ANNUAL MEETING
January 23, 1982
Wisconsin Dells

Present were representatives from the following rides: Badger, St. Jude, Wolf Creek, Glacier Trails, Hayward, AHDRA I, ApDRA, Sunset Valley, AHDRA II, Neillsville, Palisades, Valhalla and Last Ditch. The treasurer's report was approved as circulated. Copy attached.

The following new rides were approved unanimously : Shenandoah Riding Center Symposium and Competitive Ride, Columbus, Jordan, Miles City, Ingomar, Baker and Baraga Plains.

The issues listed below had been referred to the rider representatives for consideration.

- 1) Stallions. It was suggested that stallions be given more time at a vet stop to recover. JoAnne Gernant moved and Wanda Van Meir seconded that stallions must meet the same parameters as mares and geldings. Motion carried.
- 2) Trail Marking. In the case where a trail is repeated going in opposite directions it was suggested that markers in two colors be used. Wanda Van Meir moved and JoAnne Gernant seconded that a rule not be made to cover this proposal. It will be included as a suggestion in the Ride Manager's Manual.
- 3) Stop and Go Rides. It was suggested that UMECRA prepare guidelines for "stop and go" type rides similar to the one used at Glacier Trails in '81. Lindsay Taliaferro moved and Rick Nelson seconded that "Ride management may opt to use the following "stop and go" procedure, but must provide notification in the ride brochure or Newsletter
 - a) A rider entering a vet check may present his horse for a p/r reading at any time within 20 minutes. Failure to meet the p/r parameters will require a re-check within the 20-minute limitation, but a maximum of 10 minutes, i.e., the combination of original check time period plus the re-check time period may not exceed 20 minutes. Failure to meet the p/r parameters at the recheck requires Disqualification.
 - b) Horses passing the p/r parameters must remain at the vet check for an additional 15 minute rest period.
 - c) The p/r team will enter the time passed and time out on the time card."Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher discussed the "King Richard's Fair" which presents a program of 3-day cross country horse racing on the July 4 weekend. The sponsors of this event have requested that it be advertised in our brochure. Dr. Beecher moved that this be allowed, with the fee to be \$50. Louise Riedel seconded. Motion carried.

Discussion followed on the method of electing rider representatives. Ted Cooper moved that the incumbent rider representatives, JoAnne Gernant and R.T. Guy, remain in office for another year. Dr. Beecher seconded. Motion carried 21-1. Lindsay Taliaferro moved that in the future, election of rider representatives be conducted by mail ballot through the Newsletter, with nominations to be made in August and elective ballots to be returned to the secretary no later than November 1. Family memberships will be entitled to two ballots and individual memberships to one. Motion carried.

A request has been made that in the case of a protest which was disallowed, the protestor be advised of the reasons for denial of the protest. JoAnne Gernant moved that in such a case, the board members should be asked to state their reasons, and the protestor should be so informed, without specifying board members' names. Etta Beecher seconded. Motion carried.

Judy Schlink explained the ten minute "window" concept as used on competitive rides. A rider shall come in five minutes before or five minutes after the exact scheduled time. One point per minute is lost for coming in ahead of or behind the scheduled time. A person may come in up to 60 minutes late. Gordy Sussman moved that, for a one-year trial period, ride managers have the option to use this concept providing it is announced in the brochure. Louise Riedel seconded. Motion carried 17-5.

Judy Schlink and Rhoda Ritter explained the "combined endurance-competitive" ride concept. No action was taken.

The proposed AERC raises in dues and ride fees were discussed. Ride managers were asked to state their opinions in writing to be presented at the AERC convention by the Midwest regional directors.

JoAnne Gernant mentioned the problems of several riders coming in on endurance rides in a deliberate tie, resulting in all such riders receiving the same number of points. JoAnne moved that ties not be scored as such in endurance rides, and that the tie be broken by using p/r's.. There was no second.

Lindsay Taliaferro moved that the rule changes as proposed by the Board at their December 12 meeting be accepted in total. Rick Nelson seconded. The motion was defeated 11-7.

The first suggested rule: "There must be a marker two miles from the finish line" was approved unanimously.

The second suggested rule: "Any distressed horse requiring medication for any physiological reasons before leaving the grounds will be disqualified. (Physiological reasons to include colic, fatigue, tying up, thumps, etc.) Any medication administered on the grounds must be under the supervision of a veterinarian." Passed ~~21-1~~ 19-3

Ted Cooper moved that the remainder of the proposed rules be accepted as written. Motion seconded and carried unanimously. They are as follows:

I. General:

✓ Add: (following present rule 20) "Anyone having outstanding debts to UMECRA or a UMECRA ride will be disallowed from receiving points, year end awards or mileage accumulation.

Add: (following the above.) The normal criteria for advancement is 72/40. (pulse parameter to be changed from 70 to 72 wherever mentioned.

II. Competitive Rides.

✓ Add: (to rule 8) "Forward motion must be maintained the last two miles."

✓ Add: (following rule 11) "No ice, linaments or braces may be used before the final vet check."

✓ Add: (following the above) "There must be a minimum of one rest stop per 25 miles or increment thereof.

Add: (to 14 A 2)b) "P/r's shall be taken for a minimum of 15 seconds and recorded as actual during the recording period.

Delete: (14 A 2)d) which reads "The normal criteria for advancement is a pulse of 70 and a respiration of 40" This was transferred to the General rules above

Change: (14 A 2)e) That portion which reads "he shall let them go at 30-45 second intervals" to read "at 5 second intervals"

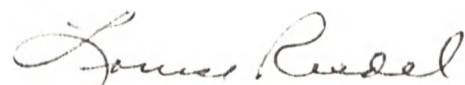
The next order of business was election of officers

Nominated for president were Lindsay Taliaferro, JoAnne Gernant and Rick Nelson. The balloting resulted in a three-way tie. Revoting resulted in the election of Lindsay. Dr. Beecher was nominated for vice-president. JoAnne Gernant voted to cast a unanimous ballot. Wanda Van Meir seconded. Carried.

Louise Riedel was nominated for secretary-treasurer by Rick Nelson who moved to cast a unanimous ballot. Seconded by Wanda Van Meir. carried.

Nominated for the Board of Directors were JoAnne Gernant, Ted Cooper, Rick Nelson and Jan Worthington. JoAnne Gernant was elected, with a tie between Cooper and Worthington. Re-voting resulted in the election of ted Cooper.

The meeting was adjourned.
