed out that since UMECRA accepts AERC endurance rules, no motion is necessary. However this will be added to UMECRA's endurance rules.

Dr. Beecher moved, Louise seconded that at the AERC regional championship (Wolverine) UMECRA rules be superseded by AERC rules where a conflict exists. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

In response to AERC's action to assess an additional fee per ride for each non-AERC member, Rick moved, Dianne seconded that UMECRA rides use two divisions, with AERC and UMECRA members being reported separately. Motion failed. Dr. Beecher moved, Rick seconded that a resolution be prepared to be sent to AERC protesting the surcharge, and that members be encouraged to write letters. This will be discussed at the general meeting. Motion carried.

The second proposed by-law change concerned updating the address of the Registered Office of the Corporation to Art Priesz's present address, (The Priesz Law Firm, 700 East Lake Street, in the city of Wayzata, County of Hennepin, State of Minnesota.) Dr. Beecher moved to accept this change. Motion seconded and carried.

Louise moved that for limited distance and rookie awards, riders must earn 40 points in endurance and 20 points in competitive. Dr. Beecher seconded. Carried.

Gene Duke had requested by phone that endurance horses be given 30 minutes to recover, rather than our present 20 minutes. Dianne seconded. Motion failed.

Dr. Whitney moved, Dr. Beecher seconded that the location for the following year's convention be announced at the current year's general meeting. Motion carried. The board will reconvene at 12:30 to consider site proposals.

The board reconvened at 12:30 p.m. Proposals were heard for the 1995 meeting to be held at Wausau WI, Grand Rapids MI, Fond du Lac WI, Rockford, IL, or Oconomowoc, WI. The board voted in favor of Oconomowoc with Rockford as alternate site.

The meeting adjourned.

GENERAL MEETING

January 29, 1994

The general meeting convened in Rochester Minnesota at 1:00 p.m. Representatives from the following rides

responded to roll call: Bay Creek Boogie, Fifty Over Easy, White River Spring, Summer, Fall and Labor Day, AHDRA I & II, Early Bird, Maplewood East and West, Gun Run, Southern I and II, DRAW, Little Manistee, Glacier Trails, Grand Island, MAHA, Animal Rescue, ApDRA, Heart of Gold, SE Minnesota, Great Northern Connection, AHAM, Elk Hill, Triple R, Wildcat, Keweenaw, Ironwood Springs, Dead Dog Creek, SAHARA, MnDRA I and II, Diamond Lil, Wolverine, Prairie River, Tin Cup Springs, Ft. Ridgeley, Northern Highland, Dawn Weber, Charity Cup, Palisades, One Tuff Nut, Bear River, Mt. Valhalla, Colorama, Jubilee, Wild Goose Chase, Milwaukee River, IDRA, and Point Chaser, resulting in 101 being entitled to vote.

Mary Mott moved, Elinore Tonsor seconded to approve the minutes as published and circulated. Motion carried. Dr. Beecher moved, Jim Donaghue seconded to approve the treasurer's report as circulated. Motion carried. Elinore Tonsor presented the Newsletter financial report. Ray Gehrig moved, Linda Mowrer seconded to accept. Motion carried. Elinore questioned whether a complete membership directory should be printed in 1994. This will be decided by the Board.

OLD BUSINESS

Art reported on the following actions taken by the Board at its December meeting. These items require no action at this meeting: (1) Discrepancies in point standings must be corrected in writing within 30 days of postmark of publication. (2) Ties are not accepted in endurance rides.

Dr. Beecher moved, Chuck Gray seconded to eliminate competitive Rule II C 2, which states that no boots or bandages be allowed. Deb Bosma moved a friendly amendment to require 5 points off for each bandage, and that the bandage be removed for judging. If the horse is judged with bandage it will lose 30 points. The second to the friendly amendment was withdrawn. Deb Bosma moved the above amendment, Sandy Thomas seconded, which allowed it to be voted on separately from the original motion. The amendment was defeated. Elinore moved, motion seconded to amend the original motion to penalize a horse with bandages 5 points per leg with 2 points penalty for manners if bandage or boot were not removed. Motion and second withdrawn. Guy Worthington moved to amend the original motion to provide a 5 point penalty per wrapped or bandaged leg. Dr. Beecher seconded. Amendment passed. Motion as amended passed. Rule II C 2 to read If boots, bandages, or wraps are worn, the horse will be penalized 5 points per leg.

Dr. Beecher moved, Chuck Gray moved to accept a change to Article III, Section 1 and Article VII, Section 3 providing for two rider representatives to become voting members of the Board. The motion, which required a 2/3 majority for passage, was defeated.

Wayne Gastfield moved, Dale Scott seconded to accept the 1994 schedule ride schedule as circulated. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS

Art reported on actions taken at the Board meeting earlier today, none of which require action here. (Please refer to minutes of the Board meeting). He announced the site of the 1995 general meeting to be Oconomowoc Wisconsin, with an alternate site of Rockford, Illinois.

Rick moved to accept the change to Article I, Section I of the By-laws which updates the address of the registered office of the corporation per minutes of earlier Board meeting. Motion seconded and carried.

The next item of business was the AERC report presented by Louise Riedel. At the midyear board meeting AERC took the following actions: (1) A fourth weight division has been added to include featherweight, lightweight, middleweight and heavyweight divisions. (2) Two veterinarians will be required at each ride, with exception possible with consent of regional sanctioning director. (3) Junior sponsors must be at least 21 years of age (4) Non-AERC members will be assessed \$15 per ride.

Extensive discussion followed regarding possible action by UMECRA to protest this assessment. Dr. Beecher moved, Chuck Gray seconded to write a letter of objection to AERC on behalf of UMECRA and to encourage members and ride managers also to write. Motion carried.

Rider representatives for 1995 were seated: Lori Windows, June Scheuneman and Ida Hendrickson.

The next item of business was election. Nominated for president were Ray Gehrig, Rick Nelson, and Art Priesz. Art was elected. Dr. Beecher was nominated for vice president. There being no further nominations, a unanimous ballot was cast. Louise Riedel was nominated for secretary-treasurer. There being no further nominations, a unanimous ballot was cast. Nominations for directors were Mary Mott, Dianne Kuhn and Becke Grams. Dianne and Becke were elected. Dr. Robison Whitney, Dr. Wes Elford and Dr. Rae Mayer were nominated for veterinary representative/ Dr. Mayer was elected.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
November 19, 1994

The Board of Directors met at the home of Dianne Kuhn at 1:00 p.m. In attendance were Art Priesz, Dr. Beecher, Louise Riedel, Rick Nelson, Becke Grams, Dianne Kuhn, Wayne Gastfield, Dr. Rae Mayer Birr, Veterinary Representative, and Ida Hendrickson, Rider Representative.

Wayne moved, Rick seconded to dispense with reading of the minutes of the last meeting. Motion carried. The treasurer reported a balance of \$4226.79, with most of the 1994 awards having been paid for. Rick moved, Wayne seconded to accept the report. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Annual Meeting. Final arrangements for the convention to be held January 6, 7 at the Olympia Resort in Oconomowoc, WI, will be made by Elinore Tonsor. Anyone interested in presenting a possible site for the 1996 meeting should be prepared with a proposal. The Board meeting will be held Friday evening.

Awards. Geri Wanner has ordered year end awards. A suggestion has been received that a plaque for each of the six hi-point divisions be given as a travelling trophy to each champion with his or her name on a large plate and the names of past champions on smaller plates below. Becke suggested that a small "keeper" plaque also be given. To be considered for 1995.

AERC. Louise reported on pertinent actions taken at the mid-year board meeting held November 6. The veterinary committee recommended that a \$1.00 fee be collected from each ride entry to be used to expand the drug testing program to 3 or 4 rides per region. This will be published for the membership and voted on at the AERC convention. Discussion followed on the possibility of implementing a drug-testing program in UMECRA.

The championship series will be continued for the next two years, with the 400-mile horse-rider qualification to be lifetime rather than over the previous 18 months.

The board voted to allow ties, with judging to be as follows: Take points that would accrue for both placings and divide by 2, with ties to be accepted through all completions.

The following motion will be presented to the membership: Ride managers may ride their own rides for completion and mileage only.

Newsletter. Elinore Tonsor agreed to continue as Newsletter editor.

FEI. Louise reported that the North American Championship Ride will be held March 16 near Flagstaff Arizona. Nomination forms are now available and the selection process will begin after March 31.

OLD BUSINESS

Rick moved to remove the penalty of 5-points per boot on competitive horses, still requiring the boots to be removed for veterinary inspection. Dianne seconded. Motion defeated.

NEW BUSINESS

Dianne moved that UMECRA Rule 1 C 2 (concerning pulse and respiration criteria) be changed to read as AERC Rule 2.1.6.1, "The setting of veterinary parameters including but not limited to pulse and respiration shall be determined by the head veterinarian. . . ." Louise seconded. Dr. Beecher proposed a friendly amendment as follows: "The normal criteria for advancement shall be a pulse of 68 to be met at all regularly scheduled vet checks within 20 minutes; however the setting of veterinary parameters. . . (as above)" Dianne and Louise accepted the friendly amendment. Dr. Beecher proposed a second friendly amendment to read "Respiration shall be taken and recorded, but shall not normally be used as a criterion for advancement; however the setting. . ." (as above) Louise and Dianne agreed to the friendly amendment. Motion carried 7-1. The final motion will be presented to the membership at the general meeting., and will read as follows: *The normal criterion for advancement shall be a*

pulse of 68 to be met at all regularly scheduled vet checks within 20 min. Respiration shall be taken and recorded but shall not normally be used as a criterion for advancement; however the setting of veterinary parameters including but not limited to pulse and respiration shall be determined by the head veterinarian. Since the ambient conditions are of prime concern in the setting of parameters, these parameters should not be finalized more than 24 hours prior to ride start.

To accomplish this, Rule I C 2 ("Normal criteria for advancement are a pulse of 68 and a respiration of 68." will be removed from the General Rules and inserted into Competitive Rules as Rule II D 2 b 1) (subsequent rules to be re-numbered.) The new rule quoted above will be inserted into Endurance rules as Rule III I (subsequent rules to be re-numbered.)

Becke presented some suggestions that had been presented at the GLDRA meeting:

1. Problems with weight divisions: Weigh without tack, add another weight division, increase minimum heavyweight limit to 190 lbs.
2. Horses should not be chased during trot out.

No action taken.

Dr. Beecher moved, Wayne seconded that **no individual can place more than one horse per each limited distance division.** Motion carried. It will be brought to the general meeting with a positive recommendation .

A letter had been received recommending that the rookie division be limited to inexperienced horses as well as new riders. Dr. Beecher moved, Wayne seconded that the term "rookie" apply to horse and rider. Motion defeated.

A proposal was made that the point system be changed to allow relatively more points as the distance increases past 50 miles (i.e. a 50 mile completion would be worth 12 points rather than 10 as presently; a 100 mile completion would bring 26 points rather than 20 as presently.) Wayne moved, Becke seconded to adopt the proposed point system. Motion defeated.

A suggestion was received that ride managers should include approximate starting times on their brochures. This is of particular importance when a competitive ride is held on the same day as an endurance ride and it is uncertain whether the ride will start in the morning or afternoon. This will be printed in the Newsletter and included as a suggestion in the Ride Managers Manual.

It was suggested that in order for riders to qualify for top ten awards they must attempt at least 10% of their miles/points in a state other than their home state. Failed for lack of a motion.

Dr. Beecher moved, Becke seconded to **consider the tentative 1995 ride schedule.** Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher spoke on the difficulty of testing and evaluating the top competitive horses. It is his opinion that 25 miles do not adequately stress the really conditioned and experienced horses. It is therefore almost impossible to separate them in judging. Lengthy discussion followed. One possibility would be to increase the stress factor by **adding** points for coming in **earlier** than the time established for the window, continuing to **deduct** points for coming in late. This subject will be discussed further at the convention board meeting. Membership opinion is also solicited. **If you have suggestions please submit in writing prior to January 1.**

Meeting adjourned at 4:30 p.m.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
January 6, 1995

The Board of Directors met at the Olympia Resort, Oconomowoc WI, at 5:00 pm. Present were Art Priesz, Dr. R.A. Beecher, Louise Riedel, Rick Nelson, Becke Grams, Wayne Gastfield, Dianne Kuhn, Veterinary Representative Dr. Rae Birr, and Rider Representatives Ida Hendrickson and Lori Windows.

Dr. Beecher moved, Wayne seconded to dispense with reading of the minutes which had been circulated. Motion carried. Dr. Beecher moved, Wayne seconded to dispense with the treasurer's report which was circulated. Motion carried. (The report showed total revenues of \$17,358.85; expenses of \$14,101.44, leaving a balance of \$3,257.41.) Dr. Beecher moved, Wayne seconded to accept the Newsletter financial statement. Motion carried.

Methods of mailing the Newsletter were discussed. Elinore will investigate the possibility of having an agency doing the mailing with bar coding and with a lower postal rate.

Dr. Beecher moved, Ida seconded to approve the amended tentative ride schedule to be presented to the general meeting. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Awards - All awards are completed and on hand for presentation

AERC -Policy of ride managers riding their own rides was reviewed. They may ride but for completion and mileage only. This proposal to be voted on at AERC convention.

The suggestion that extra points be awarded to horse-rider teams coming in early on competitive rides was discussed.. One letter was read objecting to this concept. Becke moved, Dr. Beecher seconded to *change competitive scoring on a **one-year trial basis**, with trials to occur on one competitive ride in each state. Feedback and information from the trials will be collected by the Board for review. Feedback from riders will be encouraged as well. A review of that information and any proposal for permanent changes or further trials will be presented to the general meeting in 1996. The trials would be held at rides with more than one competitive ride and must be advertised.*

*Rides must use the 'window system' as follows: A rider may come in from 5 minutes before or up to 5 minutes after the exact scheduled time without losing points...however, one - half point per minute is lost for coming in for the first 25 minutes after the window, and one point per minute is lost for coming in for minutes 26-55 after the window, or for minutes 26-55 before the window. If a rider comes in during minutes 1 - 25 before the window, he will earn one half point per minute. Therefore the maximum time **penalty** will be 42.5 penalty points and the maximum time **benefit** will be 12.5 points.* Motion carried. A list of rides where these trials could be held was suggested.

Dr. Birr read a letter she had written to veterinary schools with reference to assisting in a possible drug testing program. She had received favorable responses from Michigan State and Iowa State.

The need for new promotional material (for example a video) to replace the old slides was discussed. It was decided to view a video belonging to Anne Ness and to consider producing something for UMECRA that could be sold, rented, or lent for clinics etc. Becke offered to send copies of material used by GLDRA.

Art proposed a UMECRA Challenger Ride Series which would be held separately but in conjunction with existing open rides and would be open to any horse or rider who was in top 10, top 5 rookie or top 6 limited distance for the pervious year, profits after expenses to go to UMECRA. It was pointed out there have been difficulties with this type of ride, for example IAHA

rides being held in conjunction with other rides. No action was taken.

Dianne moved, Wayne seconded that UMECRA purchase a FAX machine at a cost not to exceed \$500 with approval of executive officers. Motion carried.

Rick moved, Dr. Beecher seconded that we adopt AERC's new policy concerning ties on endurance rides (add together points that would accrue for tied placings and divide by the number of the ties). Motion carried.

The meeting for next year was discussed. Offers have been received to put on the convention at Rockford, IL, Wausau WI, and Rochester MN. This will be decided at the general meeting.

The meeting was adjourned.

GENERAL MEETING January 7, 1995

The meeting was called to order by Art Priesz at 1:00 p.m. He thanked Elinore Tonsor and Monna Radtke for the efficiently organized arrangements for the convention. He also thanked Ray Gehrig for organizing the demonstration of chiropractic, acupuncture and massage techniques held on Friday evening; Wes Elford for arranging for the speaker; Prue Critchley and Jan Halvorson for making some of the awards; Geri Wanner for ordering awards.

Roll call of rides resulted in 77 delegates eligible to vote plus 3 rider representatives.

Dr. Beecher moved, Dr. Birr seconded to dispense with reading of minutes. Motion carried. Dr. Beecher moved, Mary Mott seconded to approve the treasurer's report which was printed in the convention agenda. Motion carried. Art referred to the action taken at the Board meeting giving Louise permission to research the cost of installing a FAX machine, up to \$500 with the approval of the executive officers. Elinore moved, Dr. Beecher seconded to approve the Newsletter financial report. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

AERC - Refer to Board Meeting. Louise also spoke about the North American Championship Ride to be held in Arizona on September 16. Nominations from the Central Time Zone are being accepted up to March 31. Funds from the UMECRA-FEI account which come from the silent auction can be used to help defray costs for UMECRA members of the team. The AERC National Championship Series will be continued in 1995 and 1996 at which time the awards system will be re-evaluated. The MW region ride will be held in conjunction with AHDRA III.

VET COMMITTEE - See Dr. Birr's report at board meeting. She also stated that the veterinarians present met at lunch today. They are hoping to attract more veterinarians to these meetings in the future. To that end they are considering securing a speaker who would qualify to entitle veterinarians to receive continuing education credits.

Dr. Birr answered questions concerning procedure for drug testing. No action is being considered at this time to implement a drug-testing policy in UMECRA.

Dr. Beecher moved, Mike Thomas seconded *to accept the proposed ride schedule for 1995.* Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Dianne moved, Dr. Beecher seconded to delete Rule I C 2 (Normal criteria for advancement are a pulse of 68 and a respiration of 68) from the General Rules, and insert same into Competitive Rules as Rule II D 2 b 1. The following rule will be inserted into Endurance Rules as Rule III and subsequent rules renumbered.

The normal criterion for advancement shall be a pulse of 68 to be met at all regularly scheduled vet checks within 20 minutes. Respiration shall be taken and recorded but shall not normally be used as a criterion for advancement; however the setting of veterinary parameters including but not limited to pulse and respiration shall be determined by the head veterinarian. Since the ambient conditions are of prime concern concerning the setting of parameters, these parameters should not be finalized more than 24 hours prior to ride start.
Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Wendy Thiede seconded that no individual can place more than one horse per limited distance top 6 division. Elinore Tonsor proposed a friendly amendment to read either lightweight or heavyweight in each division. This amendment was accepted by the original makers of the motion. The motion will read *No individual can place more than one horse either lightweight or heavyweight in each limited distance top 6 division.*
Motion carried 40-31.

NEW BUSINESS

Art reviewed Board discussion concerning promotional materials.

Dr. Beecher moved, Becke seconded to adopt the Board's proposal concerning penalty and plus points on competitive rides. See minutes of Board Meeting. Motion defeated.

Louise moved, Rick seconded to adopt the AERC rules on ties. See Board meeting minutes.
Motion carried.

Results of the election of rider representatives resulted in the following: Lori Windows, Grace Ramsey, Roberta Harms and Jan Halvorson.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

Nominated for President were Art Priesz and Rick Nelson. Art was elected.

Dr. Beecher was nominated for Vice-president. There being no further nominations, he was elected by acclamation.

Louise Riedel was nominated for Secretary-treasurer. There being no further nominations, she was elected by acclamation.

Nominated for Directors were Wayne Gastfield, Dale Lunde, Mary Mott, Lori Windows and Ken Kasinski. Dale Lunde and Mary Mott were elected for two-year terms.

