

Board of Directors, January 30 1988

The meeting was called to order by Art Priesz. Other members present were Dr. Beecher, Louise Riedel, Jan Worthington, Guy Worthington, Paul Heberling, Dale Scott, Marsha Achenbach and rider representatives Ray Gehrig, Joanne Gernant and Leonard Rounds.

Elinore Tonsor presented an idea for year-end awards by which a plaque would be designed to display a number of plates for the current and following years. This would eliminate the necessity of finding different awards year after year. It was decided to present this idea at the general meeting to ascertain the feeling of the membership and also the poll the members through the Newsletter as well as to solicit opinions during the first part of the season.

Under old business there was a discussion of the changes in the rules as proposed at the December board meeting. There were no suggested alterations.

The proposed change in the point system for determining year-end awards was discussed. A handout was distributed showing the effect on the 1987 HW endurance standings of three alternatives to the present system. Ray moved and Louise seconded to substitute the following for the system adopted at the December board meeting: 1 point for every five miles plus the present points for placings. (On a 25-mile ride this would amount to 11 points for first, 10 for 2nd, 9 for 3rd, 8 for 4th, 7 for 5th, 6 for 6th and 5 for completion) Points would be pro-rated for longer distances. This proposal will be presented at the general meeting. Motion carried.

The question of ride management being able to protest the unsportsmanlike conduct of riders, which had been tabled at the December board meeting was addressed. Dr. Beecher moved and Jan seconded that the following be added to the agenda for the general meeting: A section shall be added to the Ride Manager's manual suggesting that a Steward (who shall be a non-rider) be appointed. This person will interpret the rules and adjudicate disputes between management and riders. Motion carried.

The difference between AERC and UMECRA endurance rules was discussed. It was suggested that it be specified in the ride booklets which rules originate with AERC. Dr. Beecher moved that any changes made at the AERC convention can be reflected in our rule books. Seconded and carried.

A proposal had been received that we add a middleweight division. Louise moved that this be added to the agenda for the general meeting. Dr. Beecher seconded. Carried.

Guy Worthington moved to recommend to the general meeting that the limited distance competitive division be extended by 50 miles and the limited distance endurance division by 100 miles. Dr. Beecher seconded. Motion carried.

Jan Worthington suggested that the number of spot checks on competitive rides be announced. There was no motion.

A letter had been received that the high scoring horse on competitive rides should receive one extra point for a 25-mile ride, to be pro-rated for longer distances. No action was taken.

Guy Worthington moved that all endurance rides be required to use the gate into a hold (modified stop & go) system on endurance rides, and that the traditional mandatory hold system be eliminated. Dr. Beecher seconded. Motion carried. This proposal will be presented to the general meeting.

The meeting was adjourned.

General Meeting, January 30 1988

The meeting was called to order at 1:20 p.m. Rides present were: SE Minnesota I, KMAHA, Grand Island I, Glacier Trails, Effingham Crossroads II, St Jude, Effingham Crossroads I, Pillsbury Research, Hayward Old Smoothie, Maplewood, AHDRA I, ApDRA, Grand Island II, Wildcat Mountain, Bear Down, SE Minnesota II, AHDRA II, Minn-I-Kota, MnDRA, AHAM, Pillager Cup, Charity Cup, Palisades, Kettle Moraine, One Tuff Nut, Jubilee, Illini, MnDRA II, Son of a Ditch, Mt. Valhalla, White River Fall ride, Milwaukee River, Point Chaser. Sixty-two votes were authorized.

Bob Wadzinski moved, Dr. Beecher seconded to accept the minutes of the 1987 general meeting as published. Motion carried. Bob Wadzinski moved, Dr. Beecher seconded to accept the financial report as distributed. Motion carried. (Financial report attached to these minutes).

Under committee reports the president announced that the Ride Manager-Veterinary Handbook has been reorganized in response to complaints that it was hard to find pertinent information in the old one. The endurance scoresheet was discussed at the Ride Manager's forum. Sally Worthington reported that a committee was formed to make revisions to better accomodate the present score sheet to endurance rides.

The proposal discussed at the Board meeting to formulate a permanent type year-end award was explained. A show of hands resulted in members indicating a preference for the present system of different awards to be given each year. More discussion and opinion will be solicited.

Louise Riedel reported for AERC, primarily concerning the new National Championship system whereby the best five 50 mile rides and the best 100 mile rides count, with two rides being held in each of the eight AERC regions. The AERC committee assigned dates for these rides in

each region, the Midwest dates being September 17 for the fifty mile ride and September 24 for the 100. The FEI World Championship International Ride will also be held September 24, and nominations should be sent to either the AERC office or Lee Wittle. Jan announced that she has been delegated to secure lease horses for use of the European riders for this ride. Anyone interested in leasing a horse for this purpose should contact Jan Worthington.

