

BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

December 7, 1985

The Board of Directors met December 7, 1985 at the home of Fred and Dianne Kuhn, Rochester, Minnesota. Present were directors: Paul Heberling, Louise Riedel, Art Priesz, Dale Scott and past president, Ron Schmid. (Paul and Dale also serve as rider representatives)

OLD BUSINESS: Art stated that the Articles of Incorporation have been filed with the state of Minnesota. When they return the receipt, the papers can be presented to the IRS for the purpose of securing a tax-exempt number. Kath Love was appointed to handle this. Art will prepare a revised ride entry blank which will be more specific as to risks involved. It will be considered at the next board meeting.

NEW BUSINESS: Paul presented a proposed agenda for this meeting, which was accepted along with several additions.

The importance of having veterinarian input to the Board was discussed. It was decided to invite the head veterinarians from each ride to attend the annual meeting and to sit in on the preceding board meeting. Art was asked to prepare a by-law change to be presented at the annual meeting to provide for a veterinarian representative to the Board.

The next item of business was consideration of protests filed concerning the Hennepin County and Kettle Moraine rides. Dale moved to uphold the protest concerning the Hennepin County ride on the grounds that since there was no veterinarian present to check some of the horses at the finish, Rule 1 C 1 was violated. (The ride must be controlled by veterinarians). Art seconded. Motion carried. Art moved that the ride be put on probation. Dale seconded. Motion carried.

The Kettle Moraine protest was in four sections which were considered separately. The first concerned the failure to weigh the rider (without tack) of the horse named as best conditioned. Ron moved, Dale seconded that this part of the protest be upheld on the grounds that UMECRA Rule 11 D was violated. (Judging shall follow AERC procedures) and also the procedure as set forth on the AERC evaluation form. Art moved that there be no change in the award for best condition, since recalculating the best condition form in the light of the revised weight of the rider did not result in a reversal of placing. The second part of the protest concerned the disqualification of a competitive horse for high respiration at a spot check. Louise moved, Dale seconded to disallow the protest since Rules 11 D 2 c (If in the veterinarian's opinion the horse is critical it should be pulled) and Rule 1 C 3 (The decision of the judges is final) allow this type of action. The third part of the protest concerned a horse being held extra time at a spot check in violation of Rule 11 D 2 c, resulting in the rider being late (A horse shall not be held at a spot check). Ron moved that this infraction be attached to the probationary condition resulting from the protest in part 1. Motion carried. The fourth part of the protest concerned the assumption that the ride speed (after deducting 2 spot checks) averaged at $7\frac{1}{2}$ miles per hour in violation of Rule 11 B 1 (riding speed shall average 5.5 to 7 mph) Ron moved to deny this protest because pursuant to rule 11 B 1 and Rule 11 D 2 c, time held at spot checks is included in the day's total riding time. Dale seconded. Carried.

THE MOTIONS MADE CONCERNING THE FOLLOWING PROPOSED RULE CHANGES WERE TO PUT THEM ON THE AGENDA TO BE VOTED ON AT THE ANNUAL MEETING.

Ron moved, Louise seconded that Rule 1C7 b be changed to read: "Have stable vital signs and are showing subjective and objective signs of recovery one hour from the time of crossing the finish line for endurance and $\frac{1}{2}$ hour for competitive" (eliminates the criteria of 72 pulse post ride)

Louise moved that Rule 1 C 7 be changed to read "Each ride must have a post-finish line vet exam which the horse must pass to qualify for successful completion (specific criteria to be announced prior to the ride). Horses shall be certified for completion and placing if they:

Ron moved, Art seconded that Rule 11 B 1 be changed as follows:

"The ride must have a maximum and minimum time limit. The maximum riding speed for regular placings shall average 5.5 to 7.0 M.P.H.-- $3\frac{1}{2}$ to 4 hours being the minimum (REGULAR) riding time for a 25 mile competitive ride without penalty. A rider may come in up to 60 minutes late before disqualification (PENALTY). One point per minute is deducted from the daily score sheet for coming in late. Riders who complete the ride in $12/5\%$ shorter time than that of the regular time will receive 50% more placing points towards year end awards (for example: 3 to $3\frac{1}{2}$ hours for a 25 mile ride (STRESS). All entries are eligible for all options and do not have to declare before the start of the ride. Completion time will decide the number of year-end points and penalty points.

Minimum RIDING TIMES - Time held at SPOT CHECKS will be included in the day's TOTAL RIDING TIME.

TIMES MAY BE INCREASED PROPORTIONALLY FOR EXTREME WEATHER CONDITIONS OR TRAIL CONDITIONS. THE ENDING OF STRESS TIME AND THE BEGINNING OF REGULAR TIME MUST COINCIDE. THE ENDING OF REGULAR TIME AND THE BEGINNING OF PENALTY TIME MUST COINCIDE. Motion carried.

Delete Rule 1a, (present window system) and Rule 8 (stress division). Renumber rule 9 to rule 8.

Art moved that as an alternate amendment (in case the previous rule change does not pass), the following should be added to Rule 11 B 1 a "competitive rides using the window system can not offer a stress division. Ron seconded. Carried.

Louise moved, Ron seconded that as an alternate amendment (in case the previous major rule change does not pass) that the last sentence in Rule 11 B 1 a be deleted: "If a ride opts to use this system (window system) it must be announced in the ride brochure or newsletter." motion carried.

Ron moved to delete from Rule 11 D 2 b 4 the words "a minimum of" to read "P/R's shall be taken for 15 seconds". . . . Motion seconded and carried.

Ron moved, Paul seconded to add to Rule 11 D 2 b 4 "No plus points shall be awarded for pulse and respiration." Carried.

Ron moved to change rule 11 D 2 b 5 by adding the underlined "A pre-ride pulse and respiration, dehydration and capillary refill should be taken so that the judges can get acquainted with the horse. These recordings shall not be used as a reference point upon which to determine any future reading or award of points. Motion seconded and carried.

Dale moved, Louise seconded to change the bonus points for stress from 50% to 25% Motion carried.

The problem of reconciling the AERC and UMECRA rules concerning junior riders was discussed. Since a copy of the complete AERC junior rule was not available it was decided to postpone any action until the next board meeting.

It was proposed that limited distance be interpreted to mean that a rider who has completed five rides on one horse cannot be considered for limited distance award on another horse. It was agreed that the Board not recommend this.

A request had been received to consider giving completion points and mileage for an entrant who has completed the first section (s) of a multiple day ride but does not complete the entire ride. It was agreed that the Board not recommend this.

A letter from Gordy Sussman was read requesting the Board to institute a new award called the "Bob Smith" award to be given annually to the rider who best epitomizes the motto "To complete is to win", to be nominated by riders and managers following each ride. It was suggested that the name of the award be changed to the "Complete Is to Win" award to better describe it.

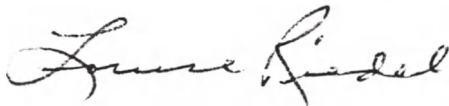
Paul moved to increase the number of at-large directors from two to four. Art seconded. No by-law change will be required. Motion carried. At the annual meeting we will elect 4 at-large directors.

A suggestion was received that "riders could be protested against as well as rides. Two blatant violations would be grounds for banning of accumulation of points for year-end awards." It was the consensus that the board already has the authority to act in cases of rider misconduct. No action taken.

Paul moved, Ron seconded to purchase a used Apple II E computer including a two-disk drive, monitor and software for \$1000. Motion carried.

The meeting adjourned.
