Back Tracking

I decided to put this article together because the S E Minnesota ride is getting ready to host its' 41 ride, this is the only ride I believe that is still under the same title, same location and without any lapse in hosting years.

Dianne Schmidt the current ride manager has a great part in this rides' history, and as I started to research the one subject the subject matter changed into what part Dianne has played in the time that she appeared onto the rider scene. Most of the newer riders in UMECRA today may not know how many moments

Dianne has given to her own ride history and volunteer history.

The SE Minnesota ride started at the beginning in 1972 and I found Dianne under the 1978 Comp. ride miles completed for that year with 320 miles and she already had some miles as the total rider miles showed 495. In 1979 she was nominated for a Bd. Of Director Position, she did not make it onto the Bd, but she was listed as a 1978 Rider Representative. The end of the 1979 season she placed 3rd HW Comp. on a horse named Donovan Melena. Her rider mileage now showed 795 miles and again she was a Rider Rep.

At the 1980 Annual meeting Dianne presented the recommendation of comp. Awards & Trophies for the Jr. Comp. division. She also became the Newsletter Editor after the retirement of Harriet Haenert. She was again elected as a Rider Rep. The S E Minn. Ride this same year moved its' ride date to mid-July, until this time the ride was held as a fall ride.

As the 1980 Rider Rep. She presented at the 1981 Annual meeting a statistical study showing how the season was broken down according to the frequency of attendance. The 1981 rider mileage now showed 1180 miles. The 1983 mileage showed 1310 miles. The 1985 Bd. Of Directors meeting was held at the home of Dianne Kuhn so I can conclude that she must have taken over the Ride Manager position of the S E Minn. Ride somewhere in the time frame. The 1985 rider mileage now showed 1885 miles Comp.

1986 Awards showed Dianne as 5th place HW Comp. on Rush Creek Iowa, her rider mileage showed 2360 miles. In 1987 she placed 2nd place HW Comp. on Sam and 3rd HW Endurance on Pudduel. Her mileage showed 3010 miles Comp. and 2575 miles Endurance. She was the Champion HW Comp. rider on Sam with 635 miles and 266 points in 1988! And 6th limited Distance Endurance on Pudduel. Her rider mileage now showed 3670 Comp. miles.

1989 shows Dianne as 10th place HW Comp. on Sam, 1990 5th place on Maplewood Lucky in HW Endurance and 6th place on CAM Jonathon in HW Comp. Total miles now showed as 4795 Comp. miles and 4175 End. Miles.

The UMECRA records then became less informative but found Dianne as the UMECRA Secretary and to

date the current Ride Manager of the only UMECRA ride (I believe) to hold the title 41 years under the same name, same location without and lapse in years. Making this ride a MUST ride for all riders to complete!

Equine Influenza Vaccine Efficacy in Older Horses

We've all heard the statistics about an aging America. The elderly represent the fastest growing-proportion of the U.S. population. In recent years horses have experienced a similar population shift.

A large portion of the equine population (about 15%) is composed of horses older than 20 and, even at this age, many remain actively involved in equestrian sports, reproduction, or as companions. Thus, further understanding of geriatric horses' immune systems has become increasingly important to preserve good health and quality of life through their golden years.

A goal of the immunology research program at the University of Kentucky Gluck Equine Research Center is to understand how age affects the geriatric horse's immune response to vaccination, particularly the equine influenza vaccine.

Previous studies have shown the immune response to inactivated equine influenza virus vaccines decreases with age; however, it remains unknown whether aging has an impact on vaccine efficacy. Because alternative vaccination approaches may prove more efficacious in aged horses, a vaccine/challenge study was recently performed at the Gluck Center using a canarypox recombinant virus-vectored vaccine. This live vaccine has limited replication and therefore mimics that of a natural infection, which is expected to induce a more significant and complete stimulation of the immune response compared to killed vaccines.

A recent study performed at the Gluck Center by David Horohov, PhD, William Robert Mills chair and professor; Tom Chambers, PhD, professor of veterinary virology; and Amanda Adams, PhD, postdoctoral scholar, addressed whether old horses respond to vaccination and if vaccination provides protection. The study involved 15 horses 20 years of age and older. While the vaccination history of these animals was unknown, they had probably been exposed to the vaccine and/or the equine influenza virus because all had low-level hemagglutinin inhibition (HI) antibody titers at the start of the trial. Seven of the horses were vaccinated (one dose) and eight were not vaccinated.

The study also involved 13 young horses (6 months to 1 year old) that had no serological evidence of

previous exposure to the virus (naïve animals). Seven of the young horses received the same vaccine as the elderly horses (two doses, as recommended by the manufacturer) and six were left unvaccinated. The vaccine was effective at inducing both humoral (in the blood) and cell-mediated immune responses in naïve horses. By contrast, the antibody response of old horses was not as great as that of the younger animals. All of the older horses had evidence of virus-specific cell-mediated immunity prior to vaccination, and this was enhanced only slightly by the vaccine.