Nominated for Veterinary Representative were Rae Birr and Wes Elford. Wes was elected.

The Board of Directors met in special session at the Wildcat Ride , July 22, to consider the protest against the DRAW Ride. Present were Art Priesz, Dr. Beecher, Rick Nelson, Louise Riedel, Dianne Kuhn, Mary Mott, and Rider representatives Grace Ramsey, Roberta Harms and Lori Windows.

Since this was a special meeting called for a specific purpose, no other items of business could be acted on. A question had been asked by a rider as to whether a ride can require helmets; another protest is pending regarding possibly incorrect points; and Dr. Elford's letter concerning thumps will be considered later.

Regarding the DRAW ride protest: A rider who had been disqualified for violation of Rule I D 8 (concerning the presence of a "buddy" horse at a vet check) filed the protest against ride management.

Dr. Beecher moved, Rick Nelson seconded the following:

FINDINGS: The rider was in violation of Rule I D 8 . The rider was warned repeatedly. The rider and "buddy" horse failed to comply. The rider has a responsibility to know the rules or find them out. The warnings were passed on by a ride volunteer. Ride management was physically present but not involved in the discussion .

CONCLUSION: The disqualification stands. Protest fails. However, ride management did not handle this properly and should have become directly involved at the time. That failure contributed to this problem in this one instance. This ride management has not had similar problems before, and has had this matter discussed with them now.

Motion carried, with Mary Mott abstaining as a party of interest.

Louise announced that AERC wishes to know which ride in the Midwest Region will put on the AERC Regional Championship Ride in 1996. We will be accepting applications until September. Contact Louise

BOARD MEETING
November 18, 1995

The Board of Directors met at the home of Louise Riedel. The meeting was called to order by President Art Priesz at 1:00 p.m. Also present were Board members Dr. Beecher, Louise Riedel, Rick Nelson, Dale Lunde, Mary Mott, Dianne Kuhn and Becke Grams; also Rider Representatives Lori windows, Roberta Harms, Jan Halvorson and Grace Ramsey.

The first order of business was approval of the minutes of the meeting at the Wildcat Ride. Dr. Beecher moved, Becke Grams seconded that they be approved as circulated. Motion carried.

The treasurer reported a balance of \$5797.59, which reflects a shortfall of \$1424.94 as compared to 1994 at this time. The largest discrepancy is in a decline in membership from 1994, which was a peak year. The cost of services to each membership (newsletter, ride book and directory) total \$12.22, a deficit of \$2.22 per individual member. Dr. Beecher moved to raise the dues to \$17.50 for individual and \$22.50 for family memberships with a late fee of \$5.00 for dues paid after February 1. Dianne seconded. Becke proposed a friendly amendment for the fees to be \$18.00 and \$23.00. The late renewal fee would not apply to new members. To be effective immediately. Friendly motion accepted by Dr. Beecher and Dianne. Motion carried unanimously. The rider representatives agreed with the motion.

Arrangements for convention on January 12 - 14 were discussed. Mike and Sandi Thomas have completed arrangements. Dr. Beecher moved that in the future the convention account be closed within 30 days after the meeting, and the remaining money be deposited in the UMECRA account. Becke seconded. Motion carried. Proposals for hosting the 1997 conventions will be presented at the Board meeting January 12.

Art reported on Awards. For top ten there will be a choice of quarter sheets, hay flake bags, paintings and the UMECRA jacket, which will require the winner to contribute \$10. Most choices have already been reported. Connie Priesz and Gerri Wanner have arranged for awards for the past several years and deserve a vote of thanks.

Louise reported for AERC that at the midyear meeting the following rule was passed: "Horses that have passed the post ride examination may not be pulled for veterinary reasons." This is in conflict with UMECRA rule III K 7, which states that in order to complete "Horses may not have required nor received medication for any metabolic reasons before leaving the grounds (to include colic, tying up, thumps, etc.)" Dianne moved that the following be presented to the general meeting "that the AERC rule be adopted and that UMECRA Rule III K 7 be changed to coincide." Becke seconded. Rick proposed a friendly amendment to table this motion until the board meeting before convention. The original motion makers accepted. Motion carried. Dr. Beecher pointed out that the horse needs to be observed more than the 2 or 3 minutes it takes to trot out sound and pass the pulse criteria. He wishes to include as part of the discussion that the horse should be seen at 1 hour.

OLD BUSINESS

The next order of business was a protest concerning scoring at a competitive ride where the vet card had been lost, resulting in an arbitrary placing of 5th. Dr. Beecher moved that the protestor be refunded his \$25, that the ride results be corrected to 2nd place, and that the rider be reprimanded. Motion defeated. It was pointed out that there was no actual rule broken by management, and the discrepancy in score had no effect on year-end standings. Rick move that the protestor be refunded his \$25 fee and that we acknowledge that the rider was indeed in second place, and will follow up with ride management. Dale seconded. Motion carried

NEW BUSINESS

Lori reported having received a query from a rider concerning finishing criteria on competitive rides. The

rules state that the failure to meet pulse criteria only (30 minutes after finishing) results in disqualification. However, this rider pointed out that at the 10-minute check at the end, the rider must meet **both** pulse and respiration criteria, and if not, is subject to a 10-minute recheck, which results in a 30-point penalty, as at any other check. **The following will be added to Rule II, F 2 b "NOTE: Ride managers should remember to score the final 10-minute pulse/respiration check and recheck if appropriate."**

In response to a letter suggesting that horses be allowed to use "unnatural" water for sponging at checks during hot and humid weather, Dianne moved, Becke seconded to allow this. Motion withdrawn. Mary moved that **we state in the Guidelines in the Ride Managers' Manual and in the Newsletter that water can be made available equally to everyone at the discretion of ride management.** Grace seconded. Motion carried.

Also in the preceding letter the "Buddy" rule was questioned. Rule I D 8 now reads "Official competitors may not be accompanied by horses that have not entered the ride." Louise moved, Rick seconded to clarify the rule by adding "**or have been pulled from**" after the words "have not entered" and to add at the end the words "**on the trail or at checks**" Motion carried.

Another letter had been received concerning spot checks. The suggestions were reviewed. No action was taken. It was suggested that ride management announce if there is to be a spot check so riders can plan their time accordingly, (time or place not to be revealed). No action was taken.

Art proposed some changes in the way we sanction rides and assess fees. Dianne moved that **rides must announce mileages at least seven days prior to the annual meeting. If not they will receive last year's mileage.** Mary seconded. Motion carried. Dr. Beecher moved that Louise be **appointed sanctioning director to provide a schedule at the annual meeting, effective immediately.** Dale seconded. Motion carried. Dianne moved to **allow more that one 100-mile to be held on a given weekend if the distance between them is at least 500 miles.** Roberta seconded. Voting will be postponed until th board meeting preceding the annual meeting. Ride managers are invited to send written comments on this subject to Art.

Art also suggested that the fee schedule be revised with the \$40 basic fee reduced and with rides be **assessed extra** on the basis of how many divisions a ride has. No action was taken.

In regard to Dr. Beecher's letter in the November Newsletter concerning judging competitive horses, several proposals **to be presented to the annual meeting** were considered: (1) that we open the window so that riders who prefer to ride faster can come in early without penalty. (2) that spot checks be reduced to 2 - 3 minutes and regular checks to 5 minutes (3) that a Cardiac Recovery Index be used at the final check.

Dale moved that **we open the window by 35 minutes, with 30 minutes before the perfect time and 5 minutes after without penalty.** Rick seconded. Motion carried.

Dale moved to use a five-minute p/r hold at all competitive checks. Rick seconded. Motion carried.

Dianne moved that a Cardiac Recovery Index be used 2 - 5 minutes after the horse passes the final p/r check, with the rate going up 1 beat = 0 points off; 2 beats up = 5 points/beat off; 3 beats or more up = 10 points/beat off. Mary seconded. Motion carried.

The proposed 1996 schedule was reviewed. No action was taken. A finalized schedule will be presented to the January board meeting and the general meeting.

Rick moved to adjourn at 5:00 p.m. Mary seconded. Motion carried

BOARD MEETING
January 12, 1996

The meeting was called to order by Art Priesz at 5:00 p.m. at the Holiday Inn, Rockford, Illinois. Also in attendance were Dr. Beecher, Louise Riedel, Rick Nelson, Dianne Kuhn, Mary Mott, Becke Grams, and rider representatiaves Lori Windows, Roberta Harms, Jan Halvorson, and Grace Ramsey.

Rick moved and Jan seconded to approve the minutes as published in the Newsletter. Motion carried. The 1995 Financial Report was circulated. Rick moved, Roberta seconded to approve. Motion carried.

Becky moved, Rick seconded to **appoint a committee to consider the Newsletter**, consisting of Elinore Tonsor, chairman, Dianne Kuhn, Lori Windows, and Grace Ramsey. Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Grace seconded to approve the Newsletter financial report. Motion carried. Becky moved, Mary seconded to approve the ICF financial report. Motion carried. Becky moved, Mary seconded to approve the 1995 convention financial report. Motion carried.

Rick moved, Becke seconded that **we keep a convention account at the bank which holds the UMECRA's general account. The secretary-treasurer and the current convention host will hold signature cards. The convention host will furnish an accounting by April 1.** Motion carried.

Referring to the motion made at the November board meeting concerning distance between 100 mile rides on a given weekend, the makers of the motion agreed to accept a friendly amendment to **allow more than one 100-mile one-day ride on a given weekend if the distance between them is at least 800 miles.** Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved to present the 1996 proposed schedule to the general meeting. Mary seconded. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

The motion from the November board meeting to adopt the AERC rule stating that **"horses that have passed the post ride examination may not be pulled for veterinary reasons"** which is in conflict with UMECRA rule III K 7, had been tabled. Research of past minutes disclosed that the following statement appeared in the minutes of the December 5, 1992, board meeting "Future AERC changes will be automatically incorporated into UMECRA rules." Therefore UMECRA rule III K 7 will be deleted and the AERC rule will be substituted. AERC rules will be reprinted in the UMECRA rule book. Further explanation of post ride procedures will be given through the Newsletter and Guidelines in the Veterinarian Handbook.

Several letters had been received concerning the changes proposed at the November board meeting in scoring competitive rides. No action taken. The proposals will be voted on at the general meeting

NEW BUSINESS.

Roberta reported having received an inquiry concerning whether a horse who starts a ride with a degree of lameness and finishes in the same condition should receive points equal to a horse who has started and completed sound. No action taken.

Dianne moved, Jan seconded to **institute limited distance endurance rides (as described by AERC) on a trial basis for one year. There will be no divisions. She will secire funding for top ten awards at the end of the year.** Motion carried. To be presented to general meeting.

Louise moved that the following be **inserted in Rule D 2 c (Spot Checks)"The location of a spot check shall be uniform for all riders."** Carried.

The following proposals have been received for the 1997 convention: Holiday Inn, Rockford from Rick

Nelson: Ramada Inn at Rock Falls, Rick Nelson; Best Western Apache Inn, Rochester, MN, Dianne Kuhn; and ' The South Bend-Valparaiso IN area from Beck Grams for 1998. Dr. Beecher moved, Mary seconded to follow the previous practice whereby this year's backup site (in this case Rochester) becomes the next year's primary site, with Valparaiso-South Bend being the alternate.

Rick moved, Dianne seconded to adjourn at 7:30.

Ninety -five were entitled to vote.

Dr. Beecher moved, Wayne Gastfield seconded to approve the minutes as printed in the Newsletter. Motion carried. Chuck Gray moved, Dr. Beecher seconded to approve the financial report. (copy attached) Motion carried. Chuck Gray moved, Ray Gehrig seconded to approve the Newsletter financial report. Carried. The convention financial account was presented. No action was taken.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

INTERNATIONAL RIDING.

2. Establishment of a convention bank account to be opened at the same bank that has the UMECRA account. The current convention host will be a signator and will furnish an accounting by April 1.
3. Clarification of competitive rule 2F 2b concerning penalty points for recheck at end of ride.
4. Water can be made available equally to everyone for sponging on competitive rides at the discretion of ride management. To be added to guidelines.

5. Rule 1 D 8, changed to read " Official competitors may not be accompanied by horses that have not entered or have been pulled from the ride on the trails or at checks."
6. Sanctioning requirements changed to read "will sanction more than one 1-day 100 mile ride per weekend if they are at least 800 miles apart."
7. Rides must announce their mileage at least 7 days before the annal meeting; otherwise they will receive the same mileage as the previous year.
8. Appointed Newsletter committee with Elinore Tonsor, chairman, Dianne Kuhn, Lori Windows, and Grace Ramsey
9. Acceptance of new AERC rule that states "horses that have passed their post ride examination may not be pulled thereafter for veterinary reasons." AERC rules in general will be printed in the UMECRA rules per a motion passed in 1992 which states "Future AERC rules will be automatically incorporated in to UMECRA rules.
10. Insert the following into Rule D 2 c "The location of a spot check shall be uniform for all riders."

ITEMS FOR GENERAL MEMBERSHIP VOTE:

1997 CONVENTION: The Board recommends that the 1997 convention be held in Rochester Minnesota with the alternate site being the Valparaiso-South Bend Indiana area . The alternate site traditionally is the primary site for 1998. Chuck Gray moved, Mary Mott seconded to accept this proposal. Carried.

CHANGES IN COMPETITIVE RULES:

Dr. Beecher moved, Dale Lunde seconded that we open the window by 35 minutes, with 30 minutes before the perfect time and 5 minutes after without penalty. Motion defeated.

Dr. Beecher moved, Craig Olson seconded that we use a five-minute p/r hold at all competitive checks. Motion defeated.

Joe Mattingley moved, Craig Olson seconded that a cardiac recovery index be used 2-5 minutes after the horse passes the final p/r check, with the rate going up 1 beat = 0 points off; 2 beats up = 5 points/beat off; 3 beats or more up = 10 points/beat off. Motion defeated.

Art appointed a committee consisting of Chuck Gray, chairman, Art Priesz, Dr. Elford, Dianne Kuhn, Mary Mott, and Dr. Beecher to study competitive scoring.

LIMITED DISTANCE: Rick Nelson moved, Chuck Gray seconded to implement a Limited Distance Endurance as a sanctioned UMECRA event, following AERC rules. It would be on a one-year trial basis, with horse miles to count in the 1000-mile program, and the rider miles to count. There would be no divisions, with a top ten year end awards, with fundiong to come from outside UMECRA. Motion carried.

Craig Olson moved to delete competitive rule II F c concerning disqualification for horses treated for metabolic reasons before leaving the grounds. Motion defeated.

The newly elected 1996 rider representatives were announced and seated: Lori Windows, Grace Ramsey, Roberta Harms and Connie Gray.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS:

Nominated for president were Ray Gehrig and Rick Nelson, who declined. Ray was elected by unanimous acclamation. Dr. Beecher was nominated for vice-president. There being no other nominations he was elected by acclamation. Louise Riedel was nominated for secretary-treasurer. There being no other nominations she was elected by acclamation.

The meeting was called to order by president Ray Gehrig at 12 o'clock. Present were Robert Beecher, Louise Riedel, Art Priesz, Dianne Kuhn, Dale Lunde, Monna Radtke, and Wes Elford, Veterinary Representative; rider representatives Roberta Harms, Grace Ramsey, and Connie Gray. Elinore Tonsor, Wayne Gastfield and Rae Birr were guests.

Items on the president's agenda were discussed as follows:

Training and informational tape: An effort will be made to secure video tapes dealing with veterinary practices and other general ride procedures. Rick Halvorson has agreed to do the editing and to produce a tape that can be shown for various educational purposes

Publicity - Lori Windows will chair this committee. A memo from her outlined ways in which ride managers and riders can secure publicity for the sport. Connie Gray offered to prepare a poster to be printed in the Newsletter which members will be asked to copy and distribute to their local saddle shops and other outlets.

Mentor Program - It was suggested that UMECRA institute an organized method of assisting new riders. Ride managers will be asked to be aware of new participants and to attempt to pair them up with experienced riders as mentors. Interested newcomers can also be encouraged to serve as helpers, vet secretaries etc.

Grievance Procedure - A question has arisen as to the scope of the protest procedure, which states that protests can only concern an infraction of the rules. Should there be provision for other forms of "grievances"? Art will follow up on this.

Awards - Connie Gray will chair this committee.

It was suggested that UMECRA could sell sweatshirts and t-shirts on a plan whereby orders are taken and paid for before the order is placed with the supplier. The person in charge would be responsible to take orders, receive the shipment and send the items to the purchasers. Connie will contact the supplier.

5 minute P & R Program - Chuck Gray, chairman of a committee appointed at the annual meeting to study the proposed 5-minute p/r check reported on a meeting of this committee on January 13. To investigate what impact a 5-minute check will have versus a 10-minute check, the following was proposed: 1) hold both 5 and 10 minute checks at designated competitive rides. 2) record the exact time that the checks are given at these rides. 3) surprise checks to be utilized in the study groups. 4) The Saturday afternoon competitive ride would be utilized for this study. The following rides volunteered to participate: Dead Dog Creek, Diamond Lil, Glacier Trails, Illinois Challenge, Kettle Classic, SE Minnesota, White River, Wolverine. Dianne Kuhn will record the results. Ride managers are required to record both the 5- and 10-minute checks on the final score sheets so that participants can see any differences; and send a copy of this sheet to Dianne Kuhn along with the time cards. A final report will be tabulated and printed in the Newsletter.

\$5 Penalty for late renewal of membership - It was decided to extend the deadline.

By-laws - The wording of the by-laws is unclear as to whether officers are required to have served as ride managers. It is also unclear as to whether those persons who are appointed at the general meeting to serve as alternate or "proxy" delegates are eligible for election as directors or officers. The question also arose as to whether the position of secretary-treasurer should be elected or appointed. Art moved, Dale seconded that we draft an amendments to the By-laws to make it clear that 1) proxies are not eligible for election to the Board or as officers 2) that persons elected to the board or as officers have to be an actual delegate (either an elected rider representative or a ride manager) and 3) that the position or positions of secretary/treasurer be appointed by the

president and that appointment be subject to ratification by the Board. Motion carried.

Elinore suggested that the position of Newsletter Editor be appointed and that person be a member of the Board. Art will draft a proposal to that effect to be voted on at the next board meeting.

Insurance - Ray questioned whether the coverage of our present insurance policies protects ride managers from lawsuits. A discussion followed as to the extent of liability. No action was taken.

Drugs - Bob Beecher reported that AERC conducted drug testing on at least one ride per region in 1995. No positive results were found. A more extensive program will be conducted in 1996 since an extra \$1.00 per rider will be collected by AERC.

Newsletter - A committee formed at the annual meeting met January 13. It was recommended that the Newsletter be printed bi-monthly starting in February, with Elinore to set the monthly dates and cut-off time for submissions. A FAX machine was offered at UMECRA's expense. A meeting to discuss the Newsletter was held on January 28 at Juda, Wisconsin. Attending were Elinore, Ray, Louise, and Grace. It was decided that seven Newsletters would be published on the first of March, May, July, September and October, and the 15th of November and December. Advertising rates were changed--to be announced in the Newsletter. It was also decided to sell advertising in the UMECRA Directory. It was recommended to budget \$3000 for the Newsletter, plus all advertising. The purchase of computer modems to facilitate communication between the editor and the UMECRA secretary was discussed. All advertising funds are to be run through the UMECRA account in Dubuque.