Differences between AERC and UMECRA rules were discussed. The president explained that UMECRA, in order to achieve sanctioning, must follow AERC rules, and can change those rules only by being stricter. The problem mainly concerns the AERC junior rule--we do not have the option of liberalizing that rule. We either adopt the stance that UMECRA will follow the rule or decline to have AERC sanctioning and lose endurance riders. There is a possibility that the phrase in the AERC rules that provides that "juniors 14 and over with 500 miles shall ride in the senior division" will be deleted. Mike Thomas moved that UMECRA ride managers unanimously agree that they in advance deny permission to riders 16 and under to ride as seniors; and that sponsorship of a junior be designated by the physical exchange of a token of some kind with the senior sponsors who have signed up prior to the ride as ad-hoc sponsors. Management must be notified of the change of sponsors at the earliest possible opportunity. Motion died for lack of a second.

Steve Hanson moved that we forget about AERC sanctioning. Jim Donaghue seconded. Motion defeated.

JoAnne Gernant moved that we accept the junior rule as proposed by AERC. Motion seconded and carried.

The president, under old business, reviewed the item approved at the December board meeting that the following be added as a suggestion to the Ride Manager's manual "Competitive horses shall be trotted out first (at the time specified for the final check) and then sent back into line for evaluation of heat, filling, pain, abrasions, etc. There were no objections.

The next item of old business concerned the proposal that ride management be enabled to protest against a rider for abusive conduct. This matter was tabled at the December board meeting. Dr. Beecher suggested that the following be incorporated into the Ride Manager's manual as a suggestion: that rides be allowed to use a Steward as per minutes of the preceding Board meeting.

Elinore moved, Dr. Beecher seconded that the following be added to the rules: I D 8 - "It is the rider's responsibility to present himself to the veterinarian (or p/r crew) precisely at the time indicated on the time card. Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Bob Wadzinski seconded to change Rule I C 2 to read "Official competitors may not be accompanied by horses and riders that have not entered the ride." Motion carried.

Dr. Beecher moved, Suzette Riches seconded to change Rule -I C 2 to read "Normal criteria for advancement - pulse of 68; respiration of 68. These criteria must be met at all regularly scheduled vet checks within 20 minutes." Motion carried.

Suzette Riches moved, Dee Mielke seconded to change the age of competitive juniors to 18. Motion carried.

The revised point system as adopted at the December board meeting was modified at the Board meeting this morning. See minutes of that preceding meeting. Anne Ness moved, Mary Smith moved to adopt this revised system. Motion carried.

Dr Beecher moved, JoAnne seconded that the allowable mileages for limited distance be increased by 50 miles for competitive and 100 miles for competitive. Motion carried. (Note: This motion was subsequently reopened and revised. See below)

Rob Wadzinski moved and Dr Beecher seconded that a middleweight division be added. The motion was defeated.

Dr. Beecher moved, Sally Worthington seconded to mandate the use of gate into a hold (modified stop and go on all endurance rides) Motion defeated.

Sally Worthington moved that under the mandatory hold system if the horse does not pass the vet check in 10 minutes, he may be presented any time thereafter for a recheck, but the horse will not be allowed to leave the vet check until 20 minutes have elapsed after he passes. Guy Worthington seconded. Motion defeated.

Sharon Crysler moved that the question concerning limited distance be reopened on the grounds that with the increase of mileage for endurance, the last six of the top ten would then become the winners of the limited distance division. Motion seconded and carried. JoAnne moved and Sharon seconded that limited distance be changed to increase competitive 50 miles, but leave endurance as it is. Motion seconded. Guy made a friendly amendment to the effect that riders in the top ten not be eligible for limited distance, and that a rider who would be eligible for both awards must make the decision as to which he prefers. JoAnne seconded the friendly amendment. Motion to add the friendly amendment to the original motion carried. The entire motion carried.

A suggestion was discussed at the board meeting that the high scoring horse of a competitive ride receive one additional point per each 25 miles. No action was taken at this time, but the concept will be considered in the future.

In consideration of the 1988 ride schedule, it was requested that the AHDR II ride be scheduled on June 18, 19, a date that had already been filled. Dr. Beecher moved and Dee Mielke seconded that the schedule as proposed be accepted with the stipulation that the board would attempt to find another date for the AHDR II ride.

Rider representatives JoAnne Gernant, Kathy Love, Leonard Rounds and Marsha Achenbach were installed.

The next item of business was election of officers. Nominated for president were Art Priesz, Ray Gehrig and Dee Mielke. Art Priesz was elected. Nominated for vice-president were Dr. Beecher, Fred Kuhn, Dee Mielke and Ray Gehrig. Ray Gehrig declined. Dee Mielke was elected. Louise Riedel was elected secretary-treasurer by acclamation. Nominated for Board of Directors were Dr. Beecher, Ray Gehrig, Elinore Tonsor, Jan Worthington, Guy Worthington, Fred Kuhn, Leonard Rounds. Elected were Dr. Beecher, Ray Gehrig, Leonard Rounds and Guy Worthington. Nominated for veterinary representative were Robin Lawrence, Dean Peterson and Mike Mann. Dr. Peterson was elected.

The meeting was adjourned.