To determine vaccine efficacy, all horses were exposed to aerosolized equine influenza virus for 45 minutes 14 days after the last vaccination, and were then monitored for clinical signs (nasal discharge, rectal temperature, etc.). In the naïve unvaccinated group of young horses, a temperature peak typically occurred two days after challenge and persisted for five to six days. This also correlated with increased transcription of pro-inflammatory cytokines in their peripheral blood cells. These animals also shed virus in their upper respiratory tract for an average of four and a half days.

In the unvaccinated older horses, a febrile peak was also observed post-challenge, although this was not as pronounced as in the young horses. This also correlated with increased pro-inflammatory cytokine expression. The unvaccinated older horses also shed the virus, but for a shorter time than the naïve young horses.

This study showed that aged horses are susceptible to infection with equine influenza virus. The vaccine was effective at protecting both the young and old horses upon challenge, reducing both clinical signs and virus shedding. Hence, vaccination of aged horses with the recombinant vaccine was effective.

Currently, the immunology group is evaluating the immune response of old horses to inactivated equine influenza vaccines compared to new generation, live-vectored vaccines. The group is also interested in determining how other factors such as nutritional status and underlying conditions such as equine Cushing's disease might affect the immune response of geriatric horses to vaccination. The goal of this research is to identify optimal methods for protecting aged horses from infectious disease.

Wounds and Lacerations (Book Excerpt)

One of the most important facts regarding severe wounds is that the sooner they are noticed and repaired the better the patient's prognosis, both functionally and cosmetically. Another aspect of wounds is that they bleed, some significantly more than others. Blood loss will be considered in a separate chapter in this book, but will be discussed here in the context of wounds.

Good horse management and wound management begins with a routine vaccination program for protection from tetanus. The once-dreaded disease, also called lockjaw, still claims many horses' lives each year. It is caused by the toxin from *Clostridium tetani*, which produces an endless spasm of the muscles in the jaw followed by severe contractions in all other muscles. It ends in a horrible death. Such an end is easily preventable.

Healthy horses should receive a first vaccination when they are weaned. It should be followed by annual booster shots of tetanus toxoid. If a wound might have become contaminated with soil, or if the immunization record for the wounded horse is unknown, the veterinarian will probably inject the horse with tetanus anti-toxin to give it a short-term measure of protection lasting a week or two. Vaccination records should be well-documented in writing and easily accessible for all of your horses. While your veterinarian keeps such records, you should also keep a set of records that travel with the horse.

A fresh limb wound that is bleeding profusely will need a pressure bandage applied as soon as possible. Try to stay calm. A relatively small, and non-life threatening quantity of blood can look like a much greater quantity than it really is. The bandage serves to apply pressure on the hemorrhaging blood vessels and helps to promote blood clotting.

If a large artery is severed, it will be difficult to apply enough pressure, especially if the laceration is any place other than the lower limb, but an attempt to apply a pressure bandage should still be made. The bandage should not be too thick, as this will limit the ability to apply an adequate degree of pressure for bleeding control. Using any one of the following wrappings will work: three sheets of sheet cotton, a quilted shipping bandage, a bath towel appropriately folded, or several layers of roll cotton. Hold the pressure bandage in place with several rolls of an elastic bandage material.

The elastic bandage material should be applied in a smooth, even, and firm manner--there must be adequate pressure if it is to be effective at controlling hemorrhage. This kind of bandage might be too tight for long periods of time, but it can be used at first to staunch the flow of blood. The bandage can be left in place for 20 to 30 minutes, at which time it can be replaced with less blood-soaked material. Or if the bleeding has subsided, it can be replaced with a clean and more loosely applied support bandage.

If the laceration involves the flexor tendons or suspensory ligament, an effort should be made to provide more significant support and immobilization. A Robert Jones bandage and splinting should be applied to the leg while waiting for the veterinarian or before transporting the horse to a veterinary clinic. This sort of support and immobilization can help prevent further damage if the horse attempts to put its weight down on the injured leg. The horse should be moved as little as possible until its injury has been evaluated and repairs have been made.

If the wound is older, bleeding might have subsided or have slowed substantially, but in such a case there might be significant contamination by dirt, debris, and bacteria. With respect to wound repair, there is what is known as a "golden period." The golden period is considered to be the first six hours after the wound was created. If the wound is appropriately cleansed and repaired during this time frame, the chances of complications from infection are reduced. Therefore, it is important to have wounds evaluated and repaired as soon as possible. To decrease the amount of contamination and reduce the risk of complications, cleanse the wound with warm water while waiting for the veterinarian and paint the area with an iodine-based surgical scrub.

In addition to cleansing, the application of a sterile dressing and support bandage can be of great benefit, especially if the horse cannot be seen by a veterinarian right away. If the wound is very old (noted by dried-out skin edges or the presence of pus) and has a great degree of swelling and inflammation associated with it, the use of cold hydrotherapy can be helpful. Use a garden hose to spray cold water on the wound site and swollen tissues. Cold hydrotherapy can reduce some of the inflammation and aid in the clean-up process until a veterinarian can debride the wound properly.

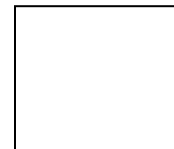