Art moved that each Newsletter be limited to 12 pages, to be expanded if necessary with the approval of the executive committee. Louise seconded. Motion carried.

Bob Beecher moved, Monna Radtke seconded to purchase modems to connect the computers of the Newsletter editor and the Secretary. Motion carried.

BUDGET - Louise presented a proposed budget for 1996 as follows:

TRAILS - UMECRA should cooperate with agencies promoting horse trails in states where our rides are held. We presently are members of the Wisconsin Horse Council. Art moved, Grace seconded that the secretary be authorized to join state horse councils and such other organizations as the Illinois Trail Riders. Motion carried.

ZONE REPRESENTATION - It has been suggested that one Director be elected from each of the states where rides are held (Illinois, Michigan, Minnesota and Wisconsin). It was also suggested that the rider representatives might be elected on the same basis. This plan will be considered and discussed at the next board meeting.

MINUTES

The Board of Directors and Rider Representatives met at 5:30 p.m., July 27, at the Wildcat Ride site. Present were Ray Gehrig, Louise Riedel, Mary Mott, Dianne Kuhn, Monna Radtke, Vet Representative Wes Elford, and Rider Representatives Lori Windows, Roberta Harms and Grace Ramsey.

Louise reported membership at 395 as compared to 374 in 1995. (This does not reflect total individual members, but families as one unit). The bank balance as of this date is \$5848.20. She also reported on numbers of entries on limited distance rides--31 UMECRA members have participated in 8 rides.

The following items which were discussed at the February 11 board meeting were reviewed:

Amendments to By-Laws to clarify eligibility for election as officers and directors, and the possibility of appointing rather than electing the position of secretary/treasurer.

Video Tape: Rick Halvorson is filming rides and Lori Windows is working on a script

Zone Representation: It was suggested that each state with more than 5 rides elect a director from that state, and that there be a director-at-large.

5-Minute p/r's. This has been done at two rides. Dianne had offered to compile this information, but has not yet received the information.

Mentor Program. Ray reported having organized a program at his ride. Otherwise it has been done informally as in the past.

Horse Fairs. The benefits of having UMECRA coverage at horse fairs were discussed. There was representation at the Minnesota and Iowa fairs, and in Wisconsin in the past. It is difficult to get personnel to man these events, and the costs are high.

The meeting was suspended for dinner and reconvened afterwards. Art Priesz was also present at this time.

Art presented a set of proposed amendments to the by-laws to be recommended to the general meeting by the Board. They cover the eligibility for election as officers and directors, the position of secretary/treasurer, zone representation, and a policy to cover "grievances" in the same manner as protests, and are attached to these minutes. They will be studied further and will be published for consideration by the membership.

It was decided that the Board will meet at the Point Chaser Ride, October 19.

MINUTES - BOARD MEETING

The Board of Directors and Rider Representatives met following the Point Chaser Ride, October 19. Present were Ray Gehrig, Monna Radtke, Mary Mott, Art Priesz, Dianne Kuhg, Dale Lunde and Louise Riedel; and Rider representatives Lori Windows and Roberta Harms. Also present by invitation were Wayne Gastfield and Elinore Tonsor.

Member of the awards committee, Audrey Gehrig, and Art Priesz reviewed the plans for year-end awards.

Lori reported having received several suggestions in favor of a longer rest period on competitive rides.

This will be discussed at the next board meeting, which was scheduled for November 23 at noon at Ray Gehrig's.

Ray announced that we would discuss the proposed by-law changes, but no action will be taken until the next board meeting. A proposed change would cover the position of Secretary-Treasurer. It has been suggested that since officers and directors must be ride managers, Louise is not actually eligible for this position. Art explained that a possibility was to make this an "emeritus" position as long as she and the board agree that she wants to do it and the Board shows confidence in her conduct of the office. The description of the position of Secretary-Treasurer will be postponed until the office is vacated.

In the interest of having fairer regional representation on the Board, it is proposed that one director be elected from each of the following states: Michigan, Illinois, Wisconsin, and Minnesota, plus two directors at large. At present, directors are elected for a two-year term, and the terms are staggered. This year directors being retained are from Minnesota and Wisconsin, so we could elect directors from Illinois and Michigan. Copies of the proposed by-law changes, which are attached to these minutes, will be printed in the November Newsletter, asking for comments from the membership.

Ray and Audrey announced that they are starting a private scholarship fund for UMECRA kids. They invite UMECRA and UMECRA rides and individuals to become involved. They hope to turn it over to UMECRA in future years for management. A private foundation will be administering the program, but Ray and Audrey and their UMECRA friends are setting up the guidelines for eligibility. The program will never cost UMECRA's general fund a cent.

The limited distance program was discussed as to whether to make it a permanent program. Dianne will prepare a set of guidelines before the November 23 meeting, and will deal with the awards for this year.

The computer program covering the proposed change to a 5-minute p/r hold will be ready for discussion at the November meeting.

Nomination of the following rider representative candidates was announced. Guy Worthington (nominated by Wayne Gastfield), Roberta Harms, Connie Gray, Grace Ramsey, and Lori Windows (nominated by Ray Gehrig), and Louise Riedel (nominated by Art Priesz).

A proposed change to cover "grievances" (situations where no rule infractions are involved) could be incorporated as a rule change instead of a by-law change.

Wayne Gastfield announced he is planning a 5-day endurance ride, and inquired whether, if he decided to include competitive rides, he could set a limit on the number of entries. The reaction seemed to be that "rides must be open to all." However no action was taken. Wayne also announced that UMECRA is now a member of the Michigan Horse Council, and he is our representative. He has paid UMECRA's dues for this year.

Meeting adjourned at 9:00 p.m.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
November 23, 1996

Items to be brought before the general meeting for action are indicated by a *

The Board of Directors met at the home of Ray Gehrig, Janesville WI at 1:00 p.m. Present were President Ray Gehrig, Secretary/treasurer Louise Riedel, directors Dale Lunde, Art Priesz, and Monna Radtke; rider representatives Grace Ramsey, Lori Windows, Roberta Harms, and Connie Grey. Elinore Tonsor, Wayne Gastfield, and Lynne Priesz were also in attendance.

The minutes of the last meeting were accepted as circulated. The treasurer's report compared the 1996 budget to actual receipts and expenditures as of this date. The balance on hand is \$5285.42. Art moved, Dale seconded to accept the treasurer's report.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

5-Minute p/r checks - There was no report on the outcome of the testing of 5-minute P/Rs at 4 rides last summer; however the feeling was that except for one very hot ride, there was no significant difference between the 5- and 10-minute checks. Art moved that we instigate a procedure of 5-minute P/R checks at spot checks. Motion failed for lack of a second.

Trails - Dale reported that the state of Minnesota is proposing a trail from Duluth to Almelund. Grace spoke about the possibility of trails at the abandoned Savanna Proving Grounds. People who have ridden the Big Horn have been asked to write letters supporting the ride and the continued use of horse trails in the Big Horn wilderness area--if the ride is once discontinued it will be too late to ever secure use of this area. Elinore reported that trails in the LaFarge, Wisconsin, area where the first Wildcat ride was held have been reopened.

Awards - Connie reported that they have been taken care of.

Convention - Monna moved, Art seconded that UMECRA have its own musical entertainment (band or DJ) up to a cost of \$500. If this is not sufficient the chairman should notify Ray or Louise for additional funds up to \$750. Motion carried. There will be a survey circulated at the convention covering what members would like in regards to the trade show, auction, speakers, etc.

* Ray suggested that the convention be permanently located in a centralized location from south central Wisconsin (Wisconsin Dells) on the north, to northern Illinois (Peoria) on the south. Art moved that this question be added to the survey. Dale seconded. The results will be considered at the board meeting which will be held at 7:00 a.m. on Saturday morning.

It was discussed that the survey should be available to all members rather than only those attending the convention. Art will formulate some questions, and the survey will be printed in the December Newsletter to be returned by January 15. It can also be circulated at convention.

The question of who pays for the President's reception was asked. There has not been a consistent precedent set. Ray offered to pay half the expenses this year. It was decided that in the future UMECRA would be responsible for the cost, but that the name should be changed to "Welcome Reception"

Video - Lori has written a dialog to accompany the video. It was the consensus that we need an expert on video with the necessary equipment to edit the material (6 or 8 tapes) that we already have. A request will be printed in the Newsletter asking for names of people who might be able to do this.

The following has been added to the AERC rules: "In the event of an emergency and in order to remain in competition, the Junior who is in last place and whose pre-registered sponsor is pulled, and there are no other qualified sponsors to follow, the Junior may be sponsored by an unentered qualified rider through the completion of the ride, with ride management and ride veterinarian approval. He would receive last place junior points. This emergency sponsor will receive no credit for mileage or points. The Junior may also be sponsored by an adult on foot from the last veterinary check with the approval of ride management." Louise moved, Grace seconded to add this as Rule 4.a.3 to the UMECRA rules. Motion carried.

Art moved, Ray seconded to set a maximum carryover balance of \$250 in the convention account, and any funds over that amount to be transferred to the UMECRA general account.

Dale moved, Monna seconded that in case of a tie we score endurance points the same as we do competitive points (the tying horses both receive full points for that place and the next place is skipped--i.e. first, first, third) Motion carried.

***Limited Distance** - A report from Dianne was circulated. Art moved to accept the limited distance concept on a permanent basis. Seconded and carried to present to the voting delegates at convention. The rules will be as follows:

III B. Limited Distance Rides may be offered but must be sanctioned into the AERC Limited Distance Program and held within an adjacent 24-hour period of the endurance ride.

1. Limited Distance rides must be at least 25 miles but must not exceed 35 miles. The maximum time is 6 hours for 25 miles with adjustments made for longer mileages.

2. Equines must be at least 48 months old; on a ride of over 30 miles they must be 60 months old.

3. Ride management may allow elevation of equines 60 months or older from Limited Distance to the lowest full distance, but for completion only.

4. Limited distance competitors must be offered a separate and specific briefing on the special features and requirements of the Limited Distance rides.

5. Veterinary controls of the ride must include

a. A minimum of one vet check at or near the half-way point, with gate-into-hold criteria.

b. At the finish line only, ride time of the competitor continues until preset veterinary recovery criteria (Pulse of ~~at least~~ 60) are met. Order of finish will be recorded as the time at which a passing exam is requested.

c. Any equine not meeting the vet criteria within 30 minutes of arrival at either the vet check or the finish line will be disqualified.

6. Payment of the \$10 AERC non-member penalty is NOT required.

7. Placings and best condition may be given.

Dale moved, Ray seconded to change Rule C2 to read "If boots, bandages, or wraps are used, the horse shall be penalized 5 points per leg per day." Motion carried. Space for noting boot use should be included on the score sheet.

Louise moved, Grace seconded to delete the \$5.00 late membership fee. Motion carried.

BY-LAW CHANGES.

FIRST PROPOSED CHANGE: Ray moved, Monna seconded to change Section 1 to read. THE REGISTERED OFFICE OF THE CORPORATION. The registered Office of the corporation shall be c/o Arthur W. Priesz, Jr., **Attorney at Law, 7661 Highway 25 S.W. in the City of Montrose, County of Wright, State of Minnesota, 55363.** . . . Motion carried.

* SECOND PROPOSED CHANGE: Louise moved, Art seconded to change Article III, Section 1 to read

ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

The property and business of the Corporation shall be managed by its Board of Directors, which shall be composed of official delegates with the exception of the Board position of Veterinarian Representative which will be composed of an endurance or competitive ride veterinarian. **Official delegates shall be composed of the two actual ride managers designated for each ride in a preceding year, together with the four rider representative delegates elected by the general membership.** Motion carried.

* **THIRD PROPOSED CHANGE:** Ray moved that we accept the concept of geographic directors. Motion seconded and carried 3 2. "The Board shall not be less than three in number and not more than **sixteen**. The Board shall consist of a President, vice President, Secretary and/or Treasurer, immediate Past President, two members elected at large, or more as may be determined by majority of the Board of Directors up to a maximum of **six**, a Veterinarian representative and **four** geographic board memberships. Each state, or foreign country, ^{which maintains a minimum of 25 UMECRA members} (individuals to count as one and families to count as two) and which hosts a minimum of five sanctioned rides in the preceding season shall be eligible to have an official delegate from that state or foreign country nominated and elected by the official delegates to the general meeting to a two-year term as a geographic board member. If more than five states, or foreign countries qualify, the number of rides shall be the first qualifier for determination of which four geographic areas are eligible, followed by the number of memberships within that state or foreign country. If still tied, the state or foreign country with the largest number of rides over the history of UMECRA shall be given priority. Monna moved that nominations for geographic delegates be open to all voting delegates to convention. Seconded and carried 4-1

One, two or three directors at large will be elected each year for two-year terms, to stagger their service, or until their successor shall have been elected at the annual meeting ~~elected at the annual meeting~~ by majority vote of the attending delegates at the convention. Commencing at the 1997 convention, Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin and Minnesota will initially qualify for geographic board members. Commencing at the 1997 convention, Illinois and Michigan's geographic board members will be elected at the convention, together with one At-Large board members. The geographic board positions will be filled for the next year by current Directors at Large, Monna Radtke and Dianne Kuhn. Their geographic positions will come up for election at the 1998 convention, together with the second At Large Board position. Dale moved that all voting delegates at convention be eligible to vote for the geographic delegates. Motion carried.

Art moved that rider representatives also be elected on a geographic basis starting in 1998. Motion failed for lack of a second.

* **FOURTH PROPOSED CHANGE:** Monna moved, Ray seconded to adopt the following proposal: The position of Secretary/ Treasurer shall be elected from the voting membership and/or the membership at large and shall have all the rights and privileges granted any other member of the Executive board or Board of Directors. Motion carried.

* **FIFTH PROPOSED CHANGE.** Art moved, Ray seconded that The Executive Committee of the Board, (made up of its President, Vice President, Secretary/Treasurer, and immediate Past President) will nominate a proposed volunteer Newsletter Editor for a two-year term, commencing in 1997. Motion carried. Art moved, Dale seconded that the above be subject to vote by a majority of the Board. The Newsletter editor shall be invited to attend all board or Committee meetings and shall enjoy the same rights and privileges at such meetings as a Rider Representative. Motion carried.

***SIXTH PROPOSED CHANGE.** ARTICLE IV POWERS OF DIRECTORS. SECTION I. POWERS. In addition to

the powers and authorities conferred upon them by these BY-Laws, The Board of Directors shall have the power . . . to investigate and confront management, veterinarians, participants or attendees whose acts or failures to act are contrary to the spirit and responsibilities of participation or attendance in this sport (in the same manner and procedures as with protests), and to construe rules which may from time to time present an ambiguity.

The ballots for rider representatives had been counted and showed the following electees: Louise Riedel, Guy Worthington, Roberta Harms, Lori Windows, and Connie Gray, alternate. (If the proposed by-law change is passed concerning the Secretary-Treasurer position, Louise will relinquish the rider representative position.)

Scholarship Fund: Ray reviewed the plans for a scholarship fund which he and Audrey propose to found. Art read the questions for the survey which will be presented in the Newsletter.

★ **Proposal for FEI fund.** Elinore presented a proposal for redefining the distribution of funds raised by the semi-annual silent auction:

1. A silent auction will be held semi-annually (in odd-numbered years) at the UMECRA convention.
2. There will be no trade fair held at the convention in years when a silent auction is held. Ten percent of the funds raised during the silent auction will be turned over to UMECRA to defray the loss of income of booth fees.
3. The money raised at the silent auction will go to benefit two funds: the International Competition and the UMECRA Scholarship Fund. The money will be divided as follows:
 - > A minimum amount of \$7,000 will be designated for the International Competition Fund. During a year when the fund has gone below a \$7,000 balance, proceeds will be used to replenish that account to the \$7,000 level.
 - > All proceeds in excess of the money needed to resblish the \$7,000 balance in the International Competition Fund will go to the UMECRA Scholarship Fund.

Art moved that we adopt this fund proposal, but that it be tabled until we receive results of the survey. Dale seconded. Passed 3-2.

In response to a letter from a UMECRA member, Art moved that miles ridden outside of UMECRA be counted toward the 1000-mile horse award. Ray seconded. The motion was defeated. Art moved that we do away with weight divisions and follow AERC as far as reporting ride results (top ten only) Motion failed for lack of a second. He next moved that UMECRA use a 2-minute penalty (Instead of the current 10 minutes) for endurance horses that are presented before their pulse reaches the parameter. Motion failed for lack of a second.

A request had been received that names of first across the line and best condition be published in the Newsletter. This will be done. Another proposal had been received that the holds on competitive rides be extended to 40 minutes. This will be added as a suggestion in the ride manager's manual.

Art moved that beginning in 1998 the board require that names of ^{official} ~~alternate~~ delegates be submitted in ~~writing~~ to the secretary. Louise Riedel seconded. Motion carried.

The 1997 tentative schedule was reviewed and approved.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:00 p.m.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS

January 18, 1997

The Board of Directors met at 7:00 a.m. at the Apache Motel, Rochester, Minnesota, with Ray Gehrig presiding. Also present were Directors R.A. Beecher, Louise Riedel, Dianne Kuhn, Mary Mott, Monna Radtke, Art Priesz, Dale Lunde, veterinary delegate Wes Elford, and rider representatives Roberta Harms, Grace Ramsey, Lori Windows, Connie Gray. representative, The minutes of the previous meeting were approved.

Dianne read the results of the survey that had been distributed as members signed in. Results of the survey that had been mailed were reviewed. Copy attached. Louise Riedel referred the board to a copy of correspondence that had been received from Vi Bredi and Larry and Jean Miller.

Mary Mott moved *to establish a centralized location for the convention, beginning in 1999*. Monna Radtke seconded. Motion carried. Dianne Kuhn moved that the location *be in a corridor between Wisconsin Dells and Rockford, Illinois*. Monna seconded. Motion carried.

Ray Gehrig explained the principles of the scholarship fund that he and Audrey have established. He proposes to turn this fund over to UMECRA next year if the organization wishes it. Louise Riedel moved, Mary Mott seconded *to go on record as being in favor of the scholarship fund as envisioned by Ray and Audrey Gehrig*. Motion carried.

The methods of disbursement of funds from the silent auction were recommended as follows:

Wes moved *to maintain a balance of \$9,000 in the FEI fund*. Monna Radtke seconded. Motion carried.

Art Priesz moved that *a percentage of the money raised be designated for specific projects for trails*. Bob Beecher seconded. Motion carried.

Art Priesz moved, Dianne Kuhn seconded that *a percentage of the money be designated to the scholarship fund*. Motion carried.

Dianne Kuhn moved, Dale Lunde seconded that *a percentage of the money be designated to an office contingency fund to be capped at \$2500*. Motion carried.

Bob Beecher moved, Wes Elford seconded *that the receipts from the silent auction be allocated as follows:*

The first portion to maintain the ICF fund at \$9,000.

The next \$500 to be allocated to the Scholarship fund

The next \$500 to be allocated to the Trails Fund

The balance to be allocated to the Office-Contingency Fund up to a cap of \$2500

The remaining funds (after the \$2500 cap on the office-contingency fund is reached) to be split between the Scholarship and Trails Funds

Motion carried. A new bank account will be opened for the trails-contingency fund (savings or money market)

Bob Beecher moved, Wes Elford seconded that *the silent auction and trade show be held every year*. Motion carried 8-1. A committee will be appointed for the silent auction.

Dianne reported on a computer analysis of the 5-minute p/r study. Action has already been taken not to implement this plan. This committee (Chuck Gray, chairman) will remain intact to further study the score sheet.

Wes discussed the subject of fees for convention speakers. It was suggested that the convention fee be increased to \$10 to cover this and other convention expenses. This will be added to the agenda for the next board meeting.

A letter was presented to the Board from Mike Thomas concerning our rules in relationship with AERC rules. This will be added to the agenda for the next board meeting.

Louise asked the Board's permission to circulate a straw ballot concerning the issue of cash awards at endurance rides. It was decided that Bob and Art would present the positive and negative aspects at the close of the general meeting and the ballot would then be distributed.

The meeting adjourned.

Art Priesz moved, Bob Beecher seconded to approve the minutes of the last general meeting as published in the Newsletter. Motion carried. Bob Beecher moved, Art Priesz seconded to approve the financial report as circulated. Motion carried. Bob moved, Art seconded to approve the Newsletter Report as circulated. Motion carried. Ray thanked the individuals who had contributed to the success of the convention.

COMMITTEE REPORTS.

AERC Jan Worthington reported that the AERC regional awards will be given following our banquet.

INTERNATIONAL Grace Ramsey reported that nominations are open for the North American Championship to be held in Bend, Oregon, September 13. It will be expanded to be the Pan American games, with countries coming from Central and South America. Carol Patterson is the selection chairman for the Central Time Zone.

1998 CONVENTION Cynthia Worthington reported that it will be held the first weekend of January at the Radisson Hotel in Maryville Indiana. Everyone was urged to take videos of rides this season so they can be shown at the convention.

Louise Riedel moved, Chuck Gray seconded to approve the 1997 schedule with the addition of the MnDRA I Ride, which had been omitted from the list. Motion carried

Actions taken by the Board that do not require general membership approval:

Addition of rule concerning Juniors to agree with AERC. (Juniors in last place who lose their sponsors may be accompanied by an unentered rider.)

Set a maximum carryover balance of \$250 in the convention account with funds over that transferred to the UMECRA general account

If boots, bandages or wraps are used the horse shall be penalized 5 points per leg **per day**. A space for "Use of Boots" will be added to the score sheet.

Delete the \$5.00 late membership fee.

Ties: Points for ties in endurance rides to be handled same as competitive: Tying horses both receive full points for that place and the next place is skipped.

Beginning in 1998 the names of ~~alternate~~ ^{official} delegates shall be submitted in writing to the secretary prior to the meeting. A cutoff time will be established at the next Board meeting.

Names of first across the line and best condition will be printed in Newsletter

Considered a request that holds on competitive rides be extended to 40 minutes. This will be added as an option in the Ride Managers Manual

Motions either defeated by the Board or failed because of lack of a second

5-minute p/r checks. The committee considering this action will remain in place with Chuck Gray as chairman.

Rides ridden outside of UMECRA be counted toward the 1000-mile award

Do away with weight divisions and use top ten only

Use a 2-minute penalty for endurance horses that are presented before reaching parameters (instead of present 10 minutes)

Rider representatives be elected on a geographic basis.

ACTION BY BOARD AT THIS MORNING'S MEETING

Based on the results of the membership survey the Board voted that future conventions be held at a centralized location in a corridor between Wisconsin Dells and Rockford. Chuck Gray offered to host the 1999 convention. Mike Thomas suggested that an east-west limit should also be established, for instance within a certain number of miles of Interstate 90-94.

The Board voted to go on record as being in favor the the scholarship fund proposed by Ray and Audrey Gehrig. The Board voted to have a trade show and silent auction every year.

NEW BUSINESS

Dianne Kuhn moved, Chuck Gray seconded to add **limited distance rides to the UMECRA program**. Motion carried

PROPOSED BY LAW CHANGES (must carry by a 2/3 majority)

Change 1: Bob Beecher moved, Chuck Gray seconded that the address of the registered office of the corporation in Section I be changed to read **7761 Highway 25 S.W. in the City of Montrose, County of Wright, State of Minnesota, 55363** . Motion carried.

Change 2: The proposed change reads: "Official delegates shall be composed of the two actual ride managers designated for each ride in a preceding year, together with the four rider representative delegates elected by the general membership." Mike Thomas questioned what would happen in the case of a ride that only had one official manager. Louise moved, Chuck seconded to propose that only one ride manager would be designated for each ride. Jim Koehn pointed out that this would cut down the pool from which to elect possible directors and officers. The motion and second were withdrawn. Fred Kuhn moved to leave it as it is. Grace Ramsey seconded. This motion and second were also withdrawn. Therefore the By-laws stand as written.

Change 3: Art Priesz moved, Bob Breecher seconded to accept this change **which provides for a director to be elected from each of the four states, each elected to a two-year term. Presently Dianne Kuhn, representing Minnesota, and Monna Radtke representing Wisconsin, are beginning the second year of a two-year term, which would result in**

our electing regional directors from Illinois and Michigan. If at any time a state hosts a minimum of five rides and has 25 UMECRA members, that state shall be eligible for a director. One director at large will be elected this year for two years and one next year for two years. Motion carried.

Rick Nelson moved, Deb Bosma seconded that the directors be nominated and elected by that state's delegates. Mike Thomas proposed a friendly amendment that the delegates shall vote from the state where their ride is held rather than their place of residence. The maker and seconder of the original motion accepted the friendly amendment. The motion was defeated.

Mary Mott moved, Monna Radtke seconded *to nominate and elect the geographic directors by the voting delegates at large*. Elinore Tonsor proposed a friendly amendment that *the geographic directors be nominated by their state and elected by the voting delegates at large at the general meeting*. The maker and seconder of the motion agreed to the friendly amendment. Motion carried.

Change 4. Wes Elford moved, Chuck Gray seconded that *an Executive committee of the Board (made up of its President, Vice President, Secretary/treasurer and immediate past president) will nominate a proposed a volunteer Newsletter Editor for a two-year term commencing in 1997, subject to vote by a majority of the Board. The Newsletter editor shall be invited to attend all Board or Committee meetings, and shall enjoy the same rights and privileges at such meetings as a rider Representative.* This nomination will be made at the spring Board meeting. Motion carried.

Change 5. Art Priesz moved, Bob Beecher seconded to add the following to Article IV, Section I. The Board of Directors shall have the power. . .to *investigate and confront management, veterinarians, participants or attendees whose acts or failures to act are contrary to the spirit and responsibilities of participation or attendance in this sport (in the same manner and procedures as with protests)*. Motion carried.

Art Priesz moved, Chuck Gray moved to *distribute the proceeds of the silent auction in the manner as described in the minutes of the Board meeting as set forth above*. Motion carried.

Rider representatives elected for 1997 were announced and seated. They are Connie Gray, Roberta Harms, Lori Windows and Guy Worthington.

The election of officers was conducted by Art Priesz. Nominated for president was Ray Gehrig. There being no further nominations, he was elected by acclamation. Nominated for vice-president were Mary Mott and Bob Beecher. Mary was elected. Nominated for Secretary/treasurer were Louise Riedel and Jan Worthington, who declined. There being no further nominations Louise was elected by acclamation. Nominated for the director from Michigan were Wayne Gastfield and Becke Grams. Wayne was elected. Nominated for the director from Illinois were Linda Mowrer, Bob Beecher and Rick Nelson, Bob Beecher was elected. Nominated for Director at large were Dawn Haas, Rick Nelson and Linda Mowrer. Rick was elected. Nominated for Veterinary representative was Wes Elford. There being no further nominations, he was elected by acclamation.

The meeting was adjourned.

The convention will be held January 8, 9 at the Radisson Hotel, Maryville IN, with Becke Grams and Cynthia Worthington in charge of arrangements. **Art moved that a flat fee of \$42.50 be assessed for convention registration to include everything. Exception: there will be a \$5.00 registration fee for juniors 16 and under who do not attend the banquet.** Mary seconded. Motion carried.

Art moved, Wayne seconded to **pay no more than \$150 for the pre-booking fee for the entertainment.** Motion carried.

Art moved, Rick seconded to **pay stipends and expenses for speakers as suggested by convention chairmen.** Motion carried.

COMMITTEES

Ray appointed Dianne to chair a committee to draw up guidelines for convention management and budgeting and to formulate a list of possible speakers. She will appoint committee members.

Trail - Art volunteered to chair the Trails Committee, to include Mary, Guy, Ed Hauser.

Video - Rick Halvorson has put together a video. It will go to Lori Windows to have sound added.

Silent Auction - Guy will recruit help for the silent auction and will check with Elinore.

ICF Fund - Art moved that *we publish the criteria for receipt of ICF Funds, and the name of the chairman and committee members of the ICF fund in the Newsletter.* Ray appointed Elinore as chairman.

NEWSLETTER - Ray appointed Elinore as Newsletter editor for a two year term--approved by executive committee. BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
November 8, 1997

The Board of Directors met at the home of Louise Riedel, Dubuque, IA on November 8, 1997. In attendance were Ray Gehrig, Mary Mott, Louise Riedel, Art Priesz, Rick Nelson, Dianne Kuhn, Monna Radtke, Wayne Gastfield, Wes Elford, Lori Windows, Roberta Harms, Guy Worthington, and Connie Gray.

The minutes of the March board meeting were approved as circulated in the Newsletter. The treasurer's report showed a balance of \$9180.79 as of November 3. Art moved, Wayne seconded to approve the report. Motion carried.

Committee reports followed:

TRAILS. Art reported having received a request for a grant from the Trails Fund from Maureen Johnson, manager of the Prairie River Ride, to aid in construction of new bathrooms at that ride site.. He recommended tabling this matter to the Board meeting at convention.

VIDEO. The Board viewed part of the video that had been prepared by Rick Halvorson with commentary by Lori Windows. She felt that it was not suitable for a training tool, which was the original concept of a video, for use by veterinarians, ride managers, etc. It was suggested that a professional producer be contacted with reference to filming a video staged specifically for the purposes we have in mind. Monna was appointed to contact such a producer to ascertain costs.

ICF FUND. Louise reported a balance of \$3,734.54 in the fund. A total of \$6600 had been donated to the UMECRA members who participated in the Pam American Championship in Bend, Oregon. The silent auction was discussed. According to the decisions made at the 1997 annual meeting, funds from auctions will go into the ICF fund until it is replenished to the level of \$9000. Elinore will supervise the 1998 auction, but needs help. Art volunteered to send letters of request to possible donors. Mary will take care of the award that goes to the high bidder. Guy Worthington was appointed at the March meeting to assist with the auction.

AWARDS. Connie asked for the Board's opinion on updating the UMECRA jacket, to be available to all award winners, not only the first-time winners, with no extra charge. The jacket is water-resistant, lined, will be in the UMECRA color (cranberry), and will have the logo embroidered rather than heat-stamped. The cost of the jacket is in the \$55 range. It was the consensus of the board that this proposal be accepted, if the sample jacket which Connie had not yet received is suitable as described. Connie reported that some members had asked if they could have one of Elinore's rain blankets by making up the difference in cost between the jacket and the blanket. The difference would be approximately \$50-\$55. The Board agreed to approve this concept. The choices for top-ten winners will be a half-bale bag, the jacket, or credit toward the rain sheet. Rookie, and Restricted Mileage awards will be nylon hay bags.

CONVENTION - Dianne read a report from the convention committee, consisting of Dianne, Rick, and Mary. The purpose of the committee was to establish an outline for those who set up the Annual Meeting. It covered the topics of site selection, room rates, president's reception, education, banquet, dance and convention fee. Art moved *to table discussion on this report until the spring Board meeting.* Monna Seconded. Motion carried. The 1999 convention site was discussed. Ray stated that Chuck Gray had contacted the Interlachen Resort near Lake Geneva. Monna suggested looking at the Blackfoot Lodge at Wisconsin Dells. Wes inquired about the procedure for selecting speakers--he has served as the contact person for securing speakers for a number of years. This will also be discussed at the spring meeting.

VOTING DELEGATES. Article VII, Section 4 of the By-Laws reads " Two delegates shall be chosen by each ride. . .and shall be considered and accredited as delegates at any meeting of the members of this corporation.. Rider representatives, officers and members of the Board of Directors shall be considered and accredited as delegates also. Although one person may serve in a combination of the above positions, h/she may exercise only one vote as a delegate." Discussion followed as to whether a delegate from one ride can vote on behalf of other rides. Art moved that *the Board interpret the rule to mean that no one can be a delegate for more than one ride.* Monna seconded. Motion carried. A notice

to will be published in the Newsletter and will be sent to all ride managers stating that the names of official delegates shall be submitted in writing to the secretary, and that their names must be received by mail or FAX, to be postmarked by December 15.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM MEMBERS.

Lori read a letter from Mike Thomas concerning UMECRA's relationship with AERC, especially as regards horses receiving treatment after passing the final vet check. AERC states that a rider can present his horse for a final check any time WITHIN the hour and that no horse may be disqualified for veterinary reasons after the final check. Art moved to *pass a resolution asking AERC to re-consider the portion of rule 6.2.1.1 that reads "Once a competing horse has passed the post ride examination, it may not be removed from completion for veterinary reasons, this letter to be submitted to the veterinary committee for reconsideration and evaluation.* Rick seconded. Motion carried.

A question had been asked as to the use of alternative therapies on competitive rides. AERC rules state in Rule 13a that "The use of additional therapies during competition shall be prohibited. This shall include any invasive procedures (eg, acupuncture), manipulative procedures, (eg: osseous manipulative procedures), the use of any devices to manipulate or stimulate accupressure or response points (eg Bioscans, laser lights, magnetic stimulation devices etc.)" Rick moved to adopt this rule for competitive rides. Roberta seconded. Motion was defeated

A question had been asked as to whether a rider has to divide the allotted hours equally between each day, or can he use an unequal portion for each day (example on a 100-mile 2-day ride, where the total time is 24 hours, can he finish the first day in 6 hours, and use up to 18 hours on the second day?) Even AERC does not know the answer. The question will be asked at the AERC convention.

A letter from John Sturm was read which suggested that "Instead of allowing a total accumulation of points for all of the rides a rider can get to, maybe we could allow riders to select their 'top ten' (best) rides. In this way, many of the people who are able to get to 12-14 rides would have a shot at the year end award." Dianne moved to accept this recommendation, Rick seconded. Motion defeated.

We asked if the awards can be given out on more timely basis at the banquet. It was suggested that some of the awards could be distributed at the Friday night reception or during the cocktail hour. No action was taken.

RIDER REPRESENTATIVES. The following members have been nominated; Maxine Bernsdorf, Connie Gray, Roberta Harms, Lori Windows, and Guy Worthington. Ballots will be enclosed with the next Newsletter.

Monna suggested that large laminated black and white directional road sign arrows be included in the box of ride supplies. Ray moved that this be done, Monna seconded. Motion defeated.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND - Ray reported that there is now \$55,159.29 in the fund, with \$306 having been received in donations during the past year.

Monna suggested that UMECRA participate with a booth at the Wisconsin Horse Fair at a cost of \$200. She volunteered to man the booth. Mary moved that we allocate an amount not to exceed \$500 in the general fund to be divided among any of the UMECRA affiliated organizations who wish to participate in horse fairs. This money should be applied for by the annual convention and decided on at the next Board meeting. Wayne seconded. Motion carried.

The proposed 1998 schedule was presented. Rick moved to approve, Mary seconded. Carried.

The Board will meet Saturday morning, January 10 at 7 a.m.

Rick moved to adjourn.

BOARD MEETING

January 10, 1997

The meeting was called to order by President Ray Gehrig. Attending were Mary Mott, Louise Riedel, Monna Radtke, Dianne Kuhn, Rick Nelson, Art Priesz, Wes Elford, Rider Representatives Roberta Harms, Connie Gray, Lori Windows and Guy Worthington, and Newsletter Editor Elinore Tonsor.

Mary moved, Dianne seconded to approve the minutes as circulated in the Newsletter. The treasurer's report showed income of \$20,613.64, expenses of \$15,991.65 and a balance of \$4,621.99, with accounts receivable of \$262.50. The convention account has a total of \$844.95 and the Contingency-Trails fund--\$2,580.02, for total assets of \$8,318.46. In addition the International Competitions Fund (ICF) showed an income of \$9,262.91, expenses of \$5,630.91, with a balance of \$3,632.91. Copies of this report are attached to the minutes. Monna moved to accept the treasurer's report, Wes seconded. Motion carried.

Mike Thomas reported that he had found a box containing \$145 in cash and some 13-year-old UMECRA items that had been for sale (jackets, t-shirts and patches). It was suggested that they be added to the silent auction

ICF FUND--Elinore stated that she anticipated that the proceeds from the auction will be down this year and recommended that the auction be held every other year as in the past. She also suggested that the proceeds of the silent auction be divided among the three recipient funds with 75% of the income going to the ICF fund up to the cap of \$9000, and the remainder being divided between the Scholarship fund and the trails/contingency fund.

It was suggested that if international riders, who have received ICF money, win cash at a ride, they should repay the amount they received from the Fund. Tabled until spring board meeting.

Wes moved, Monna seconded that *the silent auction be held every other year*. Motion carried.

Dianne moved, Roberta seconded that we *invite vendors to a trade fair every year*. Motion carried.

Dianne moved that *the first 75% of the silent auction proceeds go to the ICF fund until the cap of \$9000 is reached, with the last 25% divided three ways (scholarship, trails and contingency) until the contingency fund reaches a cap of \$2500, at which time it will be divided between scholarship and trails*. Motion carried with one opposed. To be referred to the general meeting.

CONVENTION--A question was asked as to whether the corridor between Wisconsin Dells and Rockford, which was established as a centralized area for UMECRA annual meetings, also included east-west boundaries along Interstate 94. The minutes of the 1997 meeting listed this as a recommendation. Objections were voiced as to the choice of the Interlaken in Lake Geneva for the 1999 convention. Board members volunteered to investigate sites at Oconomowoc, Madison, Wisconsin Dells, Rockford and Janesville, to report to the secretary by February 1. The first weekend after New Years was suggested as a suitable time.

TRAILS--Art reported that a request had been made by the Prairie River Riders Association for funds to help improve the ride site by the construction of latrines. Art moved *that we give them \$100*. Ray seconded. Louise proposed a friendly amendment *to increase the amount to \$200*. Art approved the amendment. Motion carried.

Mike Thomas addressed the Board relative to UMECRA's relationship with AERC. He would like UMECRA to institute a rule that says that we will automatically adopt an AERC rule only if non compliance results in either a horse, a rider, or a ride being unable to receive sanctioning or points from AERC. Every other rule change would have to go through normal UMECRA channels in order to be adopted. (At present UMECRA adopts AERC rules for endurance automatically). Art explained that in spite of this we are not prevented from establishing different rules. We still have the option of presenting a proposal

for our own organization that differs from AERC .

Lori moved that ***no horse will be certified for UMECRA COMPLETION if it needs or receives treatment for metabolic reasons before leaving the grounds, regardless of whether it has passed its final check. Such horse/rider combination may still receive AERC points and mileage credit.*** Monna seconded. Motion carried with two opposed. To be presented to the general meeting. (Present UMECRA Rule I F c will remain in effect "Mileage but not placing shall be allowed for a horse that has passed the final check but needs metabolic treatment after that check."

SCHOLARSHIP FUND -- Ray reported that Brandi Read and Karen Welle have received grants of \$1500 each. The fund has a balance of \$58,000, with only the interest being used for scholarships. John Sturm has donated a horse trailer to the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin, which administers the fund.

VIDEO--Monna had been appointed to investigate having a professional produce an instructional video, primarily for veterinarians. The two people she contacted quoted prices of \$2800 and \$3800. A professor at the Madison technical college proposed offering this as a project to three students, with UMECRA paying only expenses, estimated to be about \$1500. Art moved, Mary seconded ***to have Monna investigate this further with an authorized budget of \$1500, to have a written proposal to present to the executive committee.*** There is a possibility that these videos could be marketed. Motion carried with two opposed.

GENERAL MEETING January 10, 1998

The meeting was called to order by President Ray Gehrig at 1:30 p.m. Delegates from the following rides answered to roll call: AHAM, AHDRA I, AHDRA II, ApDRA, Charity Cup, Dead Dog Creek, Diamond Lil, DRAW, Frostbite Fiasco, Glacier Trails, Jubilee, Kettle Classic, KM Colorama, Little Manistee, Mt. Valhalla, No. Highland, No. Illinois I, No. Illinois II, One More Ride, Point Chaser, Prairie River, Rock River, SE Minnesota, Shore to Shore, Southern I, Spirit Mountain, Tin Cup Springs, White River Spring, Summer, Fall and Labor Day, Wildcat, and Wolverine. There were 71 eligible to vote.

Ray thanked the people who contributed to the success of the convention including: Becke Grams and her committee, Connie Gray for handling awards, Kim Kingsley for donating Top Ten mileage awards, Vi and Jerry Bredl for engraving trophy plates, Elinor Tonsor for the silent auction, and Roger Rittenhouse for donating heart monitors.

The treasurer's report (attached to these minutes) was circulated and briefly reviewed by Louise. Art Priesz moved, Chuck Gray seconded to accept it. Motion carried.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

AERC - Jan Worthington urged members to attend the convention which will be held in Lexington, KY on the 23-24 of January. As of December 1, 1997, there is a \$10 charge to nominate new horses in the AERC mileage program.

INTERNATIONAL - Chuck Gray congratulated Jan for placing 10th at the World Cup Ride in Qatar in November and Guy Worthington for completing the Pan American Games Ride in Oregon in September. He announced that Grace Ramsey has been appointed to the AHSA endurance committee. Grace thanked Chuck for his service as chairman of the AERC International Committee for the past several years. She then told about the ride in Oregon. A number of UMECRA members participated as riders and support people. The 1999 North American Championship may be held at the site of the Great Northern Connection in Canada. The World Championship will be held in Dubai on December 12. Nominations will open the first of February; nomination forms may be secured from USET or Tony Benedetti, chairman of the Selection Committee.

SCHEDULE - Art moved to approve the tentative schedule, Chuck seconded. Motion carried.

Monna mentioned that DRAW has prepared Road Turn Signs They will be distributed to Wisconsin rides,

but there are some available for other rides.

OLD BUSINESS

ITEMS PASSED BY BOARD 1/10/98, NOT NEEDING GENERAL MEETING ACTION

VIDEO - Monna was appointed to negotiate with MATC (Madison technical school) concerning production of a video, with a budget of \$1500. These videos may be marketed.

TRAILS - \$200 will be donated from the Trails Fund to the Prairie River Riders Association for improvements at the trail head.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND - Two applicants received the maximum grant of \$1500. Proceeds from the sale of a horse trailer donated by John Sturm will be added to the scholarship fund. Approximately \$58,000 is now in the fund, with only interest being used for grants.

NEW BUSINESS

ICF FUND - At present the proceeds of the silent auction are allocated as follows: 100% to ICF fund up to a cap of \$9,000. Balance of proceeds to be divided among Trails/Contingency and Scholarship funds. Elinore moved *that that the proceeds of the silent auction be divided among the three recipient funds with 75% of the income going to the ICF fund up to the cap of \$9000, and the remainder being divided between the Scholarship fund and the Trails/Contingency fund.* Tony Troyer seconded. Motion carried.

Art moved that *no horse will be certified for UMECRA COMPLETION if it needs or receives treatment for metabolic reasons before leaving the grounds, regardless of whether it has passed its final check. Such horse/rider combination may still receive AERC points and mileage credit.* This is a reenactment of a UMECRA rule that was in force prior to 1997, at which time an AERC rule was passed stating that no horse could be pulled after passing its final check. (Present UMECRA Rule I F c will remain in effect "Mileage but not placing shall be allowed for a horse that has passed the final check but needs metabolic treatment after that check.")
1999 CONVENTION. The Board recommended that it be held the week following New Years. Negotiations had been initiated with the Interlaken Resort at Lake Geneva WI, but some dissatisfaction had been voiced at the Board meeting. Board members were appointed to investigate the following sites: Oconomowoc, Wisconsin Dells, Madison, Janesville, Beloit and Rockford--this to be reported to the Executive committee for decision by February 1. Tony Troyer moved to *accept the Interlaken site.* Cyndi Worthington seconded. Motion carried. The dates which had been established with the Interlaken are January 15, 16 1999.

The election of Rider Representatives resulted in the following: Maxine Bernsdorf, Connie Gray, Roberta Harms, and Guy Worthington. Ray thanked Lori Windows for her years of service.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS: Mary Mott was nominated for president. There being no further nominations she was elected unanimously.

Mike Thomas, Dianne Kuhn and Art Priesz were nominated for Vice President. Art withdrew. Mike Thomas was elected.

Louise Riedel was nominated for Secretary-Treasurer. There being no further nominations, she was elected unanimously.

Wes Elford was nominated for Veterinary Representative. There being no further nominations, he was elected unanimously.

Regional Directors. Dianne Kuhn was nominated as delegate from Minnesota. Monna Radtke was nominated as delegate from Wisconsin. There being no further nominations they were elected. (2-year term)

Art Priesz and Joe Mattingley were nominated for Director at large. Art was elected. (2-year term)

The meeting was called to order by President Mary Mott. Also present were Mike Thomas, Louise Riedel, Ray Gehrig, Monna Radtke, Art Priesz, Wayne Gastfield, Dianne Kuhn, and Rider Representatives Connie Gray and Roberta Harms.

The minutes of the past Board meeting were approved as circulated in the Newsletter.

A count of the ballots for Rider Representatives resulted in the following being elected: Maxine Bernsdorf, Connie Gray, Roberta Harms and Dale Lunde.

Louise presented the following chart of comparisons for 1997 and 1998:

NEWSLETTER. In January 1997, the following motion was passed. The Executive committee consisting of the President, Vice-president, Secretary and immediate past president will nominate a proposed volunteer Newsletter Editor for a two-year term, beginning in 1997, subject to a vote by a majority of the Board. . . The nomination will be made at the spring Board meeting." Louise suggested that since we don't always have a spring board meeting, this appointment should be made the first of the year. Mike moved, Wayne seconded **that we canvass possible candidates, to be decided at the January Board meeting.** Motion carried. June Scheunemann, who has been serving as interim director will be contacted.

VETERINARY DIRECTORY. Mike reported that after a request for names of veterinarians had been printed in two Newsletters, he has received three names. The program will be continued.

VIDEO. Monna asked for a description of what we specifically want the video to cover (lameness of horses, vet procedures or a promotional introduction to the sport). It was the consensus that a promotional type video that described vet check-ins and other procedures would serve a dual purpose. She had received bids ranging from \$2000 to \$25,000 for a 15-minute video. There is an older video in existence, and it was decided this should be brought to the banquet for viewing. The matter is tabled until the annual meeting. Connie suggested that if we advertise UMECRA, we include a statement that a video is available.

AWARDS. Connie reported that top ten awards have been chosen. She demonstrated a pocket-type hanging holder for grooming tools etc. and a crew bag as possibilities for limited distance, restricted mileage and rookie. The board was in favor of the holder. It was reported that limited distance and restricted mileage riders want their awards to be equal to top ten. It was the consensus of the Board that the system remain as is. Connie asked that she be replaced as awards chairman for next year.

CONVENTION GUIDELINES. Mary presented a draft of procedures for managing banquets/general meetings. Board members were asked to review this proposal, to be voted on at the next Board meeting.

A bid for the 2000 meeting had been submitted earlier in the year for Wisconsin Dells on January 15, 16.. This was accepted. Wayne moved, Mike seconded that **Dianne ask Marilyn Horstmeyer to speak on saddle fitting.** Motion carried.

BIDS FOR THE YEARS 2001 SHOULD BE PRESENTED TO THE BOARD BEFORE THE

A letter had been received from Miles Harston regarding competitive rides, specifically (1) novice rides and (2) a different p/r scoring system. He proposed two novice divisions, one where the rider is to be a novice until he wins 3 first places; and a novice division for 12-mile rides. Also he proposed having clinics and open rides, both of which are already in existence. The shorter distance open rides are usually not UMECRA sanctioned. A letter from Ron and Trevor Mott suggested encouraging rides to add novice divisions, with no rider fee going to UMECRA and adding year-end awards. No action was taken. Regarding the proposed p/r chart, which is similar to IAHA's, Art moved, Wayne seconded that **the executive committee pick 5 rides, the score sheets from which would be turned over to Miles Harston for comparison of the placings under both systems, with the results to be reported to the board for the meeting in 2000.** Motion carried 6-1.

Louise presented a proposal on behalf of Dr. Beecher to change the competitive score sheet to eliminate pre-ride deduction points for Lameness and Fatigue/Attitude, and to prevent any horse with a grade 2 lameness or worse from starting. Reason: Under the present score sheet points can be deducted at the pre-ride vet check for any degree of lameness. The result is that a lame horse who finishes in the same condition as it started can beat a horse that started and finished sound. The same applies to a horse that loses points pre-ride for fatigue/attitude. The proposed change includes space on the sheet for comments as to way of going & attitude. Art moved, Louise seconded to **present to the general meeting that no pre-ride points be deducted for existing pre-ride lameness and fatigue/attitude.** Motion carried.

Art moved, Mike seconded to present to the general meeting without recommendation that horses with grade 2 lameness not be allowed to start. Motion defeated.

SCHOLARSHIP FUND. There are three applicants: Becky Radtke, Karen Welle and James Olson. There is approximately \$73,000 in the fund, handled by the community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin, which provides for a review committee from UMECRA of 3 to 5 members. These members shall be regional representatives as well as one of the original donors. Art moved, Monna seconded that **the 4 regional representatives plus the UMECRA secretary and one of the original donors act as a committee to facilitate disseminating information and encouraging candidates to apply and that 1/2 page of information be included in the ride book stating criteria and deadlines.** Motion carried.

Art moved, Monna seconded to **allocate \$250 each to the Minnesota and Wisconsin Horse Fairs.** Motion carried.

TRAIL FUND. Ray moved, Monna seconded, to **allocate \$100 each from our Trails fund to The Matthiesen Volunteer Horsemen group (site of Rock River Ride) and Forestville State Park (SE Minn. ride) for trail improvement.** In both cases we are assured that the money will go for the purposes stated, not into some general fund. Motion carried.

Art moved, Ray seconded to **offer Ryugen Fisher a continuing ad in the Newsletter in appreciation of his donating the UMECRA ride site.** Motion carried.

Mary announced that John Sturm has agreed to head a committee to develop methods of promoting UMECRA through advertising and other means.

CUT OFF TIMES. Mike presented a letter from Bonnie Tobias regarding cut-off times. Art moved that if a ride is intending to use cut off times, it must be announced in the ride flyer. Monna seconded. Motion defeated 4-3. Art moved that we propose the following to the general meeting: **That we add to the general rules that any cut off time at a check be reasonably proportionate to the mileage-ride time.** Monna seconded. Motion carried.

Monna suggested that we include e-mail and cell phone numbers in the Rider Directory. A space will be provided on the membership application.

Dianne moved to propose the following to the general meeting. **A rider must declare his or her weight division at the beginning of the season and must remain constant for the remainder of the ride year.** Mike seconded. The vote resulted in a 3-3 tie with one abstention. The president broke the tie in favor of the motion.

Art moved that we **make an addition to our suggested guidelines for veterinarians to encourage a Cardiac Recovery Index (CRI) in endurance events at the end, and at one check for a 50 mile ride, and at two checks during the course of the ride for 100 miles.** A friendly amendment was offered to **eliminate the check at the end.** Motion carried as amended.

Art moved that there be one weight class for senior riders requiring 165 lbs or more including tack, with top 10 awards

at each ride and top 25 at year end. Motion defeated.

Art moved that we provide a veterinary guideline reducing the pulse criteria for endurance to 60, with the ending pulse remaining at 68. Ray seconded. Motion defeated.

Art moved that we require an open book test of the rules for all veterinarians who are going to work rides, at least initially. Motion defeated.

Art moved that **we ask Dr. Elford or some other interested veterinarian to prepare an outline of procedures for colic and other metabolic problems, for inclusion in the guidelines.** Motion carried.

Art moved that a horse's participation in limited distance rides be limited to two seasons, after which time he must go on to longer distances. Monna seconded. Motion defeated.

The present procedure calls for ride managers to present the names of the persons who will be voting for their ride to the Secretary by December 15. Since the dates of our convention vary it was the consensus that the deadline should be set as two weeks prior to convention.

A letter had been received from the Point Chaser ride managers concerning questions about an AERC drug testing visit. No formal grievance was presented. No action was taken.

The tentative schedule was presented. Mary Mott objected to the Ride the Prairie Ride being set on the same date as Kettle Classic. Ray moved to adopt the schedule pending the settlement of this problem. Schedule attached.

OLD BUSINESS

Guidelines for UMECRA Banquets: Wes Elford moved to accept this proposal, which had been presented at the previous board meeting. Monna seconded. Motion carried

1. Location is to be in as close proximity as possible to Interstate Highways 90/94 located between Wisconsin Dells, WI and Rockford IL.
2. Bids are to be given to the Board at the board meeting prior to the general meeting/banquet the year prior to the awarded bid (i.e. 1998 bid for 1999). The board is to decide who will win the bid and the winning location will be presented at the end of the general meeting.
3. The responsibility of the person handling the banquet will involve the following:
 - a. Booking of the hotel including the rooms, meals, banquet halls.
 - a. Cost factors: room cost, best possible rate for membership
 - b. Meal costs: usually buffet style

AERC - Louise reported. See minutes of morning board meeting. A petition to rescind the AERC

AERC International - Art Priesz reported as head of the Central zone selection committee for the Pan American Championship which will be held in Manitoba on August 7. Horses may be nominated up until Feb. 15. He also reported on the World championship ride in Dubai in December.

Trails - Art reported that UMECRA has donated \$100 to the Mathiesen Volunteer Horsemen group (site of the Rock River ride) and \$100 to the Forestville State Forest (site of the Southeast Minnesota Ride) in both cases the funds are to be used for trail improvement.

Video - Monna Radtke reported that \$1500 has been allocated to produce a video to be used for promoting UMECRA. She has contacted producers and videographers. Art Priesz will work with Monna in regards to some other ideas.

Promotion - Mary announced that John Sturm has been appointed chairman of a committee for promotion. Michelle Hambel, Kathy Schauer, Linda Hartman, Louise Riedel, Joe Mattingley and Mike O'Mara are committee members. Louise reported on some of John's suggestions. BOARD MEETING NOVEMBER 20, 1999

The Board met in Dubuque IA on November 20 at 1:00 pm. Present were Mary Mott, Louise Riedel, Wayne Gastfield, Art Priesz, R.A. Beecher, Rick Nelson, Monna Radtke, Linda Mowrer and rider representatives Connie Gray, Roberta Harms, and Dale Lunde

The secretary/treasurer reported that a review showed that receipts from rides were up about \$500 over last year. The balance on hand is approximately \$11,000.

OLD BUSINESS

Newsletter- In January 1997 the following motion was passed. "The executive committee. . .will nominate a proposed volunteer NL editor for a 2-year term. . ." The following was added Dec 5 1998 "That we canvass possible candidates to be decided at the January Board meeting."

Mike and June have agreed to continue to act as NL editors. They were commended for having done a fine job.

Veterinarian list. Mike Thomas had been appointed to compile a booklet listing available ride veterinarians. Only three responses had been received.

Awards. The committee was commended for their choices and the information sent out to the winners.

Video. Monna R. reported that a video dealing with beginning distance riding will be filmed at the SE Minnesota ride.

Response to Protest - a communication had been received from Char Richards relative to a letter of reprimand she had received concerning the outcome of the White River protest. Since the letter she objected to is a private communication and will not be published, it was the consensus that no action was deemed necessary.

NEW BUSINESS

Roberta H. moved that the following endurance rule change be made: *that a two-minute penalty (rather than the present 10 minutes) be assessed for calling for a vet check too soon.* Louise R. seconded. Motion carried 5 - 2. *This will be presented to the general meeting for a vote.*

Roberta H. moved that the heart rate parameter be changed to 64 bpm. Wayne G. seconded. Motion failed unanimously.

Roberta H. moved that *on competitive rides of 50 miles horses may not travel more than 20 miles without a vet check.* Rick N. seconded. Bob B. proposed a friendly amendment to change to *15 miles.* Rick N. seconded. Roberta H. accepted the friendly amendment. Motion carried unanimously. *This will be presented to the general meeting for a vote.*

Rick N. moved to *change rule II B 4.b to read "All juniors under the age of 16 as of the beginning of the UMECRA ride season must be accompanied by a sponsor. . ."* Wayne G. seconded. The junior rules shall also be applied to limited distance. Motion carried unanimously. *This will be presented to the general meeting for a vote.*

A letter from Elinore Tonsor was presented wherein it was proposed that it would be necessary to compete in more than one state if a member intends to be eligible for year end awards. Bob B. moved to accept the proposal. Monna R. seconded. Art P. proposed a friendly amendment to delete the motion and instead to pick four rides - one in each major state - which would count for 1.5 points. Motion failed 6 - 0 with one abstention.

Mary M. moved that we add a 12-mile Novice division for year end awards. After discussion the motion was withdrawn.

The question was raised as to whether we should initiate a policy of an attendance requirement for board members. No action was taken.

Monna R. moved that *no lunging of horses be allowed at vet checks on competitive rides.* (to be added to Rule 7) and *Amend the score sheet to say manners/hazing.* Rick N. seconded. Motion carried unanimously. *This will be presented to the general meeting for a vote.*

Monna R. suggested that in light of the fact that many ride managers have a great surplus of some supplies, they be polled to see what is needed for the upcoming season. With the money thus saved turn signs will be included in the box of supplies. Monna will contact Kris Kocourek about producing these signs. A notice to ride managers will be included in the December Newsletter.

Linda M. brought up the problem of loose dogs at rides. It was the consensus this is up to ride managers and they may initiate fines, penalties, or any other appropriate remedies.

R. Nelson announced that he had received a letter from IAHA stating that they will give an award to the top scoring competitive purebred and part Arabians who compete in recognized trail ride organizations. UMECRA is recognized.

A request has been received from Jan Halvorson for funds to be donated from the Trails Fund for the Sand Dunes State Park. Another request had been received from Ken carpenter for the Glacier Drumlin trail in Wisconsin. Art P. moved *that we donate \$200 to Sand Dunes and \$100 to Glacial Drumlin.* Rick N.. seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

The question was asked about UMECRA's support of state horse fairs. It has been the policy to donate \$250 to each state fair. The consensus of the board was to continue this policy.

Art P. moved, Monna R. seconded that competitive spot checks be limited to 5 minutes. Motion failed 4 - 2.

Louise R. reported that at the recent AERC midyear meeting a rule was passed that any equine not meeting pulse criteria within 30 minutes of arrival at a veterinary check point will be disqualified. (UMECRA's rule states 20 minutes.) Louise moved that we adhere to the AERC rule, Rick N. seconded. As point of order Art stated that we only need to announce this change at the annual meeting.

Louise R. also announced that according to AERC a best condition award must be available for Limited Distance.

The 1999 tentative ride schedule was presented. Wayne G. moved *to accept the schedule as tentative.* Linda M. seconded. Motion carried. The schedule will be finalized at the general meeting.

Linda M. moved to adjourn.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
JANUARY 15, 2000
Wisconsin Dells, WI

The meeting was called to order by President Mary Mott at 7:00 a.m. Also present were Dianne Kuhn, Art Priesz, Linda Mowrer, Wes Elford, Wayne Gastfield, Ray Gehrig, Rick Nelson, Ramona Radtke, Louise Riedel; Rider Representatives Dale Lunde, Maxine Bernsdorf, Roberta Harms, Connie Gray; and Newsletter Editors Mike Bernsdorf and June Scheunemann.

There being no corrections or additions the minutes of the previous board meeting were approved as circulated in the Newsletter. The financial report was distributed. Louise pointed out that ride entries and memberships were both up. The balance in the General fund is \$6,465. The ICF fund balance showed a balance of \$1,835, with \$3,993 having been distributed to riders at the Pan American Championship. Proceeds of the auction are to be distributed as follows: 75% to the ICF fund, the balance to be divided between the Trails/ Contingency Fund and the Scholarship fund. The balance in the Trails/Contingency Fund is \$2343. Since only funds over \$2500 may be used for trails, there is not money now available for this purpose. Art moved to *accept the financial report*. Monna seconded. Motion carried.

Art moved, Linda seconded to take \$1000 from the general fund to be deposited to the Trails/Contingency fund. Motion carried 9-1.

Mike and June have agreed to continue to edit the Newsletter.

There have been seven requests for new rides: Ft. Howes in Montana, Oak Leaf Run in Michigan, Memorial for Colic in Minnesota, Long X in North Dakota, Midyear at Mathiesen in Illinois, and Warm Up and Cool Down preceding and following the Shore to Shore rides. Art moved, Wayne seconded *to accept the proposed ride schedule*. Carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS:

A motion was passed at the November board meeting concerning the prohibiting of lunging and penalty for hazing. Art moved, Dale seconded *to bring these two issues to the general meeting as separate issues*. Motion carried 9 - 1.

NEW BUSINESS

A proposal had been received to bring to the general meeting a motion to allow any mileage completed by a horse before being pulled to be counted toward lifetime mileage. Failed for lack of a motion.

Mike Bernsdorf proposed that 100 mile rides not be scheduled closer than 300 miles apart on the same weekend, that rides be given preference based on the age of the ride, that new rides be given preference based on the date of the request for sanctioning, that dates be determined by October, and that ride dates be scheduled two years in advance. Art moved that ride managers be required to submit proposed two year scheduling by November 1 of the current year. Dianne seconded. The motion was defeated 5 - 3.

Dianne that no crewing be allowed on competitive rides except for juniors with a declared sponsor. Art seconded. Motion defeated 6 - 3.

Rick Nelson and Mike Thomas will host the convention in 2001 at Rockford. Dianne offered to be chairman in 2002. Meeting adjourned.

GENERAL MEETING

The meeting was called to order at 1:00 p.m. Sixty four responded to roll call and are eligible to vote. The minutes of the last general meeting were approved as circulated. The 1999 financial report was approved as distributed (see preceding minutes of Board meeting for details.)

Louise announce that the International Arabian Horse Association is now offering an award to high point competitive horses from ride organizations other than NATRC. JoAnne will receive the purebred award and candy Barbo the partbred award.

Dianne moved to *adopt the tentative ride schedule*. Rick seconded. Mike Thomas objected on the grounds that there were more than 3 rides on the second weekend of August. A search of the rules revealed that "the Board will attempt

to limit the rules to three per weekend." Motion carried.

Art moved, Monna seconded that on endurance rides there will be a 2-minute penalty rather than the current 10 minute penalty for calling for a check too soon. Motion defeated.

Ray moved that on a competitive ride of 25 miles or more a horse may not travel more than approximately 15 miles without a vet check. Motion defeated.

Regarding rule II B 4 b, Art moved, Dianne seconded that *juniors under the age of 16 as of the beginning of the UMECRA ride season shall be accompanied by a sponsor. EXCEPTION: IF they are between 13 and 16 and it can be validated by the UMECRA secretary that they have completed at least 500 competitive miles. They must have the approval of their parents.* Motion carried.

Monna moved, Art seconded that lunging of horses not be allowed at vet checks on competitive rides. Motion defeated.

Art moved, Rick seconded that a section shall be added on the competitive score sheet for deduction of up to 10 points for hazing a horse at vet checks. Motion defeated.

The following rider representatives were installed: Dale Lunde, Roberta Harms, Lori Windows, Bonnie Mielke.

Elinore requested that a financial account be received concerning the Scholarship Fund which is under the control of the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin. Ray will contact them and report via the Newsletter.

The next order of business was election of officers

Louise nominated Mary Mott. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Wayne nominated Rick Nelson. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Linda nominated Louise Riedel for secretary-treasurer. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Monna nominated Elinore Tonsor for regional director from Wisconsin. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Art nominated Dianne Kuhn for regional director from Minnesota. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Art Art nominated Dale Lunde. Louise nominated JoAnne Gernant. Sam nominated Art Priesz, who declined. Ray nominated Roberta Harms. Mike nominated Tony Troyer. Dianne moved the nominations cease. Dale was elected.

JoAnne nominated Wes Elford for veterinary representative. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Mary announced that the UMECRA scholarships have been awarded to Aryon Bosman, Becky Radtke, Olivia Rudolphi and Vanessa Reichert. She thanked Ray Gehrig for his and Audrey's donation to open the scholarship fund.

The meeting adjourned at 3:30.

Mary announced that in the case of a reprimand, the offending party had been notified privately by mail according to Rule I B 7 and had not responded. No further action will be taken. In the case of a protest filed against the Sisu Sisu ride, where the results were altered several days post ride, the protest was upheld.

Lori Windows reported on plans for the Annual Meeting to be held at the Clock Tower Inn in Rockford IL on January 12,13,14. There will be a welcome party Friday night, mostly funded by ABC. Saturday there will be a Board meeting at 7 am, Speaker - 9-11 am, dinner 6 - 7:30 pm, dance 9 - 12 pm. Complete details to be printed in the Newsletter. Another private donation has been offered to defray convention expenses. Elinore announced that there will not be a silent auction this year, but there will be a small raffle in support of the Central Time Zone for the 2001 Pan American ride

LIMITED DISTANCE. Dianne moved that weight divisions be added to Limited Distance rides. Dale seconded. Motion defeated.

Linda moved that, to be in compliance with AERC, there shall be a junior division. Wayne seconded. Motion carried.

Dale moved, Linda seconded that participation in Limited Distance rides does not disqualify a rider from participating as a rookie in competitive or endurance divisions.

It was suggested to make Limited Distance score cards a different color from endurance, blue preferred. This will be done.

COMPETITIVE RIDE CHANGES

*** Dianne moved to present to the general meeting that all holds on competitive rides be a minimum of 40 minutes. Bonne seconded. Motion carried

***Bob moved to present to the general meeting that no horse with a grade 2 or worse lameness may start a competitive ride. Rick seconded. Motion carried. This notation will be added to the rules and to the score sheet.

***Dianne moved to present to the general meeting that the pre-ride lameness score cannot be deducted from the lameness score at the end of the ride. Rick seconded. Motion carried. In order to implement this motion the sheet will be revised and will be presented at the annual meeting.

Dianne moved, Linda seconded to decrease the respiration penalty by one point per increment. Motion defeated.

A letter was read from Jan Worthington concerning inconsistencies in veterinary judging. Discussion followed as to methods of implementing veterinary education to improve consistency of judging.

Elinore moved that any ride whose veterinarian does not send in a signed statement that he has read the vet book will be subject to sanctions by the Board as set out in the section on protests (I F). Rick seconded. Motion carried. The Ride Managers/ Veterinarian handbooks will be sent out separately from the boxes of ride supplies.

There being no nominations for rider representative, the incumbents agreed to continue for 2001.

Dianne moved that we make the value of year end awards consistent in all division. Bonnie seconded. Motion carried. Wayne moved that the ranking of champion and reserve be noted on the appropriate awards. Bob seconded. Motion carried.

Roberta moved to present to the general meeting that on a competitive ride a horse should not go more than 20 miles without a scheduled vet stop. Bob seconded. Motion carried.

* Bob moved to present to the general meeting that ^{rider} ~~ride~~ representatives be granted a vote at the Board meetings. Dianne seconded. Motion carried. This may necessitate a by-law change.

Dianne reminded us that plans need to be made for scheduling the 2003 convention. The 2002 meeting will be at Wisconsin Dells.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING
JANUARY 13, 2001
CLOCK TOWER INN, ROCKFORD ILL.

The UMECRA Board of Directors met at 7:10 a.m. at the Clock Tower Inn in Rockford IL. Present were Mary Mott, Rick Nelson, Louise Riedel, Dianne Kuhn, Dale Lunde, Wayne Gastfield, Bob Beecher, Elinore Tonsor, Linda Mowrer, Ray Gehrig and Rider Representatives Roberta Harms, Bonnie Mielke, and Lori Windows. Bob moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as published in the Newsletter. Dale seconded. Motion carried.

The financial report was distributed showing a balance in the General Fund of \$8,301.68; in the Trails/Contingency Fund of \$4,055.62; and the ICF Fund of \$4,194.27. A question was raised as to the income shown as \$1,396.75 in the Trails/Contingency Fund, as originating from the auction. Wayne moved, Bob seconded to accept the financial statement with the stipulation that the income figure in the Trails Contingency Fund be corrected. Motion carried. (It was subsequently determined that \$1000 of this amount had been transferred from the general fund and was incorrectly labelled as having come from the auction)

Ray announced that the director of the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin, which administers the scholarship fund, would be in attendance at the general meeting and would answer questions concerning it.

Mary announced that Jill Feller has offered to manage the 2003 banquet in Madison on Jan 11, 12, 13 or 18, 19, 20.

OLD BUSINESS:

Elinore referred to copies of rules for a proposed driving division and turned the floor over to Theresa Burns-Metcalf for explanation. Theresa and Elinore will sponsor the awards for this division the first year. Elinore moved to present to the general membership a motion that we sanction a division for distance driving. Bob seconded. Motion carried.

In regard to a motion passed at the November Board meeting concerning equalizing the value of all awards, Louise moved that the matter be re-opened. Elinore seconded. Motion carried. Elinore moved to form a committee to examine the award system and report to the president and the Board by April 30. Rick seconded. Motion carried. The president appointed the following committee: JoAnne Gernant, Dianne Kuhn, Elinore Tonsor, Bonnie Mielke.

A question has arisen about a person holding two positions on the Board as a result of a rider representative being elected to the position of Director at Large, thus in essence leaving one position as rider representative open. The question was also asked as to whether a ride manager who is also a member of the board is entitled to appoint another person in his stead to represent his ride. No action was taken. It was suggested to contact Art Priesz to have the matter clarified.

A request had been received for money from the Trails Fund to assist in the development of trails in the Dane County Park. No action was taken--the matter will be investigated. Another request had been received from JoAnne Gernant for \$175 to attend a trails symposium in Kentucky, with a report being furnished to the membership. Dianne moved to grant this request. Bob seconded. The vote resulted in a tie. The president voted in favor. Motion carried.

Mike and June were asked to fill another two year term as Newsletter Editors. They agreed to continue.

A revised version of the competitive scoring sheet was distributed to implement a decision at the November Board meeting to present this issue at the general meeting.

Louise circulated a list of new AERC rules which may be in conflict with UMECRA rules.

Ray moved that UMECRA Rule IIIA be changed to read "Limited Distance rides may be offered but must be sanctioned and held in conjunction with a UMECRA sanctioned ride and must be advertised as such." Bob proposed a friendly amendment to add "If a ride wishes to seek AERC sanctioning it must follow AERC Rule L1." Motion carried.

UMECRA Rule B4 which states "A best condition award must be available" will be changed to agree with AERC Rule L.9.1, which states "An award may be given for the horse judged to be in the Best Condition. The award does not have to be given."

Wayne moved that ride results shall not be officially published until the ride fees are received. Linda seconded. Motion carried.

Dianne moved that the statement in Rule II A 1 which reads "a person can compete as a novice only on his or her first or second ride" be deleted. Bob seconded. Motion carried.

Rick moved to adjourn. Dale seconded.

GENERAL MEETING
JANUARY 13, 2001
CLOCK TOWER INN, ROCKFORD ILL

The meeting was called to order at 1:10 p.m. by President Mary Mott. Reports were given on AERC International by Chuck Gray; on AERC by Louise Riedel and on Trails by JoAnne Gernant. Ray Gehrig, who with Audrey, founded the UMECRA Scholarship Fund, introduced Pete Wanner, Director of the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin, which administers this fund. She explained the administration of the fund and announced that a total of \$78,793 has been received as gifts, \$8,400 had been awarded in scholarships, the present balance is \$89,000, and the administration fee is 1.5%. She then awarded scholarships totalling \$3900 to Vanessa Reichert, Olivia Rudolphi, Stefanie Harston, Christine Smaglick and Rebecca Radtke.

Roll call resulted in 74 being entitled to vote.

Louise moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as printed in the Newsletter. Wes seconded. Motion carried. The treasurer's report was presented. Louise explained the discrepancy which had been discovered at the morning Board meeting--refer to those minutes. Dale Lunde moved to accept the report. JoAnne Gernant seconded. Motion carried.

The following rider representatives were installed: Dale Lunde, Bonnie Mielke, Roberta Harms, Lori Windows.

The president asked that discussion be limited to 15 minutes per issue.

Tony Troyer moved, Bob Beecher seconded to approve the tentative ride schedule. Motion carried.

The president reported on actions taken at the morning Board meeting. (See those minutes above)

NEW BUSINESS

Linda Mowrer moved, Dianne Kuhn seconded that **holds on competitive rides must be a minimum of 40 minutes.** Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher explained the proposed revision of the competitive score sheets which states that "lame horses shall not start." He moved, Elinore seconded that this change be accepted. Motion carried. Further discussion ensued and the motion was reopened. Ray moved that **"Horses grade 2 or worse shall not start."** Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved to accept the revised score sheet with the change noted above (**"Lame Horses shall not start" to "Horses grade 2 or worse shall not start."**) Motion seconded and carried.

Louise explained that instead of the veterinarian manual being included in the box of ride supplies, which might not be opened till immediately pre-ride, it will be sent under separate cover to the ride manager to be forwarded to the veterinarian in a timely fashion. The veterinarian's signed statement that he or she has read the manual is mandatory, and steps may be taken to remove sanctioning if the statement is not received. She also requested ride managers to notify her which forms they did not need.

Roberta Harms moved, Peggy Brush moved that **"at competitive rides horses may not travel more than 20 miles without a scheduled vet stop."** Motion carried.

Wayne Gastfield moved, Connie Gray seconded to **'add a competitive driving division.'** June proposed a friendly amendment to add **'for a five-year probationary period, to be re-evaluated at that time. Top five awards shall be offered.'** Motion as amended carried. Elinore Tonsor will furnish awards the first year.

Ray Gehrig moved, Rae Birr seconded that **"Rider representatives shall have a vote at Board meetings. This will require a by-law change."** Motion carried.

ELECTION OF OFFICER

JoAnne Gernant nominated Mary Mott for president. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Wayne Gastfield nominated Rick Nelson for vice-president. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Linda Mowrer nominated Louise Riedel for secretary-treasurer. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Rick Nelson nominated Linda Mowrer for regional director from Illinois. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Bruce Birr nominated Wayne Gastfield for regional director from Michigan. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

For Director at large, Bonnie Mielke nominated Bob Beecher. JoAnne Gernant nominated Tony Troyer. A ballot resulted in the election of Bob Beecher.

Tony Troyer nominated Wes Elford as Veterinary representative. There being no further nominations, the nominations were closed and a unanimous ballot was cast.

Monna Radtke moved that the meeting be adjourned.

BOARD MEETING

November 3, 2001

The UMECRA Board of Directors met at noon, November 3, in Dubuque, Iowa. Present were Mary Mott, Lori Windows, Linda Mowrer, Wes Elford, Dale Lunde, Elinore Tonsor, Wayne Gastfield, Bonnie Mielke, Roberta Harms, Rick Nelson, Louise Riedel and June Scheunemann, Newsletter editor.

Louise reported a balance of \$12,551.07 in the checking account. Rick moved, Wayne seconded to accept the treasurer's report. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS

Mary reported on a protest, which was not upheld. It concerned the case of a competitive ride where pre-ride points were entered on the score sheet and deducted at the end. It also dealt with the breaking of a tie by deducting .5 point.

Mary will make a statement at the general meeting to clarify the issue of tie breaking. (According to UMECRA Rule E.3 ties shall not be broken)

Regarding the Score Sheet--Lori stated she thought it was successful when used as it was designed (no pre-ride deductions entered for lameness) Discussion followed as to the use of the score sheet especially regarding pre-ride deductions for lameness/way of going. Wes moved that pre-ride lameness and fatigue observations/scores will be deducted from post-ride scores. Elinore seconded. Motion carried 6 - 4 with abstention. Wes will develop a replacement score sheet to be presented to the Board before the general meeting.

Louise stated that giving the rider representatives the right to vote at Board meetings necessitates a By-law change. She will research the rules and present a proposal at the next meeting.

NEW BUSINESS

Dale moved to present to the general meeting a proposed rule that UMECRA break ties by averaging the points in ENDURANCE rides for horses that tie. Wes seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Elinore requested clarification concerning the requirement that a veterinarian be on the grounds. There is no rule covering this.

Wes moved to form a Protest Committee, consisting of up to 5 members the chairman to be the UMECRA vice president. Dale seconded. Carried unanimously Suggested procedures: The committee shall include the director from that area, a ride manager, a rider representative and the veterinary representative. The committee will be appointed at the annual meeting. This committee will hear all protests and will make a ruling within a month. The chairman will obtain all pertinent information from the protestor, the protestee, the ride manager, veterinarian and director from that area, The committee's decision will be brought back to the Board with all relevant material. The Board will decide whether the protest is upheld or denied.

Elinore reported that the internet contains obsolete material that should be deleted. The President will contact Peggy Brush relevant to removing this material. She feels that the website should include the Board of Directors, also the name of a contact person from UMECRA. June will contact Peggy regarding this.

Elinore distributed projected schedules of ride dates for the next five years.

Elinore moved that General Rule 1e be changed to limit the number of rides to two per weekend (exception: Established 3-ride weekends) Motion failed 4 - 6.

Lori moved that the following be added to the Ride Manager's Handbook as C 1 d under General Suggestions: on waterless trails water should be made available at about 6 miles on a 12-mile loop .

Roberta moved that the following be added to the Ride Manager's Handbook as C 1 e under General Suggestions: if weather conditions warrant it, on competitive rides an extra bucket should be allowed for sponging. Dale seconded. Motion carried 8-2.

Elinore moved to establish a formula to determine the amount spent on top ten year-end awards as follows: \$2.50 per UMECRA member ride entry from the preceding year. Bonnie seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Rick moved to allocate 50% of the above amount for Rookie and Restricted mileage awards. Lori seconded. Motion carried.

Louise announced that as a result of an AERC ruling last year there will be no more discounts in the nomination fees for re-sanctioned rides. All rides, whether new or old, will pay the same fee.

Wes moved to establish a UMECRA Hall of Fame award with money from the general fund not to exceed \$500. Roberta seconded. Motion passed unanimously. Elinore volunteered to research a source for the award.

DRAW will contribute 50% of the cost of the upcoming convention reception, the remainder to come from UMECRA or one of the other affiliated organizations. Tentatively AHDRA will take care of it for this convention.

Dale moved that UMECRA switch to the AERC weight divisions. Motion died for lack of a second.

Elinore questioned the fact that the scholarship fund states that the 25 qualifying rides must be ridden as a junior, which eliminates most adults from eligibility.

Rick moved to adjourn. Motion carried.

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

JANUARY 26, 2002

WISCONSIN DELLS, WISCONSIN

The UMECRA Board of Directors met at 7:00 a.m. at the Howard Johnson Inn, Wisconsin Dells. Present were Mary Mott, Rick Nelson, Louise Riedel, Dianne Kuhn, Dale Lunde, Wayne Gastfield, Bob Beecher, Wes Elford, Elinore Tonsor, Linda Mowrer, Roberta Harms, Bonnie Mielke and Lori Windows.

Louise presented the 2001 financial report showing a balance in the General Fund of \$7,165.25; in the Trails Fund of \$3,642.63 and the ICF Fund closed. (She explained that this fund was closed due to not a sufficient balance remaining, \$3200 having been disbursed to the Pan American Ride participants.) She stated that total income was off from the previous year, especially in the area of membership. Ride income was off approximately 18% for competitive rides and 19% for endurance rides. Rick moved to accept the finance report. Bob seconded. Motion carried.

The 2002 schedule was presented. Louise explained the difficulty in maintaining past years' schedules. It was suggested that if a ride is unable to host the event the current year they can pay the sanctioning fee to reserve their date. Rick moved that we allow a ride to hold their date by paying their fee for one year. Bob seconded. Carried unanimously. Bob moved to accept the ride schedule. Wayne seconded. Motion carried.

Rick moved, Roberta seconded to petition the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin to remove the criteria of "youth" from the scholarship requirements. (per Schedule B, dated 8/20/96). Motion carried 12 - 1. Subsequent investigation revealed that a revision of "Schedule B" dated 10/13/98 eliminated the word "youth" from the criteria, and the statement was made that "Non-traditional students, not only those matriculating directly from high school through college are eligible to apply." The motion therefore is void.

Wes presented a revised version of the competitive score sheet. It was suggested to add a space for "Drive." Bob moved to include the statement "Lame horses shall not start." Dale seconded. Motion carried unanimously. Bob moved that post ride observations be compared to pre-ride observations. Rick seconded. Motion carried unanimously.

Dianne moved to present to the general meeting a change in the by-laws requiring a 2/3 majority. Add the following paragraph: "Each year four rider representatives will be elected by the membership for one-year terms. They will have voting rights and any other privileges pertaining to Board membership." Roberta seconded. Motion carried.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS

NEW BUSINESS: Dianne moved that rider representatives be nominated by regions for 2-year alternating terms. Bob seconded. Motion defeated 8-3 with one abstention.

A count of ballots disclosed the following newly elected rider representatives: Roberta Harms, Lori Windows, Bonnie Mielke, and Dale Lunde.

Mary announced that Jill Feller had offered to chair the convention for 2003 on January 10, 11, 12 at the Holiday Inn East in Madison. Susan Garlinghouse will be the speaker. Elinore offered to investigate the possibilities of the Casino at Wisconsin Dells for 2004, and Dianne offered for 2005. The meeting adjourned.

GENERAL MEETING

JANUARY 26, 2002

HOWARD JOHNSON INN, WISCONSIN DELLS, WISCONSIN

The meeting was called to order by President Mary Mott at 1:00 p.m. Roll call resulted in 72 ride votes plus 13 Board members. The President welcomed back the four previous rider representatives based on votes counted this morning: Roberta Harms, Lori Windows, Bonnie Mielke, and Dale Lunde.

Peggy Brush moved, Mikki Erdman seconded to approve the minutes of the previous meeting as printed in the Newsletter. Motion carried. The treasurer's report was presented. Louise discussed the decline in income as compared with 2000. (See report of Board Meeting) Chuck Gray moved to accept the report. Tony Troyer seconded. Motion carried.

Art Priesz reported on AERC International regarding the selection process for the World Championship ride in Spain in September. The two closest selection trial rides are Ft. Howes, Montana; and Grand Island, Michigan. Materials for nomination must be submitted by March 15.

Louise reported on AERC concerning the national convention the first of March. Board meetings will take place on Thursday and Sunday and general meetings and other activities on Friday and Saturday. Ride managers are requested to have their sanctioning forms in to Louise 120 days pre-ride--she is at least expected to have the forms to the AERC 90 days pre-ride. If it is a 2-day event 2 sanctioning forms must be filled out.

Ed Hauser explained the situation in Minnesota where the budget system has resulted in no rides being allowed before May 31 and after September 31 affecting the rides at the St. Croix park. Ed has been attempting to work with this park, but with no success. Any results must be achieved through the legislature.

June Schuenemann moved, JoAnne Gernant seconded to accept the proposed schedule with changes. Motion carried.
The President reviewed actions taken at the morning's Board meeting.

1. Rick moved that we allow a ride to hold their date by paying their fee for one year. Bob seconded. Carried unanimously.

2. Protest procedure: A protest person, to be the vice president of UMECRA, will form his own committee. He will analyze the situation at his discretion and come to a conclusion.

3. Rick moved, Roberta seconded to petition the Community Foundation of Southern Wisconsin to remove the criteria of "youth" from the scholarship requirements. (per Schedule B, dated 8/20/96) Motion carried. Subsequent investigation revealed that a revision of "Schedule B" dated 10/13/98 eliminated the word "youth" from the criteria, and the statement was made that "Non-traditional students, not only those matriculating directly from high school through college are eligible to apply." The motion therefore is void.

NEW BUSINESS: The proposed new competitive score sheet was circulated. Wes Elford, who along with Chuck Melcher and Dale Lunde worked on it, explained it. A statement will be added beneath the drawing of the horse to the effect that "horses grade 2 or worse shall not start." A statement will also be added to the effect that "post-ride observations are compared to pre-ride observations." Dianne Kuhn moved, Chuck seconded to accept the new form. Motion carried.

Dale Lunde proposed that we change our system of averaging endurance ride ties to the system used by AERC whereby the scores of those tying are added and divided by the number of riders tying. Katie Ruckel moved to accept this concept. Tony Troyer seconded. Motion carried.

BY-LAW CHANGES REQUIRING 2/3 MAJORITY OF VOTERS: Jean Miller moved to "Add the following paragraph 'Article III, Section I. Each year four rider representatives will be elected by the membership for one-year terms. They will have voting rights and any other privileges pertaining to Board membership.'" Sheryl Levin seconded. Motion carried.

Hugo Hartman moved to change Article I Section I to read "The Registered office of the Corporation shall be c/o Arthur W. Priesz, Jr., Attorney at Law, 135 Eighth Avenue, in the City of Granite Falls, County of Yellow Medicine, State of Minnesota, and the Corporation shall have others at such places as the Board of Directors may from time to time determine." Kim seconded. Motion carried.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS.

Joanne nominated Mary Mott for President. Joanne moved to close nominations, June seconded. Elected unanimously. Peggy Brush nominated Mike Bernsdorf for Vice President. Kim seconded. Wayne Gastfield nominated Rick Nelson for Vice President. Chuck Gray seconded. Tony moved to close nominations. Rick was elected.

While ballots were being counted Mary referred to a letter received by all the Board members requesting that voting privileges be granted to the general membership. She explained that UMECRA was founded as a ride manager's organization; therefore ride managers or persons who represent the rides as delegates have the vote, in addition to the four elected ride representatives. If the membership feels this system should be changed to a general vote the rider reps should be contacted.

Regarding the Hall of Fame Award which was established last year, anyone who has a candidate in mind for this honor should write a letter of nomination to the Board. Such letter must be sent before October 1.

Mary offered the name of Louise Riedel for Secretary/Treasurer by acclamation. Joe Mattingley seconded. Hugo Hartman moved to close. Motion carried.

Dale Lunde nominated Dianne Kuhn for Minnesota representative. Sam moved to close nominations. Darlene seconded. Motion unanimous for Dianne.

Monna Radtke nominated Elinore Tonsor for Wisconsin Representative. Jill Feller nominated Dawn Haas for Wisconsin Representative. June moved to close nominations. Peggy seconded. Dawn Haas was elected.

Jill Feller will be chairman of the 2003 convention at the Holiday Inn East, Madison WI, on Jan 10, 11, 12. Susan Garlinghouse will be the speaker. Elinore is investigating the Casino at Wisconsin Dells for 2004 and Dianne has offered for 2005.

Rick Nelson nominated Joyce Mocilan for Director at Large. Larry Lunde nominated Darlene Molitor. Dianne nominated Elinore Tonsor. June moved and Bonnie seconded to close nominations. Motion carried. Joyce Mocilan was elected.

Peggy Brush nominated Wes Elford for veterinary representative. Bob Beecher moved to close nominations. Sheryl Levin seconded. Unanimous.

BOARD MEETING November 16, 2002

The UMECRA Board of Directors met at the home of Louise Riedel in Dubuque, IA. Present were Mary Mott, Rick Nelson, Bob Beecher, Wes Elford, Dianne Kuhn, Dawn Haas, Linda Mowrer, Wayne Gastfield, Joyce Mocilan, Roberta Harms, Dale Lunde, Bonnie Mielke, Lori Windows, Louise Riedel, and Newsletter editors, Mike Bernsdorf and June Sheunemann.

Mary called the meeting to order at 12:25. The first item of business was the Financial Report, which showed a balance as of Nov. 1 2002 of \$10,262.10, compared to \$12,551.07 in 2001. Ride fees were up to \$4991.00 in 2002 from \$4569 in 2001; and membership fees were up to \$7158.00 in 2002 from \$6459.00 in 2001. In regard to awards, at last year's November Board meeting a motion was carried that the amount allocated for Top Ten awards would be \$2.50 per UMECRA RIDE ENTRIES. Other awards (Restricted mileage, rookie) would be budgeted at half Top Ten. (This year there will be 70 top ten awards and 38 other awards). It was decided to allocate \$70 per top ten award and \$35 per each other award.

The tentative schedule was reviewed. Louise will call the managers whose rides are not listed for 2003. Wayne stated that Bonnie Tobias was proposing to run the Oak Leak Run at night. It was the consensus that this would be unsafe. Rick offered to talk to Bonnie.

An attempt was made to trace the present whereabouts of the Pit Crew trophy. It was decided Brad Brush will be contacted. Requests for nominations have appeared in the Newsletter, and nominations will be sent to Jill Feller.

The wording in the Newsletter describing the intent of the Riders Choice award has been questioned. A correction is being made. Also nominations for this award should be sent to Elinore Tonsor.

There being no new nominations for Rider Representatives, Rick moved, Bob seconded to recommend that the representatives' positions be filled as at present: Roberta, Bonnie, Lori, Dale. Motion carried.

A letter was circulated from Jill Feller requesting that a convention fund be established. Dianne moved that we establish such a fund. Wes seconded. Motion defeated.

Dianne displayed two jackets as possibilities for Top Ten awards. They are available through Ed Barbo. One has the UMECRA embroidered logo on the back and identification of the award on the front. The Board preferred the latter. Bob moved that Louise will send out all riders' 2002 records and a sheet indicating which award the top ten riders choose (the jacket, or certificates from Elinore or State Line). They must be returned with size and preferences by December 1

The issue of dropping maximum pulse requirements for endurance from 68 to 64 was discussed. No action was taken.

Wes moved to eliminate the 10 minute mandatory hold on endurance and LD for horses that do not pass their initial pulse and to substitute a two minute hold. Bob seconded. Motion defeated.

Roberta moved that points deducted for interference marks in competitive riding be the same as for the use of boots. Joyce seconded. Motion defeated.

Bob moved that the use of boots be assessed two points per leg. Defeated.

Roberta reported on a letter proposing that it shall be left to the Ride Manager whether Best Condition be offered in Limited Distance. Also to change BC order of placing to Best Condition type scoring. No action.

Roberta pointed out that most of the issues we have discussed should be considered as recommendations and be proposed for final action at the January meeting. This has been the procedure in the past.

The possibility of UMECRA having a booth at the AERC convention was proposed. Lori will investigate.

At the AERC Midyear Board meeting last August it was directed that all AERC rides must have insurance. They do not furnish nor recommend a specific policy now. It was the consensus that UMECRA rides presently have insurance.

Rick moved to adjourn. Dale seconded. Mary was given a round of applause for her years of service as President. Louise Riedel, Secretary

AWARDS

The chairman of the Awards committee is responsible for ordering all the top ten, Rookie, Restricted Mileage, and Limited Disance awards.

The UMECRA Secretary checks with high point senior and junior riders to see what their choice is. UMECRA gives up to \$75 for this award. If the choice costs more than that, the winner makes up the difference.

NOVEMBER BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING MINUTES

November 8, 2003

The UMECRA Board of Directors met at the home of Louise Riedel in Dubuque, Iowa. President Linda Mowrer called the meeting to order. Also present were Darlene Molitor, Louise Riedel, Dawn Haas, Rick Nelson, ayne Gastfield, Joyce Mocilan, Wes Elford, Roberta Harms, Dale Lunde, Junc Scheunemann and Mike Bernsdorf.

The minutes of the January 11, 2003 annual meeting were read. Rick moved, Dale seconded to approve. Carried. The financial report as of November 1, 2003 showed a balance on hand of \$9,898.96. Rick moved, Wayne seconded to accept the finance report. Motion carried. A comparison between 2002 and 2003 showed an appreciable decrease in membership, while other accounts remained approximately the same, with 2002 standing at \$10,262 and 2003 at \$9,898.96. Tabled.

New Business

Pulse parameters. The rule covering pulse parameter of 68 for competitive will be enforced. This will be brought to the meeting. Joyce moved to change pulse to a recommended minimum of 60 for endurance and LD. Rick seconded. Motion carried.

A discussion followed concerning the reasons for the decline in membership. It was suggested that a financial committee be established, to include Wes, Louise, Linda and Joyce.

Roberta addressed the letter from Lori with some riders' concerns, namely: competitive horses failure to meet parameters of 68. The fact that this remains a rule should be brought to convention.

Rick addressed the problem of "buddy" horses especially as it relates to AERC rules, which differ from ours. In his opinion, this issue should be brought to the AERC Board. Rick moved to write a letter to the Rules Committee, AERC. Roberta seconded. Motion carried.

Changing the location of the banquet. Dianne is in charge of next banquet.

Dianne would like to see the format of the 1,000-mile horse awards altered. It will be brought to the attention of the membership. A new supply of 1,000-mile horse awards has just arrived. Moved to bring the issue to the membership, seconded and carried. Dale moved to bring elimination of the rider mileage chevrons to the general meeting. Wes seconded. Motion carried.

Dianne is in charge of major awards consisting of jackets, blankets and certificates for top ten. Minor awards (shirts) for restricted mileage and rookie. Joyce moved, Roberta seconded that amount spent for year-end awards be no more than 75% of the balance on hand. Motion carried.

It was suggested that the boxes of ride supplies be assembled and distributed at convention. Louise will investigate the cost of forms; Joyce will write letters to ride managers asking them to estimate the numbers of forms they will need.

Moved to reduce rookie endurance and rookie competitive awards to one each for 2004. Seconded by Rick. Motion carried.

Louise moved to reduce restricted mileage to five placings per year. Seconded and carried.

The final order of business was consideration of the 2004 schedule.

Owned by Louise Riedel

Tutsyn+ (Tutty) was born on May 15, 1983 in Mr. Vernon, Missouri. On August 6, 1993, Tutty received the *Purebred Legion of Honor Award*. At that time only around 1,600 horses in the United States and Canada qualified for it. On January 8, 1998, Tutty received the *Purebred Legion of Supreme Honor Award*. As of 2004, Tutsyn+ is retired with over 6,000 miles.

Mid-season this year, my horse RCF Blade Runner, began having major back pain and underwent different treatments, none of which were successful. I was without a horse to complete the season. As soon as Louise heard, she immediately volunteered Tutty for me to ride. I took her up on the offer and brought him to *Endure for the Cure* with very little conditioning. Tutty was so happy to be back out on the trails, he completed fifty miles, placing 2nd and 5th. After that, I decided to leave Blade off for the rest of the season and finish the season with Tutty. By the end of the season, Tutty and I completed 470 miles in eight rides. This included *Shore to Shore*, with two *Best of Breeds*, and two *Reserve Champions*. He also placed 1st in the three-day hundred at *Wildcat*. Competing at only eight rides, Tutty received *Reserve Champion* at *UMECRA*, and 3rd in *AHDRA*. More importantly, Tutty helped me to forget about my bad luck earlier in the season, which was hard for me.

Tutty is now retiring at Chapel Hill Farm at the age of twenty, where he is going to teach junior riders all about endurance and competitive riding. Tutty is always very willing to go down the trail with his ears forward and tail "wagging". You will see Tutty around taking juniors and showing them the way down the trail. He will also always be around to take Louise (who is very proud of him this year) down the trail. So please, vote for Tutty for his hard work and willing attitude. This will be a great ending to his career.

Zalmara Din

Owned and Ridden by Candy Barbo

Nominated by Anita Sinnott

Most of us have either read the book or seen the movie "Seabiscuit" and recognize it as a story of inspiration, faith and heart. Seabiscuit achieved success beyond the wildest dreams of those that believed in him. This story of a legendary horse captured each and everyone in a very special and personal way. It certainly made me think of one of UMECRA's own.

So with this in mind, I respectfully nominate another amazing horse, Zalmara Din (Mara), for this year's UMECRA's Horse of the Year Award. Mara, like Seabiscuit, had a very difficult start in life. She came to the Candy and Ed Barbo family as a boarder horse following a series of very unfortunate experiences. Her overall condition was so poor, that Candy insisted that a veterinarian examine her before she would agree to even keep her there. At that point, Mara's survival was in question; she was extremely thin, appeared malnourished and was obviously weak. Following veterinary treatment, guidance and care, Mara began to thrive. Candy's efforts and commitment were soon rewarded with the opportunity to call Mara her own. There was no question that she would now be a member of the ever-growing Barbo horse family. Not only did Mara prove to be an "easy keeper", but a joy to ride as well.

Based on her strong recovery, it was time to consider training for the next summer's events in Canada. Fall, winter and spring strengthening and conditioning paid off. Her performance in this first competition established the base for an amazing record in the sport of endurance riding. In addition to placing in many sweepstakes rides, Mara has been top ten in *MNDRA*, *UMECRA*, *AHDRA* or *AERC* every year since she started. Last year she was *AHDRA's Winner of the Versatility Award* and this year, *Endurance Champion*. She excels in 100 milers with the ability to take care of herself, pace according to conditions and demonstrate enough "attitude and competitiveness to make it fun. Mara has also participated in and successfully completed the last two *Pan American Games*. In 2001, she placed 11th in Vermont and in 2003, she was 17th at Mount Adams, Washington. To top off this year's accomplishments, Mara has been named to the *National Traveling Team* in preparation for possible participation as a *USA Endurance Team member in the World Championship* in Dubai next year.

Mara continues to excel in her role as a true endurance horse; not only does she accept the challenge of the course, but adjusts to extreme changes in her environment and stays "sound". She has completed over 3,500 endurance miles, not to mention competitive rides to "fill in the gaps". She has met each and every challenge with the heart of a real champion. In fact, Mara's strengths go beyond the world of horses; she is also considered trustworthy, extremely gentle and respectful of those that love and care for her.

Seeing Mara today, beautiful and strong, one would find it hard to believe that obstacles she has overcome to reach the status of a "once in a lifetime" dream come true endurance race horse.

Indigo Moon

Owned, Ridden and Nominated by Nancy Wilson

I would like to nominate my horse, Indigo Moon (Blue), for the 2003 Rider's Choice Award. Blue is a 15-year-old registered half Arabian palomino paint. He has overcome a sprained tendon in both front legs and a winter of chronic obstructive pulmonary disease to remain in the year-end awards each of the five years we have competed in *GLDRA* and *UMECRA*.

In the summer of 1996, Blue suffered a moderate middle tendon bow of his right front leg after a dressage training session when a large rock lodged in his right front hoof. After seven months of rehabilitation, Blue resumed dressage training and competed at training level for two years. In 1999, Blue and Diane Marcina received *Silver Certificates in Glass-ED and ADA dressage organizations and won Reserve High Point and Reserve High Percentage in Glass-Ed Year End Awards*.

In the fall of 1998, Blue entered his first competitive trial ride at Hopkins Creek, won first place overall and since then has rarely finished out of the ribbons. After being ridden in deep leaves in the fall of 1999, a moderate tendon bow occurred in his lower left front leg. Following seven months of rehabilitation and lot of counseling and support from Louise Riedel, Blue was again competing in CTR's.

In October of 2002, Blue became febrile and severely dyspneic. After an incomplete response to antibiotics and steroids, he received five months of ventilpulmin. He was moved to a small heated well-ventilated barn where he recovered.

Indigo Moon has received the following year-end awards in *GLDRA*: 200 miles (1999), 500 miles (2001), 1,000 miles (2003), 6th Limited Distance (2000), 4th Limited Distance (2001), 5TH extended Distance (2002) and 3rd Extended Distance (2003). In *UMECRA*, Blue reached 1,000 miles in 2003 and was in the top six in restricted mileage (Lightweight Competitive) in 2001. Blue has received ribbons in two forty-mile competitive trail rides in Petoskey.

Indigo Moon is intelligent, athletic, resilient and fun to ride with his huge trot that approaches 15 miles per hour. For me, Blue is a great horse and has given me the ride of my life!

President, Linda Mowrer called the meeting to order at 1:30 pm.

Linda informed the membership of Louise Riedel's resignation as Secretary-Treasurer and the appointment of Dianne Kuhn as the interim secretary.

Roll Call was taken of voting delegates. There were 72 delegates present.

Doctor Beecher moved to accept the Published Meeting Minutes from the last General Meeting and Dawn Hass seconded. Minutes were approved as published.

Doctor Beecher gave the financial report (report follows). Wes Elford moved to accept the report as read and Karen Suess seconded. Treasurer's Report was approved as read.

Committee Reports:

International Fund

Elinore reported that \$2600 was disbursed to UMECRA members riding in International Competition this year. Those receiving checks were Jan Worthington and Candy Barbo riding for the United States, Bettina Koehn riding for Germany and Myna Cryderman riding for Canada.

AERC

Linda Mowrer reported that AERC is requiring proof of insurance and that they will be charging a fee of \$60/ride day for insurance when you send in your final ride report. Darlene Molitor reported that she spoke with Bob Walsh at Credlman Agency (AERC's carrier) and that each additional insured would cost \$5 each. Also, that they would FAX any information that a camp or park would need directly to the campgrounds. The coverage would be \$1,000,000 per event and \$3,000,000 total. You can reach Mr. Walsh at 888-303-1400 extension 105.

Convention

Elinore Tonsor was given a round of applause for organizing the convention this year.

Old Business

Point of Clarification from the November Board Meeting:

- Competitive Ride rules state that a pulse of 68 is the point for continuation on a Competitive Ride.
- Horses that are not entered in the ride are not allowed at a checkpoint on UMECRA Rides.
UMECRA's rule states: "Official competitors may not be accompanied by horses on the trail or at checks that have not entered or have been pulled from the ride."

New Business

Doctor Beecher made the motion to reduce the Restricted Mileage Awards from Top 6 to Top 5. Rick Nelson seconded. A show of hands defeated the motion.

Doctor Beecher made the motion that the passing pulse criteria cannot be lower than 60. Dawn Hass seconded. Discussion followed. Motion carried.

The following two Board-Appointed positions and responsibilities were announced:

UMECRA Points-Keeper

Joyce Mocilan was appointed for 2004. Her duties are:

- Tabulate rider mileage
- **Ride results are to be submitted to Joyce not more than 15 days following the event or a \$50 fine will be enforced.**
 - Ride points will not be posted until assessed fines are paid.
- Report accumulation of points on a regular basis to the membership
- Tabulate horse mileage for horses nominated to the 1000-mile program.
 - Horses need to be nominated for this program and a \$10 nomination fee is required.
 - Back mileage requires a \$15/year payment

Second Appointment is a Sanctioning Coordinator. The Sanctioning Coordinator for 2004 is Roberta Harms. Roberta is also the AERC Sanctioning Director as of March 1, 2004. Her duties are:

- Complete the UMECRA Calendar of UMECRA Sanctioned Rides.
- Prepare and disburse the Annual UMECRA Ride Book
- See to the preparation and dispersal of ride packets
- Contact person for anyone wishing to add a ride to the calendar
- Responsible for collecting the Sanctioning Fees

Roberta asked that ride flyers be sent to her by February 15.

Ray Gehrig has sent UMECRA a letter stating that he wishes to be excused from the Scholarship Committee Board. The UMECRA Vice President, who currently is Darlene Molitor, will now chair this fund.

Regarding Restrictive Mileage. A motion was made stating that if a Heavyweight Division horse and rider team switches to the Lightweight Division upon reaching the mileage allowed in the HW Division, they will be disqualified from the program for the year because collectively, they have gone over the maximum mileage allowed. However, a horse and rider team may switch between endurance and competitive riding

Wes Elford made the motion that ride managers must be current UMECRA members in good standing. Rick Nelson seconded. Motion carried.

Clarification of a family for membership purposes was made. It shall be one or two adults and dependent children under the age of 18 that live in the same house. This shall be added to the membership form.

The printed Ride Calendar for 2004 was read and discussed. Linda stated that the BarnBurner Ride in South Dakota has also been approved. Their ride date has not yet been clarified. Also, a new ride, Show Me the Money, has been scheduled this year. This is a UMECRA sponsored ride that is being managed by Elinore Tonsor and Romona Radtke. Bonnie Mielke made the motion to approve the ride schedule and Lori Windows seconded. Motion carried.

President, Linda Mowrer, called a meeting of the UMECRA Board to order at 1:10 PM on March 19, 2004 in Dubuque, IA.

Dr. Beecher made a motion to approve the minutes from the January 31 Board Meeting and the January 31 Annual Meeting held in Oconomowoc, WI and Dale Lunde seconded. Motion carried.

A balance of \$6,124.25 was reported in the General Fund. Wayne Gastfield made a motion to approve the treasurer's report and Rick Nelson seconded. Motion carried.

Roberta Harms gave a short summarization on the construction of the 2004 Ridebook that was mailed out in mid-March. The Ridebook cost was \$2400.

Dr. Beecher made a motion that the ride sheets would have to be to the Ride Sanctioning Director by February 1. Dianne seconded. The motion carried.

Roberta also addressed concerns about AERC and NATRAC holding their annual meetings in Reno at the same time. She said that each group met separately and she and others attending the meeting verified that they were not merging.

Joyce Mocilan gave a short report on the Mileage Program Progress. Joyce is currently switching the Ride Points Program and the Horse and Rider Mileage documentation to an Access Program. The plan is to put the mileage database online next year so members can look up their horse and rider mileage on our Website.

Elinore Tonsor reported that the County Prison has a graphics shop and does printing for non-profit groups at a very reduced rate. The cost for printing the Newsletter was \$75.00. They would print our Ridebook for around \$500 (which is half of last year's cost). Their turn-around time is 1-day. Elinore projected a cost of \$2800 for printing and mailing the Newsletter 10 times in 2004.

Peggy Brush gave a report on putting the Ridebook and Newsletter on-line.

Benefits: Saving money: Over 50% of a member's dues go to putting out these two publications.

Ridebook takes 7 trees and Newsletter takes 6 trees.

Old Business:

1. Dawn Haas questioned the rules governing Rider Representatives. For a point of clarification, rider representatives cannot be ride managers or assistant ride managers. A reminder was made that Rider Representatives need to be nominated by August 1 so that ballots can be mailed out in the November Newsletter.
2. Wes Elford made a motion that Louise Riedel is made a permanent-voting member of the Board and Rick Nelson seconded. Motion carried.
3. Linda Mowrer addressed the issue of placing the ICF Account in an interest bearing account. All of UMECRA's accounts are presently combined into one checkbook. For the time being, this will remain so.
4. Elinore asked how Newsletter Expenses would be met. It was decided that the Treasurer would mail stamps along with Membership labels.
5. Joyce Mocilan reported on membership cards. She is also devising a system with membership and horse numbers. If possible, ride managers are asked to include AERC numbers on their UMECRA reports this year. It is hoped to have UMECRA cards by 2005.
6. Dr. Beecher made a motion to correct the by-laws regarding privileges granted to Rider Reps and the Newsletter Editor to read: The Newsletter Editor, the Points Keeper, the Sanctioning Director, and the Website Editor are welcome at the Board Meetings but are non-voting members. Elinore Tonsor has been appointed the Interim Newsletter Editor to complete their term, which will end at the end of this year. The Newsletter position will be up for grabs in January 2005.

EXCEPTION: Mileage but not placing shall be allowed for a horse that has passed the final check but needs metabolic treatment after that check." Sanctioning Requirements – UMECRA RULES J. – delete –

J. ...**A person can compete as a novice only on his or her first or second ride.** ...

General Rules – Veterinarian Requirements add:

F. The rider/owner of an equine disqualified by a rider veterinarian should be notified immediately by that veterinarian or the ride manager.

General Rules – Rider Requirements 4. – replace ferrier with farrier

A. The rider or horse owner shall be responsible for expenses incurred for veterinary, **farrier**, or for any other services...leaves the grounds.

Endurance Rules – 2. - delete: (moved to General Rules – see above)

B. The rider/owner of an equine disqualified by a rider veterinarian should be notified immediately by that veterinarian or the ride manager.

Endurance Rules – 9.A. – delete in documented extreme weather conditions.

2). The horse must reach...however, the ride veterinarian(s) may allow different pulse criteria **in documented extreme weather conditions.** ...

Endurance Rules – 9.A. – replace maximum with minimum

2). The horse must reach...extreme weather condition. The **MINIMUM** pulse rate criteria shall be **60 bpm**. Respiration should...rate considered.

Limited Distance Rules – replace Limited Distance Rides listed on page 12 with the following:

LIMITED DISTANCE RULES

The following rules and regulations have been adopted by the Board of Directors of AERC. UMECRA rules that are stricter or in addition are underlined. To obtain a full copy of AERC rules contact AERC, P.O. Box 6027, Auburn, CA 95604.

If not an AERC member, a rider must pay an additional \$10 per ride. Limited Distance Rides may be offered but must be sanctioned and held in conjunction with a UMECRA sanctioned ride and must be advertised as such. If a ride wishes to seek AERC sanctioning it must follow AERC Rule L1.

AERC Rule L1. Limited Distance rides must be at least 25 miles but not exceed 35 miles in length. These rides must be sanctioned into the Limited Distance Program and held in conjunction with or within an adjacent 24 hour time period of an AERC Sanctioned Endurance Ride.

1. Mileage must be a multiple of 5, ending in 0 or 5, whichever is the nearest whole number to the actual ride mileage (e.g. 22.4 = 20 miles, 22.5 = 25 miles.)
 - A. A Limited Distance rider may elevate to the lowest Endurance distance (in sanctioned elevator rides) for completion only, if the equine is 60 months old or older.
2. The equines must be under the control of veterinarian(s) experienced with equines or endurance rides.
3. Each equine will receive a substantive physical examination of metabolic and mechanical parameters before the ride, at a minimum of one veterinary control point located at or near the halfway point of the ride, and after the ride.
4. Veterinary control points are mandatory during the course of all limited distance rides.
5. The 'gate into a hold' type criterion is mandatory at all vet checks.
 - A. A rider entering a vet check may present his horse for p/r's at any time within 30 minutes.

- B. Horses passing the p/r parameters shall remain at the check area for the time specified, but a minimum of 20 minutes.
6. The ride must be open to any breed or type of equine. Equines must be at least 48 months old at the time of the ride. On a ride over 30 miles, equines must be at least 60 months old.
 7. No mares in foal.
 8. The ride must provide a specific amount of time (total competition time) which will include all stops and holds, and within which competitors must complete the ride to qualify for placing or completion.
 - A. There may be no minimum time limit for completion.
 - B. Total COMPLETION TIME will be according to the following prescription: 6 hours for 25 miles, 7 hours and 15 minutes for 30 miles, and 8 hours and 30 minutes for 35 miles; (including hold time).
 - C. RIDING TIME is the time used by competitors to complete the course, and reach criteria, excluding all hold times. This is the time used for AERC ride results.
 - D. At the finish, ride time of the competitor continues until a preset veterinary criteria of 60 heartbeats per minute or less is met. (Finishing time is recorded as the time at which the rider asks for and subsequently meets this preset criteria.) There is no marked finish line on the course that is used to determine placing or completion time.
 9. A competitor must pass all veterinary criteria for completion; a competitor who fails any of the other completion criteria should be pulled from top ten placing, but may be allowed a completion, if in the opinion of ride management, the violation was not intentional and did not result in making the course easier or shorter.
 10. Each sanctioned ride must have a post-finish-line vet examination, which the equine must pass for a successful completion, the criteria to be announced prior to the ride.
 11. The minimum criteria for the post-finish-line vet check are as follows. Any ride may adopt more stringent criteria but these must be provided to competitors before the ride in written form. The post-finish-line vet check is where the final criteria for completion must be met; an equine has not completed the ride until he has passed this check.
 12. Completion requires meeting all of the following criteria:
 - A. All riders and mounts must be present and accounted for at the start of the ride.
 - B. Properly entered in the ride.
 - C. Obeying all the rules.
 - D. Following the prescribed course, and doing multiple loops in the correct order.
 - E. Passing all control points.
 - F. Passing all vet requirements.
 - G. Finishing within the prescribed maximum time.
 - H. Not being disqualified.
 - I. Meeting criteria at post-finish-line check.
 - J. Meeting any other criteria prescribed by ride management.
 - K. Not having been paced or prompted by an un-entered, withdrawn, or otherwise unauthorized equine, vehicle or person other than another entrant. This does not preclude the ordinary support services of attendants or pit crews. A crew may accompany their rider down a public road in a support vehicle (unless there is a ride management prohibition against it) provided they do not push or haze the equine.
 13. All equines must stand a mandatory post ride evaluation within one half hour of finishing the course. Riders may present their equines for the final examination at a time of their choosing during the one half hour period. An equine that does not meet the established criteria within one half hour of arrival time shall be disqualified. Once a completed horse has passed the post ride examination, it may not be removed from completion for veterinary reasons. (AERC only). No horse will be certified for UMECRA completion if it needs or receives treatment for metabolic reasons before leaving the grounds, regardless of whether it has passed its final check. Such horse/rider combination may still receive AERC points and mileage credit.
 14. The normal criterion for advancement shall be a pulse of 68 bpm to be met at all regularly scheduled vet checks within 30 minutes. However, the setting of veterinary parameters, including but not limited to pulse and respiration, shall be determined by the head veterinarian. The minimum pulse rate criteria shall be 60 bpm. Respiration should be evaluated on its own merit. Ambient temperature and humidity effects need to be recognized and their effects considered.
 15. The equine must be metabolically stable, sufficient to demonstrate fitness to continue.

- . The equine may not have received medical treatment by veterinarian or layman prior to the final examination. Any equine that a ride veterinarian advises should be treated for a metabolic or soundness problem, but treatment is refused by the rider or owner, shall be considered in the same light as a treated equine and will be disallowed a completion.
17. There will be no gait aberration that is consistently observable under all circumstances that results in pain or threatens immediate athletic performance. This examination will be conducted at a trot, or equivalent gait, straight out and back, without prior flexion or palpation.
 18. Soreness, lacerations, and wounds on the limbs and body—including the mouth—must be noted on the veterinary examination card. Lesions that are aggravated to a degree that affects the equine's ability to continue may be a cause for failure to complete the ride. It must be recognized by veterinarians that lesions caused by tack and interference may be from mild to severe and need to be evaluated on their own merit.
 19. All riders who successfully complete the ride must receive a completion award.
 20. There shall be two divisions (Senior and Junior) based on the age of the rider. For clarification of Junior Rules, see Endurance Rules 14. A. - G.
 21. An award may be available for the horse judged to be in the Best Condition.
 - A. The award does not have to be given.
 - B. The veterinarian(s) may feel that none of the horses in contention for the award deserve to receive it.
 - C. Use of the AERC Best Condition System is optional with ride management.
 - D. Only horses selected as Best Condition using this system (with Best Condition forms returned along with the results) are recognized by the AERC.
 - E. Procedure in the event of a tie (best condition score), the equine among those tied with the highest veterinary score will be the winner. If there is still a tie, the equine among those still tied that finished ahead of the other(s) will be the winner.
 22. Limited Distance competitors must be offered a separate and specific briefing on the special features and requirements of Limited Distance rides.
 23. The AERC records mileage for members, but the mileage remains in the Limited Distance program and is not transferable to any other AERC program. For UMECRA, horse mileage will count in the 1000 mile program and rider mileage will apply in the endurance division.

Riders may present their equines for the final examination at a time of their choosing during the one half hour period. An equine that does not meet the established criteria within one half hour of arrival time shall be disqualified. Once a completed horse has passed the post ride examination, it may not be removed from completion for veterinary reasons. (AERC only). <u>No horse will be certified for UMECRA completion if it needs or received treatment for metabolic reasons before leaving the grounds within 2 hours of finishing, regardless of whether it has passed its final check.
